#### 1. CT Fire Academy Seminar Series 2017 – Modern Fire Attack – February 9, 2017

Course Description: Lightweight energy efficient construction, modern fuels, firefighter encapsulation and manpower reductions have combined to make today's residential firefight a dramatically new challenge for even the most experienced firefighter. This workshop brings together cutting edge research and best practices to help firefighters develop strategies and tactics for mounting interior fire attacks in modern residential construction. It will assist participants in developing best practices for mounting an intelligent fire attack within these structures, particularly in attics and basements, and whenever they encounter ventilation limited or post flashover conditions. This workshop will cover the following objectives:

- Introduce the scope and magnitude of the problem
- Review the most recent UL/NIST research available
- Present curriculum on strategies and tactics for the modern fire ground.

#### Instructor Bio:

Chief Van Dorpe recently retired as Director of the Chicago Fire Department's Training Division after a 33 year career with the CFD. He holds a Bachelor's degree in Fire Science Management from Southern Illinois University. He has recently participated as a Subject Matter Expert for UL's research on "Structural Stability of Engineered Lumber In Fire Conditions", the National Institute of Standards and Technology's, "Evaluating Firefighting Tactics Under Wind Driven Conditions", the IAFF/NIST "Firefighter Safety and Deployment Study" in high rise buildings. Chief Van Dorpe is the 2016 recipient of the Fire Engineering/ISFSI George D. Post Instructor of the Year award.

#### 4. The Burrville Fire School is offering Three Courses Beginning in February

#### **Introduction to Company Officer:**

The Program is directed toward new company officers or personnel who desire to seek company officer positions. Course content includes; Transition from Firefighter to Company Officer, Duties and Responsibilities of a Company Officer, Strategy and Tactics, Crew Supervision, etc. The program is eight (8) weeks in length, meeting one (1) night each week. The first class is being held at the New Hartford Fire Department starting on February 8<sup>th</sup> and will run until March 29<sup>th</sup>. This will be eight (8) consecutive Wednesday nights, each class will start at 1800 hours and conclude at 2200 hours. The address for New Hartford Fire Department is 3 Greenwoods Road, New Hartford CT. The cost for the class is \$165 per student.

Marquam Johnson, Fire Chief (Ret) will serve as the lead instructor for the Program. Assisting Chief Johnson will be a number of instructors with a vast variety of company officer experience.

#### 6. Firefighter Near Miss Report of the Week

#### **House Explodes Due to Natural Gas Leak**

#### **SUMMARY**

An engine company responding to an odor of natural gas arrived on scene to find damage to a structure and gas leaking into the house. The immediate action was to evacuate the occupants and establish a safe area. These actions paid off when the event took a turn for the worse.

#### **EVENT DESCRIPTION**

Dispatch announced that a car had struck a gas meter inside the garage of a two-story, single-family residence. The initial on-scene report included damage to the garage door, hissing noise from the garage and the odor of natural gas in the air.

Upon arrival, the crew of three immediately went to work evacuating the house. The report states, "Two minutes after engine company arrival for a report of a car that had struck a gas meter in the garage, and while evacuating occupants, the house blew up."

A photo taken after the explosion shows the devastation possible from this type of call. In this case, there were no injuries to report.

#### **TAKE-AWAYS**

Emergencies involving natural gas are common in some areas. The explosive range is narrow; the lower explosive limit is 4% and the upper explosive limit is 15%. Outside this range, the gas won't burn. With an explosive range that low, it doesn't take much gas flowing inside a structure to achieve the lower explosive limit. Without expensive atmosphere-sampling equipment, it's impossible to determine the percent mixture in the air.

The working pressure in most residential homes is usually less than one PSI. However, according to the American Gas Association, pressures on the delivery side of the gas meter can range from ¼ PSI to 60 PSI. Natural gas can displace oxygen very quickly when the damage to an indoor meter is on the supply side of the regulator.

The firefighter that submitted this report credits their success to proper size-up, good situational awareness and wearing the complete PPE ensemble. Establishing incident priorities and following them from the beginning also contributed to a positive outcome. There were no injuries reported among the five civilians and three fire personnel.

#### **DISCUSSION**

- This report mentions a proper size-up and establishing incident priorities. What type of incident action plan would you expect from fire companies in your area?
- What are the chemical properties of natural gas and how do you tell if there's a leak?

- When you respond on a natural gas leak inside a residence, what are some of the do's and don'ts you should observe while investigating?
- Does your department have a written policy for investigating natural-gas emergencies?

#### LEADING PRACTICES

Responding to natural-gas emergencies can be a highly technical event. Natural gas has a chemical additive to allow for detection of a small leak, but monitoring equipment is required to determine if the concentration is within the explosive range. Personnel need training in using the equipment and the monitors require regular calibration to be effective.

At the scene of this type of incident, we must approach cautiously. If the natural gas or a small pocket of it is within the explosive range, the smallest ignition source can cause an explosion. Care must be taken to ensure we don't add to the problem by turning on lights (or turning them off if on already) or venting with unsafe equipment or practices.

Establishing the priority of protecting life-safety first is important. Unprotected civilians who may still be in the structure are in danger. Natural-gas emergencies can create a sense of urgency. Rapid evacuation and controlling the flow to leaking gas lines must be high on the priority list.

Finally, spotting the apparatus is important. It must be close enough to use but far enough to be out of a potential blast zone. One of the key points from this report included apparatus placement. Spotting the apparatus close to the structure could have resulted in significant damage.

Dear Litchfield County and neighboring firefighters;

The rebuilding of the Burrville Fire School is slated to start in the early spring of 2017. The contract for the design/build team has been awarded to PDS Engineering out of Bloomfield. We are meeting with them on a weekly basis to finalize the design. We plan on presenting the final plans and discussing the future of the fire school at the February meeting of the Litchfield County Fire Chiefs Emergency Plan, Inc. The state recently demolished the old facility. Until the new facility is complete we will be running courses at local host departments.

The class schedules are set the spring of 2017. The fire school will be running a Firefighter I course at the Goshen Fire Station and an Exterior Firefighter at the Woodbury Fire Station. This summer we plan on running a Firefighter I and II course that is designed for college students. The spring Firefighter I certification course will be run on Tuesday and Thursday evenings and some weekends. The course will include certification at the Hazardous Materials Awareness and Operational levels. The cost is \$1,050 which includes all exam fees, student textbook, and student workbook. The application deadline for Firefighter I is February 8, 2017. The course fee will increase to \$1,155 after the deadline. The course schedule is attached.

The Exterior Firefighter course will be running on Tuesday nights and some Saturdays. The cost is \$250. The application deadline for Exterior Firefighter is March 3, 2017. The course fee will increase to \$275 after the deadline. The course schedule is attached.

On behalf of the school committee and the staff of the Burrville State Fire School I would like to take this opportunity to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a Safe, Healthy and Happy New Year.
