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#### 1. NFPA Issues Safety Bulletin on Firefighter Protective Hoods

The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) has issued a safety bulletin on firefighter protective hoods. It is well-documented that firefighter Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) is exposed to a wide range of toxins, pathogens and other hazardous substances. According to a study by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and the National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), firefighters have a greater number of cancer diagnoses and cancer related deaths.

Firefighter protective hoods are the most penetrable piece of equipment; they do not stop soot and chemicals from depositing on a firefighter's neck and head – areas that are extremely vulnerable to dermal exposure. "NFPA has had the back of firefighters for more than 120 years," said Ed Conlin, Public Fire Protection division manager. "Given the increase in occupational cancer incidents in the fire service, we feel it is best to err on the side of caution as we await additional scientific research on PPE and learn more about the absorption of carcinogens near the forehead, jaw, neck and throat."

The NFPA protective hood bulletin recommends that fire departments establish an overall health and safety program and establish practices for care and maintenance in accordance with NFPA 1851, Standard on Selection, Care, and Maintenance of Protective Ensembles for Structural Fire Fighting and Proximity Fire Fighting. FIREFIGHTER I Course fee: \$1,050.00

This program is designed to prepare the student for competencies established by the NFPA 1001 "Standard for Fire Fighter Professional Qualifications" 2012 edition. Also included within the standard by reference is the NFPA 472 "Standards for Competence of Responders to Hazardous Materials/Weapons of Mass Destruction Incidents" 2013 edition. Students must attend all sessions and complete all assignments to qualify for the state exams. The exams will consist of a practical skills assessment followed by a cognitive written exam. The Commission on Fire Prevention and Control, Office of Certification will conduct all examinations. Fees for all examinations are included in the registration fee and include State of Connecticut and National Certification fees.

The IFSTA "Essentials of Fire Fighting" (6th Edition) will be the primary reference textbook for this course and will be provided to each student.

This program requires hands-on training along with classroom instruction. Full protective clothing including SCBA with one spare cylinder is required each day of class.

FIREFIGHTER II Course fee: \$850.00

**Prerequisites:** Students enrolling must be certified Firefighter I.

Students must attend all sessions and complete all assignments to qualify to take the state exam. The exam will consist of a practical skills assessment followed by a cognitive written exam. The Commission on Fire Prevention and Control, Office of Certification will conduct all examinations. Fees for all examinations are included in the registration fee and include State of Connecticut and National Certification fees.

The IFSTA "Essentials of Fire Fighting" (6th Edition) will be the primary reference textbook for this course and will be provided to each student.
