This program will explore how we, as individuals, can help ensure our departments are on track and ways we can truly make a difference in our organization, regardless of rank.

He is a past president of the International Society of Fire Service Instructors and is the 2015 recipient of the George D. Post, Instructor of the Year Award from the ISFSI. He is a past board member of the Volunteer/Combination Officer's Section of the International Association of Fire Chiefs and serves on a variety of advisory boards and committees for the fire service industry. Chief Buchanan is known for the creation of the SLICE-RS concept that is part of the ISFSI Principles of Modern Fire Attack Program.

2. Man vs. Machinery Class

Machinery entrapments occur across the United States and Canada. Fire, EMS and Rescue services are called all the time to disentangle and extricate persons from machinery. Is your department capable of handling one? This program provides responders with the knowledge to help manage common machinery accidents and machinery specific to industry in your area. This is a highly specialized skill set, and caring for victims/patients entrapped in machinery necessitates that providers be trained in specific treatment modalities and the possible complications that may arise. Tool selection, patient stabilization techniques and crush injury syndrome will be discussed and case studies will be analyzed. This program sponsored by Storm Engine Co. Ambulance & Rescue and provided by PL Vulcan Fire Training Concepts will include hands-on demonstrations. The full day class will be held on Sunday March 26,2017, from 9AM TO 5PM. 6. Cold Water Rescue on 02/25 and 02/26 – a Few Seats Remain

This course is designed for first responders operating at the scene of a cold water or ice rescue. Topics covered include: pre-planning, risk assessment, ice types and how they form, hypothermia, cold water drowning, incident size-up, water rescue equipment, and rescue operations. Participants will perform simulated water and ice (if available) rescues using cold water entry suits and associated equipment.

7. CFA Strategy & Tactics- Bread and Butter Calls

This two-day course takes the experienced fire fighter through the basics of fire ground decision-making. These are the "room and content", everyday calls that any fire department should be able to control with even limited resources. It teaches the student to formulate an overall strategy, and to then employ the appropriate tactics to support that strategy using time-tested models. In-class scenarios will take place throughout the course to give students opportunities to work a simulated fire incident.
