3. Accelerated On-Line FF 1 and FF 2

The Burrville Fire School announces their on-line accelerated classes for this summer. These are fast moving, demanding courses of study/practice. You are expected to make *all* of the classes. You must be a self-motivated student who is comfortable with on-line learning.

Firefighter 1 will begin on May 15th. It will run on Monday & Wednesday nights from 6 PM to 10 PM. It is approximately 3-months in length. The cost is \$1,050 and includes the course text.

Firefighter 2 will begin on May 15th. It will then run on Tuesday and Thursday nights from 6 PM to 10 PM. It is approximately 2-months in length. The cost is \$850. This does not include a text (which can be purchased separately). The text is available to all as an on-line e-book and downloadable audio book.

Locations have not yet been determined although we are planning on eastern Litchfield County for ease of access for those coming from a distance. The state practical exam dates are to be determined. The deadline for applying is May 1st. After May 1st there will be a 10% late fee.

Training Overview

Officer Brian Wallace, Coordinator for the Tactical & Protective Medicine Branch Training Division with the Emergency Services Unit of the West Hartford Police Department, acting under a DHS grant provided to Hartford Hospital, provides a course designed to provide police officers and first responders with the techniques necessary to respond to casualties following an active shooter exercise. Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (TECC) Hartford Hospital has paired up with tactical operators and medical providers in the field to bring this unique training opportunity for officers of the law and fire department personnel. The instructors are all military members with special operational experience and police officers with several years of tactical and medical experience in a high threat environment.

The Active Shooter response training on April 13 will include a four hour morning presentation analyzing recent active shooter situation responses to include the LAX airport, Florida nightclub, Batman movie theater shooting, the recent Fort Lauderdale Shooting, etc. After that there will be a break for lunch, followed by hands on first response and triage training on how to treat the survivors of an active shooting incident. Students will receive three hours of didactic training covering basic medical treatments that have been proven to save lives in high threat critical incidences. All police officers will receive Police Officer Standards and Training credits. The curriculum is based on Tactical Emergency Casualty Care guidelines and the Hartford Consensus committee recommendations.

Audience

The course is designed to be provided to law enforcement/first responders, emergency medical personnel, military organizations at CT, and other entities who are expected to be first on the scene and who will be treating the wounded of an active shooter incident. Due to limitations of the auditorium, each agency is requested to limit attendees to no more than four (4) employees.
