The Drill Ground Instructor Academy, instructor development course is a highly interactive and fast paced presentation which is specifically designed to improve the overall efficiency and competency of the active Drill Ground Instructor.

The seminar is intended for fire department training officers, company training officers, and certified fire service instructors.

The presentation will be held at the Connecticut Fire Academy. The course number is 16273 and the course fee is \$40.00, with lunch included.



Candidates must take and pass a written examination, oral examination, medical examination, drug screening, and background investigation. Candidates must submit a valid CPAT certificate issued on or after June 11, 2015 and State of Connecticut Commission on Fire Prevention & Control or Pro Board Firefighter I certification at time of application.

The Town of New Canaan will require candidates to provide copies of your State of Connecticut / Pro Board – Firefighter I certification and Candidate Physical Ability Test (CPAT) certification with the application. www.ct.gov/cfpc.
