6. NFA Pilot Recruitment – **Strategic and Tactical Considerations for Fire Protection Systems** The U.S. Fire Administration's National Fire Academy (NFA) is seeking students to help pilot test the revised 6-day courses in the Fire Prevention Technical curriculum area. The course, formerly titled *Fire Protection Systems for Emergency Operations*, now titled P0227 - *Strategic and Tactical Considerations for Fire Protections Systems*, will be held September 18-23, 2016 on the NFA's Emmitsburg, Maryland campus.

The purpose of *Strategic and Tactical Considerations for Fire Protection Systems* is to ensure that Incident Commanders (ICs) know how to conduct proper pre-incident planning for the target hazards in their communities, so that they can identify what fire protection systems are available at these sites, how they work, and how to use them in firefighting.

Student Selection Criteria: Anyone responsible for the command and control of incident operations, preferably in the built environment. Target audience includes command officers, company officers, fire department training officers, and those acting in that capacity. In addition, those officers who are upwardly mobile in their organizations and will or may be in command positions in the near future and fire prevention officers who have a responsibility for pre-planning and coordination with incident operations staff.

Prerequisites:

- Students attending this class should have responsibility for command and control of incident operations.
- Not less than three years' experience in fire suppression emergency operations.
- ICS-100-level and ICS-200-level training. Preferred courses are Q0462 and Q0463, available through NFA Online at <u>usfa.fema.gov/training/nfa/courses/online.html</u>. Chief's signature attests that the applicant has completed this required training.

7. FAMA Releases Fire Apparatus Safety Guide

The Fire Apparatus Manufacturer's Association (FAMA) has developed the Fire Apparatus Safety Guide. The NFPA-compliant guide is available to anyone working on or around a fire apparatus. It includes essential safety information for firefighters, fire chiefs, apparatus mechanics, and fire department safety officers.

The guide is applicable to municipal, wildland, and airport firefighting apparatus manufactured on either custom or commercial chassis. The 8.5 x 5.5 inch format is sized to fit in every fire department vehicle and every apparatus mechanic's toolbox.

Notice of Intent to Adopt the 2016 Connecticut State Building Code

The Department of Administrative Services, Office of the State Building Inspector, in conjunction with the Codes & Standards Committee, is announcing its intent to adopt a new State Building Code to be titled the 2016 Connecticut State Building Code. In accordance with the requirements of Public Act 16-215, the agency will accept comments from the public for a period of forty-five (45) days, beginning June 21, 2016 through the close of business August 5, 2016.
