Captain Suffers Sudden Cardiac Death While Performing Physical Fitness Training—Mississippi

On May 6, 2015, a career captain responded to a carbon monoxide call. After returning to the station, the captain played basketball as part of the department's physical fitness program. 5. Basic Pump Openings in Newtown

Several openings available for Basic Pumps in Dodgingtown (Newtown) on June 25 and 26. This two day class examines the components and controls in the operation of a fire pump. Class include specific functions involved in drafting and hydrant operations in setting up for pumping operations. Participants will learn how to determine and overcome friction loss, how to calculate theoretical pump pressure and how to apply easy-to-use "rule of thumb" principles of relay pumping, operating hand lines, supplying sprinklers and standpipe systems. On the training ground, students will apply practical applications while flowing water at prescribed pressures.

6. June School 2016 – Seminar Thermal Imaging and Modern Fire Dynamics – Friday June $10^{\rm th}$

Correction: The Seminar Series class on Thermal Imaging and Modern Fire Dynamics to Improve Operations is a <u>full day class</u>. Hours are 8:30-4:30. The class was incorrectly listed as a half-day in the June School brochure.

For 2016 the very popular Connecticut Fire Academy Seminar Series continues to bring nationally known fire service presenters to Connecticut speaking on current and engaging fire service topics.

The next scheduled Seminar Series titled *Using Thermal Imaging and Modern Fire Dynamics to Improve Fireground Operations* is scheduled for Friday, June 10, 2016. Registration begins at 0800; the class is scheduled from 0830 to 1630 at the Connecticut Fire Academy. The course number is 16300 and the course fee is \$55.00 with lunch included.

The seminar will be presented by Mike Richardson, currently the Division Chief of Training & Safety for the East Jefferson County Fire Protection Districts in Louisville, KY.

In this seminar the speaker will focus on providing fire personnel at all levels with the knowledge they need to combine thermal imaging technology with the latest NIST and UL firefighting research to improve the effectiveness and safety of fireground operations. This will include the review of a large number of thermal imaging photos and videos from fireground operations where key concepts such as vent limited fire behavior, compromised structural integrity, flow path development, and victim survival profiling were in play. Firefighters will ultimately be able to apply thermal imaging in fireground operations with an understanding of both the capabilities and limitations.

Mike Richardson has also taught firefighters in over 38 U.S. States and 8 Countries...
