4. NFA Water Based Fire Protection Systems Plan Review

Connecticut Fire Academy: October 22-27, 2017

Course Number: 18068

Course description

This six-day course will enable students to perform a plan review to evaluate the suitability of the fire sprinkler, pump, and standpipe plans and calculations in accordance with nationally recognized standards for design and installation. Course content covers fire protection standards, plan reading, water supplies, building envelope features, fire protection hydraulics mathematics, fire pumps, sprinkler systems, and standpipe systems.

Selection criteria

Anyone responsible for the review and/or approval of building and fire/life safety design in the regulatory process. This includes building officials, fire marshals, insurance representatives, and designers/architects. Preference will be given to applicants who have previously attended National Fire Academy's "Fire Inspection Principles" (R0220) and/or "Fire and Life Safety Plan Review" (R0132).

Prerequisites

- 1. Incident Command System (ICS)-100-level and ICS-200-level training. Preferred courses are Q0462 and Q0463, available through NFA Online at www.usfa.fema.gov/training/nfa/courses/online.html. Chief's signature attests that the applicant has completed this required training.
- 2. Working knowledge and understanding of prescriptive codes and fundamental understanding of fire behavior.

- 3. Three or more years of experience in either a code enforcement or fire safety inspection function.
- 4. Students in the fire service should not have less than three years' experience in either a code enforcement or fire safety inspection/plan review function.
- 5. Allied professionals should possess an associate degree in engineering, architecture, building design, or risk management from an accredited college.

This course has been approved for 32 hours of continuing education credit from OEDM.

Course Number: 2017-07

This course is designed to prepare the student for the practical skills and written examinations for Pump Operator certification. Class work will include: safe driving techniques, preventative maintenance, pump operations, hydraulic calculations, water supply and apparatus systems. The course begins inside the classroom and ends outside with pumping apparatus. The main emphasis of this course is on "hands-on" exercises using various types of pumps, hose sizes and nozzles. This course alone is not designed to produce expert pump operators. Students must apply the basics learned from this course with continued hands-on practical applications with apparatus in their departments to build and maintain proficiency in pump apparatus operations.



Course Number: 2017-02

The Firefighter Two program is the next step in firefighting training. The program is based on the NFPA 1001 2013 ed. Standard or Firefighter Level 2 Certification and will utilize the IFSTA training lesson and manuals. Open only to those who are at least 18 years of age and have successfully completed Firefighter 1 and Hazardous Materials Operational. This course is a required prerequisite for those who wish to become certified fire instructors or fire officers. This is both a classroom and hands-on instructional program. Fees for State of Connecticut certification examination fees are included. Both the practical and written examinations will be conducted by The Commission on Fire Prevention and Control, Office of Certification from the Connecticut Fire Academy.
