2. Public Fire & Life Safety Education Conference - August 24, 2017 - CFA

In 1986 the Connecticut State Police Canine Unit trained the world's FIRST operational, laboratory validated Accelerant Detection K9 named "Mattie," who worked for six years, searched more than 400 fires scenes and contributed to numerous arrests and convictions.

More commonly known as "Arson Dogs," Accelerant Detection K9s are trained to alert to a multitude of different ignitable liquids commonly used by arsonists. Since 1986 the Connecticut State Police has trained 97 Accelerant Detection K9s across America, Canada, Australia and the Netherlands. To date, 23 Accelerant Detection K9s have served in the State of Connecticut; searching thousands of fire scenes in *nearly every single community* in the State. Many of you have met these canines at fire scenes across the state, fire department open houses or fire prevention programs. Their service, like yours, has been invaluable to the mission of protecting the life and property of our citizens. Currently, four Accelerant Detection K9's are assigned to the CSP Fire & Explosion Investigation Unit, continuing the tradition.

In recognition and commemoration of over 30 years of steadfast dedication to fire investigation, it is time to honor "Mattie," all of her successors and to recognize Connecticut's place in history! 

Meri-K Appy, Vision 20/20

Meri-K Appy is a leader in fire and life safety education with a proven track record in creating and implementing high-impact injury prevention initiatives. Appy served as Vice President for Public Education at NFPA from 1989 – 2003, as President of the Home Safety Council from 2003-2010, and as President of Safe Kids USA until December, 2011. Now head of her own consulting company, Meri-K is working on a number of national fire safety initiatives, including Vision 20/20 and an exciting new school-based program funded by AFG.

Kelly is a member of Safe Kids Harnett County and recently joined the SKNC Steering Committee. Before joining NFPA staff in 2015, she worked as the Deputy Director of the North Carolina Department of Insurance- Office of State Fire Marshal overseeing the Prevention, Programs and Grants Division for nearly 15 years.
