Students will spend limited time in a fire command simulator during the emergency service delivery section of this course.

10. Fake Solar Eclipse Glasses: Your Community May Be at Risk

Millions of Americans will watch the Aug. 21 solar eclipse and have already purchased (or will) eclipse glasses or handheld solar viewers to do so. Some of these people may be at risk from counterfeit glasses and viewers sold by disreputable vendors trying to cash in on this rare event. Watching the eclipse with fake protective gear can cause permanent eye damage, making this a community risk reduction issue.

Only glasses and viewers verified by an accredited testing laboratory to meet ISO 12312-2 are safe to use when viewing the eclipse. This standard requires glasses and viewers to be thousands of times darker than typical sunglasses.

It may be hard to tell the difference between genuine protective gear and fake glasses/viewers as some counterfeit makers are placing ISO labels on them. The American Astronomical Society (AAS) has guidance to help eclipse watchers determine if their eclipse glasses or handheld solar viewers are safe. In addition, NASA recommends that eclipse watchers refer to the AAS's website for a list of reputable vendors selling solar glasses and viewers.

Fire and EMS departments: You can help alert community residents to the dangers of these fake glasses and viewers by spreading the word through appropriate communications channels, especially social media.

How to view the 2017 solar eclipse safely

Remind community residents that they can experience the eclipse safely, but it is vital that they protect their eyes at all times with the proper solar glasses and viewers. NASA safety tips for watching the eclipse.

The purpose of this performance-level course is to provide the operational -level details to support many of the topics covered in the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) approved AWR 148: Crisis Management for School-Based Incidents – Partnering Rural Law Enforcement and the Local School Systems awareness-level course. Size-Up, Situational Awareness

SEMINAR: Size-Up, Situational Awareness

This ALL-DAY seminar is a MUST for every firefighter and fire officer. Knowing *when to stay* or *when to go* are the critical factors outlined in this seminar. Situational Awareness, or the lack of it, is a consistent series of factors that leads to the success or failure of an emergency incident. The crucial component(s) in this seminar focus on *what to look for, how to anticipate ahead of your incident* and *being prepared for the expected as well as the unexpected*. We will cover size-up factors for various occupancies, as well as suggested strategy and tactics for the first due engine, ladder and chief officer. Additionally in this seminar, we will provide you with uniformed/informative and disciplined approach toward scene management and control through use of the FD radio. In this program we will provide you with a scripted outline for the initial radio report, the alarm status report, and the incident scene progress report. By reviewing actual radio transmission clips and case studies, we will provide your department with a uniformed approach on *what to say, how to say it* and *how it should affect* your fire ground operations.

Michael Terpak has been in the fire service for *41 years* spending the last 36 years with the **Jersey City Fire Department** where he recently retired as a **Deputy Chief** and City-Wide Tour Commander. Throughout his career he has worked in the city's Lafayette and Greenville areas with Engines 10 & 17, Ladder 12, Rescue 1, Chief of the city's 2nd. Battalion and the former Chief in -charge of the city's Training Division. In addition to the above, he was also the High-Rise Training Coordinator for Jersey City. Terpak travels extensively around the country lecturing on fire/rescue topics and is the founder of *Promotional Prep*, a New Jersey based consulting firm designed to prepare firefighters and fire officers studying for promotional exams.



Chief Terpak, who also holds a BS degree in Fire Safety Administration from the City University of New Jersey,

is the author of five best-selling books, "Fire Ground Size-Up", "Assessment Center Strategy and Tactics", "Fire Ground Operational Guides", "Assessment Center Management and Supervision" and "Fire Officer Oral Assessment Study Guides."
