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1. Important Notice regarding Naloxone Rebate Program from Governor Malloy's Office

On April 5th the State of Connecticut reached an agreement with Naloxone manufacturer Amphastar Pharmaceuticals Inc to rebate \$6 for each prefilled syringe purchased by Connecticut "State Agencies", e.g., towns and municipal agencies, schools and political subdivision customers in Connecticut (see below for the complete definition of "State Agency" under the Amphastar agreement).

Local EMS Equipment Distributor, Common Cents EMS Supply LLC of Old Saybrook, has agreed to a request by Governor Malloy's office to process Naloxone Rebates from eligible agencies at no charge. This includes agencies who may have purchased Naloxone from other vendors.

The Naloxone Rebate program periods run for three month intervals starting March 23rd 2016 through March 22, 2017. The closing date for the first three months of the program is August 22nd.

Any Public Safety or Government Agencies in the State of Connecticut who purchased Naloxone Prefilled Syringes since March 24th 2016 from another vendor should Contact Common Cents EMS Supply as soon as possible at 860-388-4599 or by e-mail at

<u>orders@savelives.com</u> in order to take advantage of the \$6 per Syringe Naloxone Rebate Program.

NOTE: Agencies who already purchase Naloxone from Common Cents EMS Supply are already enrolled in the Rebate Program through prior permission granted from the Attorney General's Office and do not need to do anything.

State Agency is defined as:

A State agency is defined as any of the following: any executive, administrative or legislative office of the state or any political subdivision of the state and any state or town agency, any department, institution, bureau, board, commission, authority or official of the state or of any city, town, borough, municipal corporation, school district, regional district or other district or other political subdivision of the state, including any committee of, or created by, any such office, subdivision, agency, department, institution, bureau, board, commission, authority or official, and also includes any judicial office, official, or body or committee thereof but only with respect to its or their administrative functions, and for purposes of this subparagraph, "judicial office" includes, but is not limited to, the Division of Public Defender Services.

2. Burrville Fire School Fall Firefighter II Program

Burrville's Fall Firefighter II certification course will be running on Monday and Wednesday evenings and some weekends this fall. The class begins on September 7th and the first of 5-weekends begins on September 10th.

It will be held at the Burrville Fire Department in Torrington due to rebuilding of the actual fire school. The practical and written exams will be on November 12 & 23 respectively. The cost is \$650 which includes all exam fees. Firefighter II students that do not have the textbook and workbook can purchase a set from the school. The application deadline for Firefighter II is August 24, 2016. The course fee will increase to \$715 after the deadline of August 24, 2016. MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- Age: Applicants must be 18 years of age.
- Education: Graduation from a standard high school or technical school or equivalent as certified by the State Board of Education

- License: Applicants must possess and maintain a valid driver's license with appropriate endorsement to drive fire apparatus.
- Certifications Required: Certification to Pro Board/IFSAC accredited Firefighter II, CPAT (Candidates Physical Ability Test) certificate, Emergency Medical Responder (EMR)
- Residency: Applicants must be U.S. citizens and reside within a fifteen (15) mile radius of the Suffield Fire Departments Main Station within one (1) year of date of hire.
- Physical Examination: A rigid physical examination in compliance with the NFPA 1582
 Standard on Comprehensive Occupational Medical Programs for Fire Departments 2013
 edition conducted by the Department and Town's medical authority will also be required
- Drug Testing: Applicants shall be required to submit to a drug test as part of the pre employment medical examination.
- Character Requirements and other factors: Applicants must meet the highest legal and ethical standards. Honesty and integrity are paramount to the profession. Candidates will undergo a rigorous background investigation. An applicant may be disqualified for poor employment history, recent use of illegal drugs, or previously undetected criminal activity.

The selection process will include, at a minimum, a detailed review of your application packet, and the successful completion of the Department's selection process, which includes but may not be limited to the following:

10. Hoarding Hazards: Municipal Team Response Training

COURSE ANNOUNCEMENT

The Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection, Police Officer Standards and Training Council's Field Services Training Division, in cooperation with the Division of Criminal Justice, the Department of Agriculture, and the Connecticut Hoarding Working Group, is offering a one-day training seminar titled "Hoarding Hazards: Municipal Team Response".

Instruction will be provided by trainers from the Division of Criminal Justice, Housing Prosecution Unit of the Office of the Chief State's Attorney, the Department of Agriculture, Animal Control Division, and other subject matter experts. The training seminar will take place on **Monday, November 21, 2016** from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at the Connecticut Police Academy, 285 Preston Avenue, Meriden, CT. Registration will begin at 8:00a.m.

This training will provide recommended procedures for municipal team response to complex cases of severe hoarding in and around housing. Municipalities are encouraged to send official representatives from the following departments for this specialized training in hoarding response: police, animal control, fire marshal, health, housing, building and blight.

The presentation will be split into morning and afternoon sessions. The morning session will be general instruction, and the afternoon will consist of break-out sessions where participants will work through a series of case scenarios with guidance from subject matter experts. The morning will be open to all interested parties, however the full day program is limited to in-service police, animal control officers, and code enforcement officials.

The presentation has the following objectives:

- Identify Connecticut laws applicable to hoarding cases
- Recognize constitutional limitations to lawful right of entry in hoarding cases
- Recognize proper response to animal hoarding
- Familiarize municipal officials with skills for proper assessment and response to hoarding cases
- Review applicable emergency protocols, mental health and social service referrals, and mandatory reporting provisions in hoarding cases

The training class is limited to 120 police and code officials. The session will be held in the auditorium. Students successfully completing the training will receive Review Training Credit as follows: Curriculum Area II: Police and the Law, 4 hours and Curriculum Area IV: Human Relations, 2 hours.

There is no tuition for this course. Lunch may be purchased at nearby restaurants. The uniform dress code for POSTC In-Service Training (<u>POSTC General Notice 90-03</u>) will be in effect. We ask all training supervisors to inform assigned personnel that they represent their agency and are required to dress accordingly.
