# 1. 14<sup>th</sup> Annual Connecticut Fallen Firefighters Memorial – September 25, 2016

# 2. 48 Hour Pump Operator Certification Class

Space is available in a 48-hour Pump Operator certification class at Yantic Volunteer Fire Department (Norwich). Class starts October 15 and runs for three weekends. ## 3. Spotlight on Ropes for Rescue Week and Beyond

There are a few remaining seats for **Urban Lead Climber**, this two day class covers incidents where the only way to reach your victim is by climbing up to them. Day 1 covers rigging theories and specialized equipment. Day 2 is out in the field conducting simulated lead climbing rescues.

We also have a few remaining seats for **Advanced Urban Lead Climber**, a continuation of the Urban Lead Climber Course. This is a scenario based program that takes place at a local amusement park and covers size up, Incident Command, pre-climb inspection and continuing up-grades to the rescue plan. This class encourages students to expand their physical and mental limits.

Are you up for a challenge? Friday, October 7<sup>th</sup>, is our **Rope Rescue Challenge**. Working as a member of a team, the students will problem solve and implement rope rescue objectives for a variety of high angle rescue scenarios. There will be a brief equipment, procedural and safety review at the start of class. Come alone or put together your own team.
