## 7. Congress Continues Work on Continuing Resolution as Deadline Looms

Congress is making the final push to approve a <u>continuing resolution</u> before the fiscal year ends on September 30, 2016. On Tuesday, September 20th, the Senate agreed to move to consideration of a measure that would keep the federal government functioning under current spending levels until December 9, 2016. This is necessary to allow Congress to complete work on Fiscal Year 2017 (FY17) spending bills. Even though both the House and Senate Appropriations Committees have completed work on all the <u>FY17 spending bills</u>, not a single appropriations measure has been approved by both chambers and sent to the White House for the President's signature.

Although the Senate has made some progress on the temporary spending measure, differences remain over funding levels to combat the Zika virus and provide assistance for the flooding in the Southeast. Additional, members of Congress are debating whether to include funds to address lead-contaminated waters in Flint, MI.

The Senate could vote on the continuing resolution the afternoon of Tuesday, September 27th, but the two sides will need to resolve their differences to ensure passage of the measure. Should the Senate approve the bill, the House is currently operating under modified rules that will allow for expedited consideration and approval of the bill.

#### 8. 2017 National Fire & Emergency Services Symposium Call for Seminar Proposals

The Congressional Fire Services Institute (CFSI) is announcing an official Call for Proposals for the 2017 National Fire and Emergency Services Symposium. The Symposium will be held in Washington, DC on Wednesday, April 5, 2017, the day before the 29th Annual National Fire and Emergency Services Dinner.

Seminar proposals must meet the following criteria to be considered:

- Seminars should focus on federal policy or issues that are national in scope, and have a positive impact on the nation's fire and emergency services. Seminars intended solely to promote for-profit programs and activities that specifically benefit an organization will not be considered.
- Seminars are limited to 50 minutes in length.
- Where applicable, proposed panelists and moderators should represent a variety of national organizations and fire service disciplines.

- Statement explaining how the proposed seminar aligns with CFSI's mission to advance the readiness and response capabilities of all first responders;
- Statement explaining how the applicant will help CFSI promote the seminar and the 2017 National Fire and Emergency Services Symposium and Dinner;
- A primary point of contact for the submission, including name, phone number, and email address.

All proposals will be reviewed by CFSI's staff and the Programmatic Subcommittee of CFSI's National Advisory Committee. Applicants must agree to work with CFSI to finalize participants, produce relevant materials, and promote the seminars series. CFSI reserves the right to make changes to panelists and seminar content.

Rescue Companies and Search and Rescue Teams are increasingly carrying and using rigging equipment designed for the Crane and Towing/Recovery industries. The improper use and care of this equipment not only increases the chances of a failed operation, it increases the chances of injury or death to the victim and the rescuers. The Crosby Group will present a four -hour training program that covers: risk management and the basic rigging plan; loads on rigging and the rigging triangle; application of hardware; inspection of hardware; application of slings; and the inspection of slings. Any responder who may be called on to utilize wire rope, chain, slings, or the associated hardware should take this training. It could be a life saver.
