7. Firefighter Near Miss Report of the Week

Medic Unit is Demolished in High-Speed Collision

Summary

An ambulance, responding with lights and siren, was hit by another vehicle when they slowed to turn around on a divided highway. Both vehicles received extensive damage and all parties in both vehicles were transported.

Event Description

A medic unit was responding with lights and sirens to an incident on a divided highway. The medic-unit crew was planning to use the next available emergency turnaround; one was identified and other traffic was noted to be slowing behind the medic unit.

After the medic unit committed to the counterclockwise maneuver to use the turnaround, a motorist attempted to pass the unit at nearly 80 MPH. The vehicle struck the ambulance near the driver's door in a T-bone-type collision. The impact caused significant occupant intrusion and devastating vehicle damage to both the medic unit and civilian vehicle.

Take-Aways

Responding to emergency calls with lights and siren is a dangerous part of our job and one that shouldn't be taken lightly. Never assume other drivers can see or hear your warning devices. Cars are now better-insulated against road noise, and distractions such as stereo systems and cell phones just make matters worse.

Discussion

- What is your department's policy regarding Code 3 driving?
- When are you allowed to exceed the posted speed limit?
- Are you required to come to a complete stop at all red traffic signals?
- How often are members of your agency required to attend refresher courses and actually practice emergency-vehicle operations in a controlled training environment?

• What can you personally do to ensure you're minimizing risks to your crew and yourself while driving Code 3 and operating at an accident scene?

Leading Practices

Between 1996 and 2010, the U.S. Fire Administration studied roadway accidents involving firefighters. Between 15% and 31% of all line-of-duty deaths in each year were firefighters involved in a vehicle collision or stuck by another vehicle while working on scene.

As emergency responders, we need to do everything we can to reduce the risks we're exposed to during these hazardous situations.

Excessive speed and failure to stop at intersections, especially when we encounter a red traffic light, are the leading causes of roadway accidents involving emergency responders. Darkness, rain, blowing dust, fog, snow and high winds are other factors that must be considered.

Even though the law may grant us the right of way, it's still our responsibility to ensure that other drivers are aware of our presence and yield to us. We're of no use to the people we serve if we ourselves don't arrive safely to the emergency scene.

Once we arrive on the scene at an incident, it's important to do everything within our power to create a safe zone for our personnel to work in. This involves using any resources available, including law enforcement for traffic control and apparatus to block our work area from distracted drivers who may not see us.

Reflective PPE with traffic vests, cones, flares and other warning devices should be used whenever possible. The use of a safety officer or lookout should be considered and everyone on scene must maintain a heightened sense of situational awareness. It's everyone's duty to ensure we all get home safely.

GOVERNOR'S AWARD

For EMS Organizations - This award was established to recognize and commend an EMS Organization, whether career or volunteer in structure, that has enhanced the understanding and support of the EMS System through their public service, community education and contributions to a city, town, region or the state as a whole.

CONNECTICUT PUBLIC HEALTH COMMISSIONER'S AWARD
