Fire department activities; including public fire education programs, man-made and natural disasters, and emergencies, make developing policies and training for dealing with the news media essential. Discussion topics will cover: public disclosure laws; media relations; and news releases. Participants will learn the basics of preparing news releases, setting up press conferences, and the responsibilities of the Public Information Officer (PIO) at the scene of an emergency. Students will participate in a briefing with reporters from media sources.

3. Greenwich EMS Spring 2017 EMT Program

Program Description: State of Connecticut Approved 160 plus hour EMT program will prepare students for the NREMT Exam. The course is blended learning (classroom/ skills practice/ online), as well as clinical and ambulance rotations. The Program is held on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings from 1830-2200 and with some Saturday classes that meet from 0800-1600. Classes commence on Monday 08 May 2017 and conclude on Saturday 05 Aug 2017. All classes will be held at Greenwich EMS Training Center, 1111 East Putnam Avenue, Riverside, Connecticut 06878. Tuition is \$950 which includes text with online access, class polo (required for uniform), BP cuff/stethoscope, and pocket mask. Student to provide Blue EMS pants, black belt and black uniform shoes which are to be worn during all skill sessions and clinical rotations. Must be 16 years of age to register with parental consent. 4. Accelerated On-Line FF 1 and FF 2

The Burrville Fire School announces their on-line accelerated classes for this summer. These are fast moving, demanding courses of study/practice. You are expected to make *all* of the classes. You must be a self-motivated student who is comfortable with on-line learning.

Firefighter 1 will begin on May 15th. It will run on Monday & Wednesday nights from 6 PM to 10 PM. It is approximately 3-months in length. The cost is \$1,050 and includes the course text.

Firefighter 2 will begin on May 15th. It will then run on Tuesday and Thursday nights from 6 PM to 10 PM. It is approximately 2-months in length. The cost is \$850. This does not include a text (which can be purchased separately). The text is available to all as an on-line e-book and downloadable audio book.

Locations have not yet been determined although we are planning on eastern Litchfield County for ease of access for those coming from a distance. The state practical exam dates August 5th for FF1, July 8th for FF2.. The deadline for applying is May 1st. After May 1st there will be a 10% late fee.

5. NFA Managing Officer Program

The National Fire Academy's (NFA's) Managing Officer Program is a multiyear curriculum that introduces emerging emergency services leaders to personal and professional skills in change management, risk reduction and adaptive leadership. Acceptance into the program is the first step in your professional development as a career or volunteer fire/Emergency Medical Services (EMS) manager, and includes all four elements of professional development: education, training, experience and continuing education. The program can assist first or mid-level officer/supervisor, and those on promotional lists jump-start professional development early in their career or volunteer service. Students will build on foundational

management and technical competencies, learning to address issues of interpersonal and cultural sensitivity, professional ethics, and outcome-based performance.

On completion of the program, graduates will:

- Be better prepared to grow professionally, improve their skills, and meet emerging professional challenges.
- Be able to embrace professional growth and development in their career.
- Enjoy a national perspective on professional development.
- Understand and appreciate the importance of professional development.
 Have a network of fire service professionals who support career development.

The Managing Officer Program consists of:

- Five prerequisite courses (online and classroom deliveries in your state).
- Four courses at the NFA in Emmitsburg, Maryland.
- A community-based capstone project.

A certificate of completion for the Managing Officer Program is awarded after the successful completion of all required courses and the successful completion of a capstone project.

Course Description: Lightweight energy efficient construction, modern fuels, firefighter encapsulation and manpower reductions have combined to make today's residential firefight a dramatically new challenge for even the most experienced firefighter. This workshop brings together cutting edge research and best practices to help firefighters develop strategies and tactics for mounting interior fire attacks in modern residential construction. It will assist participants in developing best practices for mounting an intelligent fire attack within these structures, particularly in attics and basements, and whenever they encounter ventilation limited or post flashover conditions. This workshop will cover the following objectives:

- Introduce the scope and magnitude of the problem
- Review the most recent UL/NIST research available
- Present curriculum on strategies and tactics for the modern fire ground.

Chief Van Dorpe recently retired as Director of the Chicago Fire Department's Training Division after a 33 year career with the CFD. He holds a Bachelor's degree in Fire Science Management from Southern Illinois University. He has recently participated as a Subject Matter Expert for UL's research on "Structural Stability of Engineered Lumber In Fire Conditions", the National Institute of Standards and Technology's, "Evaluating Firefighting Tactics Under Wind Driven Conditions", the IAFF/NIST "Firefighter Safety and Deployment Study" in high rise buildings. Chief Van Dorpe is the 2016 recipient of the Fire Engineering/ISFSI George D. Post Instructor of the Year award.
