7. Near Miss Report of the Week

Downed Power Line Stepped on During 360

Summary

Performing a 360-degree risk/benefit analysis has become standard practice before initiating either offensive or defensive fire-attack tactics. The need to conduct identify potential hazards has never been more critical to ensuring firefighter safety. When anyone performs a 360, they need to look at the scene from a six-sided approach and ensure that obvious hazards aren't missed and are communicated to the incident commander.

Event Description

An engine company was given the assignment to perform a walkaround of a single-family home before pulling a backup attack line. The area was quickly surveyed and the walkaround began.

While walking the rear of the structure, a charged power line was stepped on. This resulted in the line arcing and created a flash. This was a black line supplying power to the home, located in burned grass and other debris from a patio awning that had collapsed.

After this occurred a crew assessment was performed and no injury was noted. Emergency traffic was requested and all companies on scene were advised of the hazard.

Take-Aways

When performing a 360, don't be oblivious to the obvious hazards. There are typically three types of harm on any fireground. That harm could be toxic, energetic or corrosive harm or any combination of the three.

Firefighters need to understand their first-due response area and know where underground power supplies are in addition to where the areas with high, overhead drops are, and they must plan accordingly, depending on the location and the extent of the fire.

Fortunately, in this report, the wire was discovered accidentally by a firefighter stepping on it and no one was injured. The reality is that a downed wire carries enough electrical load to seriously injure or kill a firefighter, depending on the exposure and duration of the contact.

Discussion

- Is looking for downed power lines part of your mental fireground safety checklist?
- Has your department engaged in a community partnership with the local power company to train and educate first responders on the hazards associated with downed electrical lines?
- If a downed line is discovered on your fireground, what is your plan to handle it?

What is your local power company's response time to a reported downed line during an emergency incident compared to a nonemergency incident?

Leading Practices

Performing a 360 and identifying hazards to determine the extent of the risk/benefit analysis can't be done haphazardly. When assigned this task by the incident commander, a crewmember must exercise courageous self-leadership in identifying hazards, communicating those to command and marking or isolating the hazard so on-scene crews aren't affected or injured.

Aggressive preplanning and district familiarization will help prepare you for a fire at a dwelling like the one in this report. When responding, the first time you arrive on scene should not be the first time you and your crew discuss possible hazards associated with a call. Get out in your first-due response area and let the discussions begin. Be safe!
