7. Firefighter Near Miss Report of the Week

Seatbelt Usage Prevents Possible Injury

Summary

After clearing a call, a firefighter was almost ejected from an apparatus while it was driving away. The apparatus made a hard turn and the door opened. The firefighter was kept from falling out by the seatbelt.

Event Description

After finishing up with a car-bicycle wreck, the firefighters loaded up and cleared the scene. The driver of the apparatus made a turn into a parking lot in order to make a quicker trip back to the station. As the apparatus made that left-hand turn, the officer's door popped opened and the officer started to slide out the door.

The officer was wearing their seat belt and it kept the officer from falling out. The officer's seat in the apparatus was a tight fit and the door was not completely shut.

After the apparatus reported back to the station, one of the privates wanted to watch a training film. The officer selected one out about apparatus response. The video told the story of a firefighter who wasn't wearing his seatbelt and died after his door opened while responding on a call. The officer shared their earlier experience with staff.

Take-Aways

Wearing a seatbelt in an apparatus is one of the easiest forms of PPE to use. It requires no lengthy training and usually comes with the vehicle. There are many stories to support the use of seatbelts when riding in an apparatus or in a personal vehicle. In addition, wearing seatbelts may be required by law.

Leading Practices

Seatbelts are one of the easiest PPE we have available to us. It requires very little training to use and the habit of putting it on should be a regular part of life, whether in fire apparatus or our personal vehicles.

If something happens, what excuse do you want to use for not wearing one? It's likely riding along with you, sitting there waiting to be used.

Are you concerned it's going to slow you down? Is the seatbelt really the only thing in the process of turning out and responding that is slowing you down?

Wearing seatbelts is a necessary practice to prevent serious injury when travelling in vehicles. With vehicle crashes being another significant factor in line-of-duty deaths, it's a simple action that personnel must be held accountable for taking.
