SUA SPONTE RULING AND ORDER DISMISSING CASE WITH PREJUDICE

On October 9, 2018, by ruling and order on the respondent's motion to dismiss the complaint in the above-captioned case, the tribunal dismissed certain allegations, pursuant to § 46a-54-88a (d) (1) of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies, for failure to establish jurisdiction.

In addition, the tribunal dismissed (struck) portions of the complaint, pursuant to § 46a-54-88a (d) (2) of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies, for failure to state a claim upon which relief can be granted. The tribunal ordered the complainant to file a revised pleading by November 23, 2018, to state a claim for which relief may be granted in those instances where the allegations were so stricken. The tribunal noted that the failure of the complainant to file a revised pleading complying with the order may result in dismissal of the case in its entirety.

Having determined that the complainant has not filed a revised pleading, as directed by the undersigned presiding officer, within the time allowed, I do hereby dismiss this case with prejudice pursuant to subsections (d) (1) and (d) (2) of § 46a-54-88a of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies. This ruling and order is dispositive of this case in its entirety.
