Attorney Tamara J. Titre currently serves as the Assistant General Counsel for the Connecticut State Board of Labor Relations. Prior to that role she was employed by the City of Bridgeport as an Assistant City Attorney where she represented the City on a diverse range of matters including civil litigation, and Freedom of Information and Commission on Human Rights and Opportunities cases. She also served as a Senior Labor Relations Officer managing employee relations and administering the City's collective bargaining agreements, among other responsibilities. Tamara has spent her legal career in the public sector starting off as a clerk to the judges at the Superior Court in Bridgeport.

Tamara's academic journey laid the foundation for her successful legal career. She received her Bachelor of Arts Degree in Communications from Fairfield University and a Juris Doctor from Michigan State University College of Law. In law school she was the recipient of the Ralph M. Freeman Scholarship awarded to a third-year law student who exemplifies MI Rule of Professional Conduct 6.5 by treating everyone in the legal process with courtesy and respect regardless of "the person's race, gender, or other protected personal characteristics."

Tamara is actively engaged in her community serving on a few nonprofit boards. She is a member of the Board of Directors for Neighborhood Studios of Fairfield County and on the Board of Directors for the George W. Crawford Black Bar Association where she also serves as the association's liaison for the Governor's Council on Women and Girls. Additionally, she is a member of the Connecticut Bar Association and the Greater Bridgeport Bar Association. In August 2023, Tamara was appointed by Governor Ned Lamont to serve on the Commission on Human Rights and Opportunities. In October 2023, she was appointed by Chief Justice Richard A. Robinson to serve a two-year term as a faculty member for the Judicial Branch's civil Academy. Tamara was also selected as a Connecticut Bar Association Presidential Fellow for the 2023-2025 term.

Beyond her career and community involvement, Tamara has a deep passion for traveling, reading and spending quality time with her family. She has roots in the Caribbean and currently resides in Bridgeport, Connecticut with her family.
