- ➤ To date, 1 production incident support ticket had been opened for CJIS Total support time was 1.75 hours to resolve
- Cost estimate has been sent to Mark Raymond and Brian Clonan for review



New Project Schedule

- Change Request #119 was approved in March 2017
- ➤ This allowed us to extend the timeline for the completion of Phase 1 from November of 2017 to February 2018

Project Risks

- State Budget Cuts
 - Stakeholder involvement with CISS project may be impacted by State budget cuts
- > CISS Demands on Stakeholders
 - CISS is in a project life cycle that is very demanding on Stakeholders to support 6 active releases
- ➤ SharePoint Upgrade to 2016
 - Currently, CISS is being developed under SharePoint 2010
 - SharePoint 2010 will be at the end of mainstream support as of October 2017

Mitigation: A decision was made to wait until Phase 2



Project Risks continued ...

- > Release 9 Data from DESPP
 - Working WSDL for Wanted data Development delay
 - Replication of CT Wanted to the CJIS environment Work has started
- > Access to NCIC Wanted data will require:
 - Any device using CISS with access to NCIC Wanted data will be required to be COLLECT certified.
 - This was unplanned work and could cause a delay and/or pushback from Stakeholders



Risks Mitigation

- Work with Agencies to understand and baseline their work efforts for interfacing with CISS
 - Review resource needs to meet the schedule for development and testing
 - Identify Agency busy periods that could impact the schedule
- Conduct biweekly Project Checkpoint meetings to review the progress and identify any potential issues
- Work with Stakeholders to identify workflow issues that may impact business processes



RMS

Certification

- CT: CHIEF and ACCUCOM
 - 2 of 12 RMS vendors in CT
 - Cover roughly 20 of 93 Police Departments
- > Discussions on contractual agreements have started with:
 - TriTech (INC)
 - NexGen
 - KTI for CRCOG (CT: CHIEF)
- > High priority to onboard all RMS vendors
- Accucom expanding Early Arrest Notifications



CISS Phase 1 Rollout

> Scope:

 To bring Phase 1 CISS workflows into Production, for every Police Department, CSP Barracks, GA Court and State's Attorney's office in the State

> Benefits:

 Information is sent and received more quickly, more accurately and at lower cost



Phase 1 Rollout Methodology

- > Stakeholders are in charge at each step
- Every Connecticut RMS vendor will provide automated information
- Draft Standard Rollout Model
 - Roll out GA-by-GA, PD & Barracks-by-PD & Barracks throughout the state
 - Champions Statewide and for each site invested in success
 - "Model Office" Statewide and at each site
 - Two overlapped GA deployments at once
 - Includes Law Enforcement, Court Operations, State's Attorney



2-Month Production cycles

Phase 1 Rollout Schedule

> Dependencies

- Statewide leaders approve approach (Mid-May 2017)
- CISS workflows are in Production (February 2018)
- RMS Vendor code in Production (February 2018)
- Sufficient CJIS staff engaged Underway

Plan, subject to stakeholder approval

- Statewide Model Office: Summer 2017 (Dependency on R4 in Systest)
- Initial Kickoff: Winter 2018
- Initial GA Go-Live: Spring 2018

Change Request #119 Contract Changes

- Contract Completion Date Before Change Request #119 was August 2017
- ➤ Mutual Agreement by Conduent and CJIS to extend contract by additional 3 months to November 2017 at no additional cost
- ➤ Given requirements gaps, change requests by stakeholders and delays both Conduent and CJIS agreed to extend contract from November 2017 to February 2018
- ➤ Conduent support 30 days from production date plus 12 months to March 2019 for last Releases 5 and 11



DCJ SharePoint in Production

- Request from the Division of Criminal Justice (DCJ).
 - Expansion of the SharePoint site utilizing the CJIS external facing SharePoint server similar to the existing Homicide Cold Case
- > Opportunities:
 - Use existing system resources from CJIS
 - CJIS partners to collaborate on CJIS data for a critical investigation that would otherwise not be possible
 - Collects information for future CJIS SharePoint use.
 - "Do more with less"





Staying on Schedule and Getting Everyone on Board

The last three quarters have seen very little change in the overall project score. The range has been from 2.72 to 2.74, with this quarter's score being 2.73. Stakeholders' concerns in interviews were more focused on implementation, final product usability, training, and operational support.


The CJIS PMO and the Governance Committee need to ensure that Agencies are able to meet the project dates to avoid delaying the project and causing significant costs to the State. State and Municipal Police should work with the PMO to ensure RMS vendors support the project at reasonable costs.




Reporting Period 12/14/2016 – 3/22/2017

- The biggest project concern is the Agencies' abilities to meet the project timeline. Most Agencies will face additional budget cuts this year, pressing already limited resources to meet the tight project timeline. The Governance Committee members need to ensure their Agencies do not miss key project dates.
- ➤ In summary, the main concerns from those involved are:
 - Difficult to meet the timeline for full implementation with fewer resources available
 - Executive Director position has not been filled
 - An operational support plan is not in place
 - RMS vendor data is critical to the project, but an interface plan for each has not been finalized



Reporting Period 12/14/2016 – 3/22/2017



- AGENCY Agencies need to ensure they can meet key project dates.
- CONDUENT

 Agencies would like to see more quality control on formatting of screens prior to testing.
- PMO Standing cross-agency status meeting still needed.



Reporting Period 12/14/2016 - 3/22/2017

Key Risks

- ➤ Risk #4 The absence of the Executive Director will continue to negatively impact the project.
- ➤ Risk #5 The lack of a plan to operationally support the system may impact the long-term success of the project.
- ➤ Risk #7 Data from all RMS vendors is needed to support rollout to all geographic areas.
- ➤ Risk #11 State budget cuts impact project resource availability, either directly or indirectly. Agencies will have a harder time meeting CISS project needs. Having fewer resources could also impact the on-time implementation of new Agency systems that are important to CISS success.
