

#### Release 6

- Multiview Issue Resolved
- Currently in UAT until 2/9
- Forecasted to move into
   Production on 2/19

#### Release 10

- DMV Source moved to R9
- Currently in System Test 2/16
- Forecasted to move into Production on 3/26

#### Release 11

- System Test to continue thru 3/30 on all components
- RMS end to end testing to begin after Phase I completed

#### Release 9

- Now includes DMV Driver and Vehicle Source system data
- Currently in Development until 2/16
- Forecasted to move into
   Production on 6/29

#### Release 5

- Development to continue thru 3/2
- Forecasted to move into
   Production on 6/26



#### **CISS Accomplishments**

- All project requirements and design complete. Now building, testing and deploying
- R2.1 RMS Constraint Easement Development and System Testing complete
- Software AG Upgrade Complete
- Arrest data and documentation workflow now enabled and fully functional in the System Test environment
- Gap Analysis complete and demonstration conducted with Stakeholders
- NEXGEN Early Arrest Notification development progressing on schedule



#### **Project Risks**

- State Budget Cuts
  - Stakeholder involvement with CISS project may be impacted by State budget cuts
- CISS Demands on Stakeholders
  - CISS is in a project life cycle that is very demanding on Stakeholders to support 5 active releases
- Communication with Stakeholders
  - Completion of requirements and design phase has frustrated some Stakeholders because of reduction of communication



#### CISS Phase 1 Workflow Rollout

- Increased Engagement with CPCA
  - CPCA Regional Communication complete
  - LEA strongly encouraged with the workflow progress
- "Controlled Rollout"
  - Initial Plan forecasts all law enforcement agencies in a GA going live simultaneously
  - "Controlled" means one law enforcement agency in a GA going live, then Courts and State's Attorneys
    - Expand to other LEAs once "we've got it right"
    - RMS vendors need to be Level 1 and Level 2 certified
    - Widespread LEA deployment dependent on R11 Disposition deployment





- Formation of Legal Committee
  - To review cross agency legal issues for CJIS
  - Consists of legal advisors from several CJIS community members
  - CJIS Community Members have responded with Volunteers (DESPP, OVA, DCJ)
  - Additional Volunteers from DRS and DCP
  - Looking for Attorney General's Office review on case by case
- Requests for access to CISS from non-CJIS Agency Law Enforcement
  - Develop process to handle request, through a legal and security review
  - Department of Consumer Protection (DCP Drug Control Unit)
  - Department of Revenue Services (DRS Criminal Investigation Division)
  - Others expected (DEEP/EnCon Enforcement, University PDs, Other LEAs)









#### Reporting Period 10/07/2017 – 12/15/2017

Phase 1 funding has been secured, the first recent quarter with an Executive Director just completed, RMS Vendor interface contracts are being signed, an RFP for operational support is posted, and the number of new CRs is down. There were many success this past quarter.

- Given those successes, there are serious concerns:
  - Many stakeholders expressed project fatigue stemming from continued delays and inconsistent communication.
  - An operational support plan is not in place and Conduent will likely not train the full support team.
  - Agency resources are very constrained and have competing priorities, impacting availability to meet project demands
  - Updated, consistent status reports are requested that show which agencies are working on which releases, transparent timelines, change requests status, and an updated org chart.

Reporting Period 10/07/2017 – 12/15/2017



- AGENCY Agencies need to ensure they can meet key project dates.
- CONDUENT

   Needs to ensure the resources are in place to avoid delays like those with MultiVue.



PMO – Get operational support in place and take steps to help reengage stakeholders and reduce project fatigue.

Reporting Period 10/07/2017 – 12/15/2017

#### Key Risks

- Risk #5 A plan to operationally support the system is critical well before implementation so that the support team can be sufficiently trained.
- Risk #11 Agencies have limited resources and competing priorities that could impact their ability to meet the project schedule. The Governance Committee and PMO need to work to ensure the CISS project is appropriately prioritized and that key dates are not missed.



#### **CISS** Benefits


The tangible benefits of Criminal Information Sharing System (CISS) can be estimated by the automated sharing of justice information. The following tangible benefits would directly result from the implementation of CISS:

- Reduced data entry.
- Reduced data entry errors.
- Reduced processing time.
- Reduced material and transportation costs for manually exchanging documents.
- Reduced time spent manually seeking information.






#### New Electronic CISS Process




