

#### Criminal Justice Information System and State of CT Criminal Justice Agencies

This document is a formal response plan and policy for the daily operation of the CJIS Public Safety Liaisons (PSLs). The CJIS PSLs are ambassadors on behalf the CJIS Group to the rest of the State of CT Criminal Justice Agencies and Law Enforcement Agencies. This Response shall serve as the policy and best-practices for the CJIS PSL to continue to perform their business functions and minimize the risk of exposure to the potential pandemic threat, currently Corona Virus (COVID-19) for themselves, the people they interact with, the public and the business continuity of operations.

#### Background

The PSL are tasked with visiting LEA offices and Police Department facilities to bring the interaction for providing software demonstrations, training, new user onboarding, and paperwork completion. These activities potentially make the role of PSL more vulnerable and have a higher probability of interacting with the Corona (COVID-19). So by definition, the PSL are visiting many locations to introduce the Connecticut Information Sharing System (CISS) software product. By design this function requires the PSL to maximize the number of people they come in contact with and the number of sites they visit. These functions also make the PSL role more likely to be a carrier and become an agent of spreading the disease.

This response is aimed at reducing and minimizing the risks presented by COVID-19 by evaluating and modifying how current daily operations are conducted, both temporarily during the current pandemic response and also to include any best practices that should be incorporated as permanent changes.

#### Issue

Corona Virus spreads from person to person by being in close proximity to another person, The virus is able to survive in the air, therefore, the recommended separation of six (6) feet between another person is the recommended social distance that should be observed for short term interactions.

Statistically, many people should not gather in groups for long periods of time, especially indoors and other areas of low ventilation quality.




# **CISS Key Project Risks & Mitigation**

### Mitigation:


The Bond Commission has approved the \$8.9M request on 4/16/20. This risk will be closed when the funding is made available in the next several weeks.



#2 Stakeholder Support. Current CJIS Agency state budgets do not include funding for resources to implement the CISS.


#### Mitigation:

# #3 RMS Vendor Participation Does Not Provide 90% + of All Arrests to CISS Mitigation:

- Contract largest RMS vendors with CISS to get 90%+ arrest information in the state
- Support Law Enforcement Agencies (LEAs) to migrate to RMS vendors connected to CISS
- > CISS Connectivity as required Standards in CT Contracts and add in new legislation.
- Provide solution(s) for LEAs with non-CISS connected RMS





# #4 COVID-19 pandemic will cause delays and increase costs in the deployment of CISS Workflows and Search.

#### Mitigation:

- CJIS is working with each Stakeholder impacted by the COVID-19 to help with any CISS deployment work by offering resources that may be needed.
- ➤ We are also moving CISS scope from the future to the present that must be completed in order to successfully deploy CISS with the funding and schedule planned.





# **CJIS Operational Support**

### **COVID-19 Impact:**

- No major impact to CISS operational support
- The speed of the planned work is slower given new adjustments of teleworking by CJIS, DAS-BEST, Stakeholders and vendors

### **State Support Services:**

- Hire State Employee Positions
  - 1. ITA3 System Administrator
- Issues, Risks and Opportunities
  - Attracting qualified candidates (with durational positions, low starting salaries, etc.)
  - 2. Forty-hour week needed for non-managers
  - 3. "Talent Flight" CJIS IT Managers may move to other agencies for financial reasons
  - 4. CJIS planning right sizing "end state" for organization
  - 5. Fiscal administrator out on leave impacts procurements and payments
  - 6. Process to obtain approvals needed to complete hiring needs improvement

### **Vendor Support Services:**

- Maintenance and Support Vendor
  - 1. Services provided critical for technologies CJIS cannot support currently
