CISS UAT Pilot Status

- GA9 Pilot with Clinton PD successfully kicked off on August 27 with the following observations noted
 - Arrest and Summons Activity generated by Clinton PD lower than anticipated
 - Development time for arrest packages more than 24 hours
 - Additional workflow requirements were identified by Judicial and DCJ to smoothly transfer to the new automated process
 - Additional requirements were identified, developed, fully tested and pushed into pilot on 10/15 with positive results
- Middletown PD and Troop F added to GA9 Pilot to increase Arrest Volume to Pilot
 - Middletown PD Pseudo Production RMS Server and Network Connectivity activated on 10/8
 - PD training completed on 10/21
 - Troop F workflow connectivity and Pseudo Production Server activation scheduled to be completed by 11/30



Partner Agency Updates

JUDICIAL

Tech Team status (Required prior to Go Live):

- Bond Processing; FTA/VOP processing; Document Handling, DESPP requests are complete.
 User Acceptance Testing is in process for all functionality by the business.
- The Combo CR/MV Process; Arrest Deletion Process with CISS and the internal Judicial Audit requirements are being finalized in development.

Post Production Work

- Reconciliation Automation for the daily data transfer process
- CISS Replacement of the CRMVS Friday File processing including CIB Dispositions
- CISS Replacement of the DMV Extracts

Business Team Status

- Business process has been implemented at G.A. 9.
- G.A. 9 began accepting electronic Arrest Packets on August 30, 2021, from Clinton PD in the UAT testing environment.
- Electronic Arrest Packets include both UAR's and Summons and all applicable paperwork.
- Clerks processed 14 new arrests (5 UAR's, 5 Summons and 4 Arrest Packets were Rejected).
- October 28, 2021, Middletown PD will begin submitting Arrest Packets electronically to G.A. 9
- There has been positive feedback from the criminal clerks. They have found the electronic process easy to navigate.
- The Arrest Process has reduced keystrokes and has increased data entry accuracy.
- Full statewide training schedule will mirror the LEA training schedule.

DESPP Delivered a fully integrated, cloud based Fingerprint Identification and Criminal History Repository for the State of CT providing interoperability between all states and the FBI **Criminal Arrest Processing**

- 135 new IDEMIA Criminal Livescans installed at CT Law Enforcement Agencies
- 11,916 Criminal Arrest Submissions (Livescan & Hardcards) processed since production Go-live*
- 29 NexGen RMS devices interfaced and submitting to IDEMIA Criminal Livescans
- Central Square, TelePartners and Accucom RMS interfaces under development

CT Criminal History Request System (CCHRS) - Applicant Portal

- Support Name/DOB requests and Fingerprint supported requests from CT agencies and General **Public**
- 64 new IDEMIA Applicant Livescans submitting Criminal History Requests from CT Agencies
- 22,294 Applicant Fingerprint Requests, 20,509 Results Returned to Requester since production Go-live*
- Up to 80% of fingerprint based requests returned to requester within 24 hours of submission

Judicial/CISS Case Update and Disposition Erasure Exchanges

- Established web service data exchanges for Judicial Case Update, Disposition Erasure and coded tables from CISS
- 340,000 Case Update transactions and 40,000 Disposition Erasure transactions processed since Go-live




CISS Workflow Deployment – Update

EARLY ARREST NOTIFICATION (EAN) – RMS (Level 1)

- Dispositions are sending through CISS to DOC & DMV
- 16 PDs currently sending Early Arrests/28 PDs ready
- NexGen has tied EAN with LiveScan Interface (about 50 PDs)





- UAT Pilot Multi-Agency Testing Program with Production Data is currently running
 - Clinton & Middletown PD's Pseudo-Prod Servers are online
 - CT State Police participation in Pilot begins in November
- Court Clerks, Judicial, DCJ are evaluating electronic versions of arrests vs. the official paper copy

RMS VENDORS – Development and Programing Activities

- NexGen
 - Workflow Pilot Integration testing with full arrest packages in UAT (Level 2 Certification)
- Accucom
 - Programming Level 2 arrest package generation in RMS (SYSTEST) Target UAT Pilot 1/1/22
- Central Square
 - IMC RMS integration with CISS with Level 1 programming is progressing to target, EOY 2021.
 - Negotiating Contracts with Central Square's 2 other main RMS systems in CT







- NexGen, Accucom, IMC, RMS Vendors Target end date for full arrest package is March 2024
- Inform, ProSuite RMS Vendors Target start date is Q1 2022 to negotiate and execute agreement contract to build and deploy CISS API for workflows is Q4 2024
- CISS Search 2,215 users currently trained, expect to train remaining 10+K users by Q3 2023



#1 RMS Vendor Participation Does Not Provide 90% + of All Arrests to CISS Mitigation:


- Contract largest RMS vendors with CISS to get 90%+ arrest information in the state. NexGen, Accucom and now IMC started connectivity work as well. CJIS is negotiating with Central Square to connect two more RMS vendors Systems to CISS.
- > Support Law Enforcement Agencies (LEAs) to migrate to RMS vendors connected to CISS.
- > CISS Connectivity required to be Standard in CT Contracts and add in new legislation.
- Provide solution(s) for LEAs with non-CISS connected RMS.



#2 Stakeholder Support. Current CJIS Agency state budgets do not include funding for resources to implement the CISS.

Mitigation:

➤ Tiger Teams - CJIS will continue to provide technical and logistical resources support to Agencies for CISS integration with their systems and implementation state-wide.






CISS Key Project Risks & Mitigation

Mitigation:


- CJIS is working with each Stakeholder impacted by the COVID-19 to help with any CISS deployment work by offering resources that may be needed.
- ➤ We are also moving CISS scope from the future to the present that must be completed in order to successfully deploy CISS with the funding and schedule planned.



#4 SharePoint, Software AG, MultiVue and Other Key Applications in CISS need to be upgraded over the next 24 months or significant issues will occur.
