1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 PURPOSE

As a licensing agency, the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") complies with the National Environmental Policy Act ("NEPA") by requiring its licensees to review their proposed actions for environmental consequences. The FCC rules for implementing NEPA are found in Title 47 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Part 1, Subpart I, rule sections 1.1301 to 1.1319. If a licensee's proposed action falls within one of the categories of rule sections 1.1301 to 1.1319, the licensee is required to consider the potential environmental effects from its construction of antenna facilities or structures, and disclose those effects in an environmental assessment ("EA") that is filed with the Commission for review.

Additionally, Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 requires licensees to assess the effect of their proposed action on historic properties as outlined in regulations issued by the Advisory Council on Historic Properties at 36 CFR Part 800, as well as the Nationwide Programmatic Agreement ("NPA") for the Collocation of Wireless Antennas (47 CFR Part 1, See Attachments) and the NPA Regarding the Section 106 National Historic Preservation Act Review Process (47 CFR Part 1, See Attachments).

1.2 SCOPE OF WORK

At the request of ARX Wireless Infrastructure, LLC ("ARX Wireless"), All-Points Technology Corporation, P.C. ("APT") has completed its review of environmental resource information outlined in 47 CFR Part 1, Subpart I, rule sections 1.1301 to 1.1319. The review includes the evaluation of the wireless telecommunication facility project impacts to the FCC NEPA categories outlined in this report using the sources referenced herein. Impacts from radiofrequency radiation are evaluated by the tower owner and/or applicant and are not part of this scope of work.

If the project undertaking results in an adverse effect finding under any of the FCC NEPA categories reviewed, those effects must be disclosed in the form on an EA and filed with the FCC for further review of potential environmental impacts.

This NEPA report documents the reviews completed. The term "Site" will be used herein to reference the location of the proposed undertaking.

2.0 SITE LOCATION AND PROJECT DESCRIPTION

2.1 SITE LOCATION

The Site is located at 43 Osgood Avenue in New Britain, Connecticut, an approximately 2.62-acre parcel. It is developed with the former Israel Putnam Elementary School, which has been vacant for approximately 20 years. The surrounding area is mainly residential, and also contains the Sacred Heart Cemetery to the southwest and the Beth Alom Cemetery to the southeast.

A USGS Site Location Map is presented in the Attachments.

2.2 PROJECT DESCRIPTION - PROPOSED UNDERTAKING

ARX Wireless is proposing to construct a new communications facility. The proposed facility will include a ± 104 -foot tall monopole tower within a ± 75 -foot by ± 75 -foot area that includes a new ± 50 -foot by ± 50 -foot gravel based fenced equipment compound. An access drive and underground electrical and telephone service will extend from Beach Street. The new tower and equipment compound will allow for the future collocation of multiple service providers.

3.0 FCC NEPA REVIEW CATEGORIES

3.3 THREATENED OR ENDANGERED SPECIES OR DESIGNATED CRITICAL HABITATS

Will the facility affect listed or proposed threatened or endangered species or designated critical habitats? **No**

APT consulted with the United States Fish and Wildlife Service ("USFWS") and reviewed the Connecticut Department of Energy & Environmental Protection ("DEEP") Wildlife Division Natural Diversity Data Base ("NDDB") to determine if rare, threatened or endangered species or designated critical habitat may be present in the project area.

There are no known federally listed threatened species known to occur in the vicinity of the Subject Property.

No known areas of state-listed species are depicted on the DEEP NDDB maps within .25 mile of the Site. Therefore, consultation with the DEEP is not required.

Based on the information provided, the proposed undertaking is not likely to adversely affect any potential threatened or endangered species or designated critical habitats.

3.4 ARCHAEOLOGICAL AND HISTORIC RESOURCES

In a letter dated November 24, 2020, the SHPO determined that the proposed undertaking will have <u>no adverse effects</u> to sites listed on or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places, with the following conditions:

- The antennae, wires, mounts, and associated equipment will be designed, painted to match adjacent materials, and installed to be as non-visible as possible, and
- 2. if not in use for six consecutive months, the antennae, mounts, and equipment shall be removed by the telecommunications facility owner. This removal shall occur within 90 days of the end of such six-month period.






Proposed Monopole

Determination of Effects for the Upgrade of Communications Facility at 43 Osgood Avenue, New Britain, Hartford County, Connecticut:

In accordance with the Federal Communication Commission (FCC) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) rules and Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA), the above-referenced telecommunications project, proposed by ARX Wireless (ARX), is being evaluated for its potential effects to districts, sites, buildings, structures, or objects significant in American history, architecture, archeology, engineering, or culture that are listed, or potentially eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP).

In accordance with the Nationwide Agreement, please find the attached Submission Packet, FCC Form 620, which presents the details on the proposed project as well as efforts that have been taken to identify, assess, and make determination of effect on the impacts of the proposed project on Historic Properties. The proposed Facility is situated on a developed parcel located at 43 Osgood Avenue in New Britain, Connecticut that is linked to Farmington Avenue. The proposed Facility will be located inside the courtyard of the former Israel Putnam Elementary School Building, which has been vacant for approximately 20 years. The surrounding area is mainly residential, but also contains the Sacred Heart Cemetery to the southwest, as well as the Beth Alom Cemetery to the southeast. The Holy Cross Church (1936) is located to the south of the project area at 31 Biruta Street. A review of historic maps depicting the proposed project area show that the road network in the region was well developed by the mid to late nineteenth century. Both the 1851 and 1855 maps of the region containing the proposed Facility depict the project parcel as a vacant area. It is likely that this area was used for agricultural purposes during the historical era.

A review of the earliest available aerial image for this area, which dates from 1934, confirms the interpretation of the historic maps. This image shows that the project area was used for residential and sporadic agricultural purposes during the early twentieth century. This is made evident by the indicated farming parcels to the northwest and south of the proposed cellular facility. The Israel Putnam Elementary School appears on the 1934 aerial image. The subsequent aerial image, which was captured in 1951, shows a similar situation, with distinct farming parcels nearby; however, it appears that farming had been recently abandoned in the area, as evidence of moderate reforestation that appeared in the immediate vicinity of the project area. An ell addition to the Israel Putnam Elementary School is also first observed on the 1951 aerial.

ARX Wireless is proposing to construct a new communications facility at 43 Osgood Avenue in New Britain, CT. The proposed facility will include a ± 104 -foot tall monopole tower within a ± 75 -foot by ± 75 -foot area that includes a new ±50-foot by ±50-foot gravel based fenced equipment compound. The new tower and equipment compound will allow for the future collocation of multiple service providers. As ground level disturbance is required; a Phase 1 Archaeological Assessment is included as part of this submission.

No Historic Properties¹ previously listed or formally deemed eligible for the National Register of Historic Places were identified within the APE for Direct Effects. Please note that a Preliminary Archaeological Assessment prepared by Mr. David George of Heritage Consultants, LLC is included as part of this submission.

File reviews of the National Register Database, Connecticut State Historic Register, and Connecticut State Historic Resource Inventory were conducted by Stacey Vairo, Architectural Historian and Mr. William Keegan, Historical Geographer & GIS Specialist, with Heritage Consultants, LLC, to identify Historic Properties within the 0.50-mile Area for Potential Effect (APE) for Visual and Direct Effects. There are no Historic Properties² found within the APE for Visual Effects.

In addition, per request of Connecticut's State Historic Preservation Office, a good-faith effort has been made on the part of the investigator to identify any undocumented resources that might be considered Historic Properties. Additional properties include the Beth Alom Cemetery, at 48 Allen Street, the residential neighborhoods containing a single and multi-family housing dating from the late 19th and early 20th centuries. It also includes the neo-Gothic style Holy Cross Church (1936) at 31 Biruta Street, which was designed by architect Anthony J. DePace of New York in 1936. It serves the Polish Catholic community in this area of New Britain. Despite the presence of these resources it is the opinion of Heritage Consultants that the proposed installation will have no effect on the characteristics that make them eligible for inclusion in the National Register.



Figure 1. Photographic Site Plan






Figure 1. Excerpt from a USGS 7.5' series topographic quadrangle image showing the location of the proposed telecommunications facility in New Britain, Connecticut.

Heritage Consultants, LLC (Heritage), is pleased to have this opportunity to provide All-Points Technology Corporation (All-Points) with the following preliminary archaeological assessment of a proposed telecommunications facility (the proposed Facility) located at 43 Osgood Avenue in New Britain, Connecticut (Figure 1). The current project entailed completion of a cultural resources summary based on the examination of data obtained from the Connecticut State Historic Preservation Office (CT-SHPO), as well as GIS data, including historical mapping, aerial photographs, and topographic quadrangles, maintained by Heritage. This investigation is based upon project location information provided to Heritage by All-Points. The objectives of this study were to gather and present data regarding previously identified cultural resources situated within 1.6 km (1 mi) of the proposed project area and to investigate the proposed project area in terms of its natural and historical characteristics so that the need for completing additional cultural resources investigations could be evaluated.




Figure 2. Excerpt from an 1851 historic map showing the location of the proposed telecommunications facility in New Britain, Connecticut.




Figure 3. Excerpt from an 1855 historic map showing the location of the proposed telecommunications facility in New Britain, Connecticut.

The proposed Facility is situated on a developed parcel located at 43 Osgood Avenue in New Britain, Connecticut that is linked to Farmington Avenue (Figure 1). The proposed Facility will be located inside the courtyard of the former Israel Putnam Elementary School Building, which has been vacant for approximately 20 years. The surrounding area is mainly residential, but also contains the Sacred Heart Cemetery to the southwest, as well as the Beth Alom Cemetery to the southeast. The Holy Cross Church is located to the south of the project aera. A review of historic maps depicting the proposed project area show that the road network in the region was well developed by the mid to late nineteenth century (Figures 2 and 3). and 7, show the project location in its essentially modern state. The immediate vicinity of the tower location over the last 20 years or so has been integrated into a vital commercial and residential zone within the town of New Britain.




Figure 8. Digital map showing the location of previously identified archaeological sites in the vicinity of the proposed telecommunications facility in New Britain, Connecticut.




Figure 9. Digital map depicting the locations of previously identified National Register of Historic Places properties in the vicinity of the proposed telecommunications facility in New Britain, Connecticut.

Background research for the current project also included a review of previously identified archaeological sites and National Register of Historic Places properties/districts sites within 1.6 km (1 mi) of the proposed Facility (Figures 8 and 9). This review revealed that while there are no known archaeological sites near the proposed project area, there is one National Register of Historic Places properties that has been identified within 1.6 km (1 mi) of the project location. This property is known as the Washington School. This facility was built in 1922 at the corner of High and Carmody Streets in New Britain, which are located at the eastern end of Washington Park. The three-story, flat-roofed school has walls made of red brick laid in a Flemish bond pattern. Its cast-concrete details are, for the most part, Gothic-inspired. The school building retains a high degree of architectural integrity, and alterations to its historical fabric are limited to the auditorium's balcony and new aluminum rails bolted to the cast-iron staircase balusters; however, these additions have not caused displacement of original material. Washington School is significant because it embodies the distinctive characteristics of school architecture from the first quarter of the twentieth century (Criterion C). It is also significant as the work of a prominent Connecticut architect, Delbert K. Perry, an important figure both in his profession and in school design. The Washington School building also holds significance in the history of New Britain (Criterion A). Due to its distance from the project area, the school will not be impacted by the Facility.




Figure 10. Digital map depicting the soil types present in the vicinity of proposed telecommunications facility in New Britain, Connecticut.

In addition, soils located within the project area were examined as part of this review. They belong to the Wethersfield-Urban Land series. The Wethersfield series consists of very deep, well drained loamy soils formed in dense glacial till on uplands. The soils are moderately deep to dense basal till. They are nearly level to steep soils on till plains, low ridges, and drumlins. The Urban Land series consists of the original soil covered by impervious surfaces such as asphalt, concrete, and buildings. In most places, the underlying soil has been cut away or covered by fill from surrounding areas (Figure 10). A typical profile for Wethersfield-Urban Land Soils is as follows: A-- 3 to 8 cm; dark brown (7.5YR 3/2) loam; moderate medium granular structure; friable; many fine and medium roots; 10 percent gravel; strongly acid; clear wavy boundary; Bw1--8 to 22 cm; reddish brown (5YR 4/4) loam; weak medium subangular blocky structure; friable; common fine and medium roots; 10 percent gravel; strongly acid; clear wavy boundary; Bw2--22 to 69 cm; dark reddish brown (5YR 3/3) gravelly loam; weak medium subangular blocky structure; friable; few medium roots; 15 percent gravel and cobbles; strongly acid; clear wavy boundary; and Cd--69 to 165 cm; reddish brown (2.5YR 4/4) gravelly loam; weak thick platy structure; very firm, brittle; few silt films and black coatings on some plates; 20 percent gravel and cobbles; strongly acid.

A pedestrian survey of the project area, which was completed on September 18, 2020, included a walk-down and photo documentation of the lease area and proposed tower location (Photos 1 through 11). The photos shown below support the analysis of the aerial images described above; the area has been severely impacted by modern development. Based on the current condition of the project area, as well as the historic changes to the region noted above, it is the professional opinion of Heritage Consultants, LLC that the proposed project area possesses a low/no probability to contain archaeological resources due to the gradual development of the area beginning in the nineteenth century and continuing through the twentieth century. Thus, no additional archaeological examination of this area is recommended prior to construction. If you have any questions regarding this Technical Memorandum, or if we may be

The State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) has reviewed the cultural resource reconnaissance survey prepared by Heritage Consultants, LLC (Heritage), dated September 22, 2020, as part of the larger submittal for a proposed telecommunications facility. The proposed activities are subject to review by this office pursuant to the National Historic Preservation Act and in accordance with Federal Communications Commission regulations. SHPO understands that the proposed undertaking includes the installation of a 104 foot tall monopole within a 50 foot by 50 foot chain-link equipment compound, located in the northcentral portion of the Subject Property. Future telecommunications arrays are proposed to be installed on the monopole at intervals of 76 feet above ground level (AGL), 88 feet AGL, and 100 feet AGL, respectively. Access is to be through a new approximately 12 foot wide access road, originating from Beach Street.

No previously identified archaeological sites are located within 1 mile of the project area. One resource listed in the National Register of Historic Places (NR), the Washington School (NR# 84001053) is located within 1 mile of the project area. However, distance and intervening modern development will prevent the installation from being visible from this resource. Two resources located within the Area of Potential Effect – Visual Effects (APE-VE), Beth Alom Cemetery at 48 Allen Street and Holy Cross Church (1936) at 31 Biruta Street, are potentially eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places. However, the proposed installation will not impact either property so as to make it ineligible for listing. The Subject Property itself, known as the Israel Putnam Elementary School, does not appear eligible for listing on the National Register.



The preliminary archaeological assessment consisted of a pedestrian survey of areas that would be subject to ground disturbing impacts as part of the proposed undertaking. No cultural material from either historic or prehistoric periods were observed, and it was determined that the area had been substantially disturbed in the past. Soil profiles within the project are characterized as Urban Land, likely impacted during historic period development. A review of historic maps and aerials indicate the property was improved with the Israel Putnam Elementary school by 1934, with a large addition being constructed by 1951. Therefore, the project area possesses a low potential to contain intact archaeological deposits.

Based on the information provided to our office, SHPO concurs with the findings of the cultural resources survey that additional archaeological investigations are not warranted, and the proposed undertaking will have <u>no adverse effects</u> to sites listed on or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places, with the following conditions:

- 1. The antennae, wires, mounts, and associated equipment will be designed, painted to match adjacent materials, and installed to be as non-visible as possible, and
- 2. if not in use for six consecutive months, the antennae, mounts, and equipment shall be removed by the telecommunications facility owner. This removal shall occur within 90 days of the end of such six-month period.



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
