MR. EDELSON: Good evening, ladies and gentlemen. This remote public hearing is called to order this Thursday, August 19, 2021, at 6:30 p.m. My name is Ed Edelson, member and presiding officer of the Connecticut Siting Council. Other members of the Council are Robert Hannon, designee for Commissioner Katie Dykes of the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection; Quat Nguyen, designee for Commissioner Marissa Paslick Gillett of the Public Utilities Regulatory Authority; Robert Silvestri; Louanne Cooley; and I don't believe Mr. Lynch was able to join us tonight.

Members of the staff are Melanie Bachman, executive director and staff attorney; Ifeanyi Nwankwo, siting analyst; and Lisa Fontaine -- somebody seems to not be on mute, if you could check yourself -- okay, Lisa Fontaine, fiscal administrative officer.

Please note there is currently a statewide effort to prevent the spread of the Coronavirus. This is why the Council is holding this first ever remote public hearing, and we ask for your patience. If you haven't done so already, I ask that everyone please mute their computer audio and/or telephone now.

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This is a continuation of a remote public hearing that began at 2 p.m. this afternoon. A copy of the prepared agenda is available on the Council's Docket No. 504 webpage, along with the record of this matter, the public hearing notice, instructions for public access to the remote public hearing, and the Council's Citizens Guide to Siting Council Procedures.

This hearing is held pursuant to the provisions of Title 16 of the Connecticut General Statutes and of the Uniform Administrative Procedure Act upon an application from Arx Wireless Infrastructure, LLC for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need for the construction, maintenance, and operation of a telecommunications facility located at Lot N-4, Sequin Drive, Glastonbury, Connecticut. The application was received by the Council on June 4, 2021.

This application is governed by the Telecommunications Act of 1996, which is administered by the Federal Communications Commission. This act prohibits this Council from considering the health effects of radio frequency emissions on human health and wildlife to the

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extent the emissions from towers are within the federal acceptable safe limits standard, which standard is also followed by the state Department of Public Health. The Federal Act also prohibits this Council from discriminating between and amongst providers of functionally equivalent services. This means that if one carrier already provides service for an area, other carriers have a right to compete and provide service for the same area.

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The Council's legal notice of the date and time of this remote public hearing was published in The Glastonbury Citizen on July 22, 2021. Upon this Council's request, the applicant erected a sign along Sequin Drive at the entrance of the proposed site so as to inform the public of the name of the applicant, the type of facility, the remote public hearing date, and contact information for the Council, including website and phone number.

This remote public comment session is reserved for the public to make brief statements into the record. These public statements are not subject to questions from the parties or the Council, and members of the public making

statements may not ask questions of the parties or the Council. These statements will become part of the record for the Council's consideration. Please be advised that written comments may be submitted by any person within 30 days of this public hearing.

As a reminder to all, off-the-record communication with a member of the Council or a member of the Council staff upon the merits of this application is prohibited by law.

I wish to note that parties and intervenors, including their representatives, witnesses and members, are not allowed to participate in the public comment session.

I also wish to note for those who are listening, and for the benefit of your friends and neighbors who are unable to join us for the remote public comment session, that you or they may send written comments to the Council within 30 days of the date hereof, by mail or by email, and such written statements will be given the same weight as if spoken at the remote public comment session. Please be advised that any person may be removed from the Zoom remote public comment session at the discretion of the Council.

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We ask each person making a public statement in this proceeding to confine his or her statements to the subject matter before the Council and to avoid unreasonable repetition so that we may hear all of the concerns you and your neighbors have. Please be advised that the Council cannot answer questions from the public about the proposal.

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A verbatim transcript of this remote public hearing will be posted on the Council's Docket No. 504 webpage and deposited at the Glastonbury Town Clerk's Office for the convenience of the public.

Please be advised that the Council's project evaluation criteria under the statute does not include consideration of property values.

Before I call on members of the public to make statements, I request the applicant to make a very brief presentation to the public describing the proposed facility. And I believe that will be done by Mr. Coppins and Mr. Roberts, and the floor is yours.

<sup>23</sup> MR. ROBERTS: Thank you. I guess if we <sup>24</sup> can go to the -- thank you very much. This is our <sup>25</sup> project located on Sequin Drive. You can probably

jump to the next sheet, C-1, would be the best.

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Our site itself is located on this 11 acre parcel. Access is off Sequin Drive. Our utilities, both natural gas, electric and fiber, will be brought in from that location. Our access road is approximately 250 feet long. We are developing a 50 by 50 compound, fenced compound for the carriers to locate within. And we also have a 115 foot monopole in that compound.

If we can jump to C-2, please. We have AT&T as the first one on the site, and they're shown on the top of the monopole. And we're showing their equipment shelter as well as their back-up generator. You can see we have a turn-around as well as utilities at the base of the tower. And that's pretty much the site. Thank you.

MR. EDELSON: That completes your presentation, correct?

MR. ROBERTS: Yes. Thank you.

MR. EDELSON: I just want to be sure.
Just a note on remote public hearings. Remote
public hearings are quite different from in-person
public hearings. For in-person public hearings
members of the public could sign in, step up to

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the podium and offer their comments. For remote public hearings the public is required to sign up to speak in advance in order to provide Council staff with the time necessary to facilitate connection precautions to prevent interruption, or in common terms bombings of the proceedings. There are protocols, procedures and consistency measures that are followed as part of the remote public hearing process. Again, written comments may be submitted within 30 days of the public hearing.

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And we have our first person who has asked to speak. Okay, I just want to make sure he's there. So I'm going to call on Mr. Ranelli to make a public statement on behalf of the town. Mr. Ranelli.

17 MR. RANELLI: Yes. Good evening, Mr. 18 Edelson and members of the Council. I'm Matt 19 Ranelli from the law firm of Shipman & Goodwin, 20 and we represent the Town of Glastonbury. I know 21 I have three minutes, but I want to use the first 22 part just to say thank you to the Council and the 23 staff for accommodating us to speak at the public 24 portion this evening. We appreciate this 25 opportunity. And then I'll just try to be as

direct as possible to stay within the time limits.

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The town, you know, reluctantly opposes this application because the town prefers another site, 311 Oakwood Drive, for which it is actively preparing an application. We believe that the Oakwood Drive site and the application that is being prepared for a 156 foot, approximately 156 foot tower would be better suited to serve this area not only for the primary tenant but for co-location purposes for tenants further down the tower.

12 And we also think that some of the information that is in response to the 13 14 interrogatories and that was presented at the 15 evidentiary hearing may understate the coverages 16 that are available from that location because of 17 assumptions that were made. Not that there was 18 anything nefarious, I'm not saying that, but I'll 19 explain. It appears the response to Interrogatory 20 15 and the propagation study that was done by 21 AT&T, in their words, used a similar tower, and it 22 was confirmed to us, to the town, that it was a 23 111 foot tower. So it did not do a propagation 24 study at the tower that's being prepared for a 25 proposal at 156 feet, which we think will enhance

the coverage provided by that tower not only for the main tenant, but as you go down, the proposed tower at Sequin Drive at 111 feet and 12 foot intervals would have the second, third and fourth position at 99, 87 and 75 feet may not be attractive, so we may end up having more poles than needed and that's something the town would like to avoid. In addition, the town is going to house its emergency communication antennas on top of this tower at Oakwood Drive, so that is also attractive to us given that we own, the town owns the site.

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As you heard, the site was the subject 13 14 of an RFP. It is within the search radius, the 15 quarter mile of ARX. The town has to follow an 16 RFP process. It may not be as swift as working 17 with a private landowner, but we don't feel the 18 town should be excluded or penalized for following 19 sort of good government practice, and we ask 20 respectfully that the commission or the Council 21 either deny this application without prejudice or 22 at a minimum ask that the applicant and its tenant 23 provide the RF study. They indicated that it had 24 been done and was complete so that won't require 25 any additional work, and it will clarify whether

it was done at 151 feet or at 111 feet. I know I've run out of time, and I don't want to impose, so I will stop there.

(Pause.)

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MR. EDELSON: Sorry about that. We were just having a little unmuting and muting problem. But thank you for your statement, Mr. Ranelli. And it's good to be back with my voice. Thank you.

At this point there are no other people who've signed up to make a comment, so let me make the following notes before we close. Before closing the evidentiary record of this matter, the Connecticut Siting Council announces that briefs and proposed findings of fact may be filed with the Council by any party or intervenor no later than September 18, 2021. The submission of briefs or proposed findings of fact are not required by this Council, rather, we leave it to the choice of the parties and the intervenors.

Anyone who has not become a party or intervenor but who desires to make his or her views known to the Council may file written statements with the Council within 30 days of the date hereof. The Council will issue draft

findings of fact, and thereafter parties and intervenors may identify errors or inconsistencies between the Council's draft findings of fact and However, no new information, no new the record. evidence, no argument and no reply briefs, without our permission, will be considered by the Council. Copies of the transcript of this hearing will be filed at the Glastonbury Town Clerk's Office. I hereby declare this hearing Thank you for your participation. And adjourned. I hope everybody has a good evening. Thank you. (Whereupon, the public comment session concluded at 6:44 p.m.)
