As a mitigation effort to offset adverse visual impacts to resources resulting from the above-mentioned Project, The United Illuminating Company (UI) will complete historical research and fieldwork associated with the Milford Cemetery. UI coordinated with the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) to establish appropriate mitigation efforts, and in a letter dated January 17, 2023, SHPO states, "The proposed mitigation, which includes historical research and fieldwork to document and record gravemarkers within the Milford Cemetery and make said research available to the public, would constitute adequate mitigation, and would resolve the adverse, indirect impact." The January 17, 2023 SHPO correspondence is attached to this letter for reference.

On August 17, 2023, UI's consultant, Heritage Consultants, coordinated with SHPO, receiving the agency's concurrence that it was appropriate to commence the proposed mitigation efforts.

The State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) has reviewed the alternative mitigation proposal by Heritage Consultants, LLC (Heritage), dated September 22, 2022, following a meeting between this Office, United Illuminating, and the City of Milford on July 15, 2022 to discuss alternative mitigation for the anticipated adverse impact to historic properties, as a result of the above mentioned action. As you are aware, the proposed project includes the rebuilding of two single-circuit 115-kilovolt (kV) overhead lines along the Connecticut Department of Transportation (CT DOT) corridor between the Milvon and West River substations, within the municipalities of Milford, Orange, West Haven, and New Haven, specifically moving utility lines from existing catenary structures, to new, freestanding structures. The proposed activities are under the jurisdiction of the Connecticut Siting Council and are subject to review by this office pursuant to the Connecticut Environmental Policy Act (CEPA).

As previously stated, the proposed action will visually <u>adversely impact</u> resources within the area of potential affect, an indirect effect. The proposed mitigation, which includes historical research and fieldwork to document and record gravemarkers within the Milford Cemetery and make said research available to the public, would constitute adequate mitigation, and would resolve the adverse, indirect impact. SHPO requests that this mitigation be a requirement of project approval, and be codified in an agreement document.

SHPO appreciates the cooperation of all interested parties in the professional management of Connecticut's cultural resources. These comments are provided in accordance with the Connecticut Environmental Policy Act.
