Dear Ms. Bachman:

The Council on Environmental Quality ("Council") offers the following supplemental comments regarding Docket 509.

The Council has reviewed the application materials, the responses to interrogatories, and the hearing transcripts and notes that a decision on the need to use blasting to remove/alter rock material on the proposed site has not yet been determined, but is a possibility. Consequently, if blasting is required, the Council recommends the following:

- 1) the Applicant should undertake a pre- and post-blasting survey and water testing to ensure that nearby wells are not affected; and
- 2) the bedrock should be tested to determine if it has the potential to cause acid drainage if left uncovered, which could impact water resources in the area. If so, the Council recommends that the blasted rock be covered to keep it from reacting with the air.

The Council also wishes to highlight the letter from the Aquarion Water Company dated May 19, 2022 and the letter from the Connecticut Department of Public Health Drinking Water Section dated June 1, 2022 regarding protection measures for the Laurel Reservoir. The Council recommends that the Applicant ensure that there would be no adverse impacts to water quality of the nearby wetlands and reservoir resulting from erosion and sedimentation, acid drainage, or other pollutants associated with the proposed project. Lastly, the Council again recommends that the Applicant ensure for the proposed access road and tower compound.

The Council's comments above address only certain elements of the materials provided by the Applicant and Parties and Intervenors at this time. Additional information can become evident during the Siting Council's administrative hearing process.

Thank you for your consideration of the Council's supplemental comments.
