This hearing is called to order this 5 Thursday, June 29, 2023, at 6:30 p.m. б My name is John Morissette, member and 7 presiding officer of the Connecticut Siting 8 Council. Other members of the Council are Brian 9 Golembiewski, designee for Commissioner Katie 10 Dykes of the Department of Energy and 11 Environmental Protection; Quat Nguyen, designee 12 for Chairman Marissa Paslick Gillett of the Public 13 Utilities Regulatory Authority; and we have Robert 14 Silvestri. 15 Members of the staff are Melanie Bachman, 16 Executive Director and Staff Attorney; Ifeanyi 17 Nwankwo, siting analyst; and Lisa Fontaine, fiscal administrative officer. 18 19 If you haven't done so already, I ask that 20 everyone please mute their computer audio and/or

telephones now.

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22 This is a continuation of the remote public 23 hearing that began at 2 p.m. this afternoon. Α 24 copy of the prepared agenda is available on the Council's Docket Number 515 webpage along with a

record of this matter, the public hearing notice, instructions for public access to this remote public hearing, and the Council's Citizen's Guide to Siting Council Procedures.

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This hearing is held pursuant to the provisions of Title 16 of the Connecticut General Statutes and of the Uniform Administrative Procedure Act upon an application from Cellco Partnership, d/b/a Verizon Wireless, for a certificate of environmental compatibility and public need for the construction, maintenance, and operation of a telecommunications facility located east of the student transportation parking lot at 180 School Road in Wilton, Connecticut. The application was received by the Council on March 17, 2023.

This application is governed by the Telecommunications Act of 1996, which is administered by the Federal Communications Commission. This act prohibits this Council from considering the health effects of radiofrequency emissions on the human health and wildlife to the extent the emissions from the towers are within the federal acceptable safe limits standards, which standard is also followed by the State

Department of Public Health.

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The Federal Act also prohibits this Council from discriminating between and amongst providers of functionally equivalent services. This means that if one carrier already provides a service in an area, other carriers have the right to compete and provide service in the same area.

The Council's legal notice of the date and time of this remote public hearing was published in the Wilton Bulletin on April 20, 2023.

Upon this Council's request, the Applicant erected a sign in the vicinity of the proposed site so as to inform the public of the name of the Applicant, the type of the facility, the remote public hearing date, and contact information for the Council, including the website and phone number.

Please be advised that the Council's project evaluation criteria under the statute does not include the consideration of property values.

As a reminder to all, off-the-record communications with a member of the Council or a member of the Council's staff upon the merits of this application is prohibited by law.

This remote public comment session is

reserved for members of the public who signed up in advance to make brief public statements. These limited appearance statements are not subject to questions from the parties or the Council, and members of the public making statements may not ask questions of the parties or the Council.

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In accordance with the public hearing notice, and in fairness to everyone who has signed up to speak, these public statements will be limited to three minutes. Please be advised that written comments may be submitted by any person within 30 days of this public hearing.

I wish to note that parties and interveners, including their representatives, witnesses, and members are not allowed to participate in the public comment session. I also wish to note for those who are listening and for the benefit of your friends and neighbors who are unable to join us for the remote public comment session, that you or they may send written statements to the Council within 30 days of the date hereof by mail or by e-mail.

Please be advised that any person may be removed from the public comment session at the discretion of the Council. We ask that each

person making a limited appearance statement in this proceeding to confine his or her statements to the subject matter before the Council, and to avoid unreasonable repetition so that we may hear all the concerns you and your neighbors may have. Please be advised that the Council cannot answer questions from the public about the proposal.

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A verbatim transcript will be made of this hearing and will be deposited in the Wilton Town Clerk's office for the convenience of the public.

At this time, I request the applicant to make a very brief presentation to the public describing the proposed facility. Attorney Baldwin? MR. BALDWIN: Thank you, Mr. Morissette.

Good evening, everyone. Again, my name is Ken Baldwin. I'm a lawyer at Robinson & Cole, and I represent Cellco Partnership doing business as Verizon Wireless in its proposal to establish a new telecommunications facility in the northwest portion of a 109-acre parcel known as 180 School Road.

Verizon intends to install a
telecommunications facility on this parcel and
provide service that is needed along portions of
Routes 7, 33, and 106 in the town of Wilton, as

well as the surrounding areas, residential and commercial and area roadways.

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In addition to the coverage benefits, as testified to this afternoon during the evidentiary session, the site would also provide some capacity relief to several of Verizon's surrounding sites that are currently exhausting in certain antenna sectors.

Verizon has worked very closely with the Town of Wilton through an RFP process to establish a telecommunications facility at the school bus parking lot across the street from the Middlebrook School.

As shown on the map here, Plan L-2, the facility would be located in the southeasterly corner of the school bus parking lot adjacent to the lot. Verizon would be using two parking spaces to access its facility and replacing those two parking spaces down in the southwest corner of the parking lot.

The facility itself -- if we could go to the next slide? The facility itself would consist of a 60-foot by 60-foot fenced compound area. The tower would be located in the westerly portion, as shown on this plan.

Verizon would install an equipment pad in the easterly corner, which would be occupied by an equipment cabinet, a battery cabinet and a backup generator, which would provide power to the facility if commercial power is otherwise interrupted. It's a propane fuel generator, so in the southwesterly corner of the compound there is a 1,000-gallon propane tank that would also be installed on a concrete pad.

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10 If we could go to the next slide, please? 11 The tower itself, at the request of the Town 12 and several of the neighbors that we communicated 13 with during the public input process, will be a 14 123-foot monopine tower, a tower disguised as a 15 pine tree. The top branches for the tree will 16 extend to an overall height of 128 feet, and as 17 discussed this afternoon, the benefits on the 18 visual impact of installing a tree tower here were 19 fairly substantial, and discussed at this 20 afternoon's session.

Thank you, Mr. Morissette.
THE HEARING OFFICER: Thank you, Attorney Baldwin.
We will now call on First Selectwoman
Vanderslice to make a public statement, followed
by Anne McCarty.

First Selectwoman Vanderslice, please?
FIRST SELECTWOMAN VANDERSLICE: Thank you. Good
evening, Presiding Officer Morissette and members
of the Council.

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As noted, I am Lynn Vanderslice, the elected First Selectwoman of the Town of Wilton. Thank you for this opportunity to provide comments on behalf of Wilton residents and businesses. We support the application that is before you.

The Wilton Board of Selectmen determined there were significant deficiencies with cell service in the area of the proposed tower. We came to this determination based on resident complaints and comments, town and school employee comments, a resident survey, and our collective experiences in the area. We decided we needed to address the deficiencies.

The area includes residential and commercial properties and critical town buildings and facilities, including three of our four public schools, our community and senior center, a large number of sports playing fields, the site of our summer camp and other recreational programs, and a park with a swimming pond. The area also includes Wilton Center, the Wilton Y, and the popular

Norwalk River Valley Trail.

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We chose the bus barn location as we believed it best addressed the needs of the community and those traveling through Wilton. We also believed it had minimal visual impact and disruption to the neighbors.

We fully support the request for a monopine. We consider the Town's ability to use the tower as an enhancement to our public safety capabilities and we appreciate Verizon's collaborative and transparent approach in addressing both Town and neighbor needs and requests.

Again, on behalf of the Town, I thank you for your thoughtful consideration of this application and hope you will view it favorably. Thank you. THE HEARING OFFICER: Thank you, First Selectman Vanderslice.

Thank you for coming out this evening.

We'll now call upon Anne McCarty, followed by
Richard McCarty. Anne McCarty, please?
RICHARD McCARTY: This is Richard McCarty. My wife is
not home from work at the moment -- so if she gets
home in time, I would defer to her return.
THE HEARING OFFICER: Very good. Please continue.
RICHARD McCARTY: Okay. Thank you. I am Richard

McCarty. I live at 11 Cider Mill Place in the town of Wilton.

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And first I'd like to recognize Brian Gaudet at Verizon and the Applicant for his wonderful cooperation and communication during his visits to the house during the phase of evaluating exposure and visual impacts of the tower. He was outstanding in his approach to the neighbors.

Three brief points, if I may? I live on Cider Mill Place, so I would have to point out that I think Mr. Baldwin's slide this evening did not adequately or correctly indicate the location of Cider Mill Place.

Cider Mill Place is not directly across the street from the Applicant's parcel. It is a little further down the street, and that is why I'm perhaps a seasonal viewer of the tower.

But also, the discussion this afternoon about alternative site one versus alternative site two, I did not attend the first discussions on alternative site one because I did not have an impact on it. The move to alternative site two has an impact, so that's why I'm testifying. And while I have an informed opinion about why the second site was chosen, it would be triple hearsay

for me to testify to that today.

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In response to a question this afternoon about the availability of natural gas, I know that the school across the street, Middlebrook School which is across the street from the proposed site, is in fact heated by natural gas. Natural gas was moved up to School Road several years ago, and it is used to heat the school's facilities, the town facilities along School Road, including the Senior Center, and the other schools that the Honorable Selectman talked about.

I think we all know the dangers of a thousand-pound container of propane, and I would suggest that the Siting Council take appropriate action to ask Verizon to amend its application to eliminate the thousand-pound propane tank and to replace it with a connection to the reasonably available natural gas location.

Third, there was some discussion also this afternoon about the wetlands and drainage off the school parking lot. Early in January of this year there was a fire department incident at that property involving volatile organic compounds. I was assured my interest in that is that the town enjoys the benefits of a drainage easement across

1 my property. 2 And so I'm pretty familiar with the drainage 3 across School Road, across the ball --4 THE HEARING OFFICER: I'm sorry, Mr. McCarty. Your 5 time has expired. Is your wife available? 6 Is Ann McCarty available? 7 RICHARD McCARTY: No, she's not available. 8 THE HEARING OFFICER: Okay. We'll come back if she's 9 available before we end this evening. We'll give 10 it another shot. 11 We'll now call upon Craig Kelly. Mr. Kelly? 12 Mr. Kelly, are you available? 13 14 (No response.) 15 16 THE HEARING OFFICER: It doesn't look like Mr. Kelly is 17 here. 18 Mr. McCarty, is Ann McCarty available? 19 RICHARD McCARTY: I just heard some noise in the 20 kitchen. Let me go check -- if you can indulge me 21 for at least one moment? 22 THE HEARING OFFICER: Absolutely. Thank you. 23 24 (Pause.) 25

1	RICHARD McCARTY: Thank you. It wasn't her. I think
2	her only comment would have been to leave the
3	record open for 90 days and not 30 days.
4	Thank you.
5	THE HEARING OFFICER: Thank you.
6	Mr. McCarty, you didn't quite finish your
7	third point. Please go ahead and finish what you
8	were saying.
9	RICHARD McCARTY: Oh, thank you. My third point with
10	regard to volatile organic compounds.
11	While I was assured by the Town that it was a
12	one-incident, the presence of volatile organic
13	compounds at that site now I would suggest that
14	it may be appropriate for the Town to remediate
15	the drainage issues off the bus barn property
16	prior to the approval of this application, and
17	consistent with everyone's goals with regard to
18	ESG and the environment.
19	So I would ask that the Siting Council take
20	appropriate action with regard to potential
21	environmental issues presented by the addition of
22	the tower site.
23	Thank you, Mr. Morissette, and thank you to
24	the Siting Council.

1	for coming out this evening.
2	I'll ask for Craig Kelly one more time.
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4	(No response.)
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6	THE HEARING OFFICER: Okay. I don't see Mr. Kelly on

19	He appears to be muted.
20	A VOICE: Yeah, he's having a hard time unmuting.
21	CRAIG KELLY: Hello? You can hear me now?
22	THE HEARING OFFICER: Yes, we can hear you. Thank you.
23	CRAIG KELLY: I just pressed star six. I didn't know
24	that was the combination.
25	Good afternoon, everyone.

THE HEARING OFFICER: Good evening. Please continue. CRAIG KELLY: Yes -- no, because I work at a bus company. So you know, I was wondering what would be the effect of us being there on a daily basis? You know, because we're probably there the most hours out of anybody who would be affected by the tower, per se.

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You have some drivers who leave earlier, but they don't really do too many hours. But you have, like, the mechanics and the trainers who are there for, like you know, several hours a day. So I just want to know what would be the effect of us being, you know, there around that tower, you know, for that long period of time?

And also, since the buses sit in the lot, you know, hours per day, is there an effect of, like, you know, residual -- I don't know if it's radiation or whatever. You know, whatever the 5G pushes out, would there be, you know, affecting the buses just sitting there and us being there for hours on end?

THE HEARING OFFICER: Unfortunately, this is a public
comment session, and we do not accept questions or
respond to questions during this session. This is
for public comments only. My suggestion --

1 CRAIG KELLY: (Unintelligible) --2 THE HEARING OFFICER: My suggestion would be --3 CRAIG KELLY: (Unintelligible) -- go ahead. 4 THE HEARING OFFICER: My suggestion is to go to the 5 Connecticut Siting Council webpage under Docket 6 Number 515. And you can review the information 7 that is available about the project itself. 8 CRAIG KELLY: Okay. All right. Thank you. 9 THE HEARING OFFICER: Okay. Anything else? 10 CRAIG KELLY: No, thank you. That's it. 11 THE HEARING OFFICER: Very good. Thank you for calling 12 in. 13 Okay. With that, we will be closing the 14 evidentiary record. Before closing this hearing, 15 the Connecticut Siting Council announces that 16 briefs and proposed finding of fact may be filed with the Council by any party or intervener no 17 18 later than July 29, 2023. 19 The submission of briefs or proposed findings 20 of fact are not required by this Council. Rather, 21 we leave it to the choice of the parties and 22 interveners. Anyone who has not become a party or 23 intervener, but who desires to make his or her 24 views known to the Council may file written 25 statements with the Council within 30 days of the

date hereof.

The Council will issue draft findings of fact, and thereafter parties and interveners may identify errors or inconsistencies between the Council's draft findings of fact and the record. However, no new information, no new evidence, no arguments, and no reply briefs without permission will be considered by the Council.

Copies of the transcript of this hearing will be filed with the Wilton Town Clerk's office.

I hereby declare this hearing adjourned. And thank you, everyone, for your participation this evening. Thank you, everyone. Have a great evening.

MR. BALDWIN: Thank you.
