## Dear Attorney Bachman:

The State Historic Preservation Office offers the following comments regarding the above-named project. It is our understanding that the proposed project includes the rebuilding of two single-circuit 115-kilovolt (kV) overhead lines along the Connecticut Department of Transportation (CT DOT) corridor from existing Catenary Structure B648S in Fairfield to the Congress Street substation (approximately 7.6 miles), which includes the removal of United Illuminating (UI) infrastructure from 157 existing railroad catenaries, as well as on lattice towers along a UI right of way form the railroad corridor to the Ash Creek Substation in Bridgeport.

Our office has previously corresponded with the consultant for the Applicant, expressing concerns for cultural resources that have the potential to be impacted by the project, and summarized in letters dated October 31, 2022, April 24, 2023, and July 24, 2023. Of particular concern is the potential visual impacts of the proposed new structures. It is the opinion of this office that the scope of work as proposed will have an <u>adverse effect</u> to historic resources, and requested that the Applicant further consult with our office to resolve the effect.



Since our last letter, SHPO has been contacted by several groups and individual members of the public, expressing concern that the material regarding cultural resources submitted to the Connecticut Siting Council (CSC) for review was incomplete, and did not account for potential future impacts of the project. It is our understanding this material was also submitted to the Council.

We would therefore recommend that a decision of approval be <u>postponed</u> until additional information can be provided, to better make informed/additional recommendations.

The State Historic Preservation Office appreciates the opportunity to review and comment upon this project. These comments are provided in accordance with the Connecticut Environmental Policy Act and Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act.
