Dear Attorney Bachman:

The State Historic Preservation Office offers the following comments meant to clarify the statements made in our previous letter of November 17, 2023.

There is mention in the letter that the comments are provided in accordance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act. To date, we have not been contacted to participate in consultation under Section 106, and any reference to Section 106 was made in error.

The "additional material" referenced in the letter is information that was supplied by members of the public to SHPO. It is our understanding that this information was also submitted to the Siting Council prior to our letter. SHPO has not received any other additional material.

The recommendation for delay in approval was suggested to allow time for said material submitted by members of the public to be considered by the Council.



SHPO's opinion of the effect to historic resources has not changed. It is the opinion of this office that the project will adversely affect historic resources, as stated in our previous correspondence. We look forward to additional consultation with the project proponent to resolve the impacts.
