THE HEARING OFFICER: Good evening, ladies and gentlemen. This hearing is called to order this Thursday, August 22, 2024, at 6:30 p.m.

My name is John Morissette, member and
Presiding Officer of the Connecticut Siting
Council. Other members of the Council are Bryan
Golembiewski, designee for Commissioner Katie
Dykes of the Department of Energy and
Environmental Protection; Quat Nguyen, designee
for Chairman Marissa Paslick Gillett of the Public
Utilities Regulatory Authority; and we have Chance
Carter and Khristine Hall.

Members of the staff are Executive Director Melanie Bachman, Siting Analyst Robert Mercier, and Administrative Support Lisa Fontaine.

If you haven't done so already, I ask that everyone please mute their computer audio and telephones now.

This is a continuation of the public hearing that began at 2 p.m. This afternoon. A copy of the prepared agenda is available on the Council's Docket Number 522 webpage, along with a record of this matter, the public hearing notice,

instructions for public access to this public hearing, and the Council's citizens guide to Siting Council procedures.

This hearing is held pursuant to the provisions of Title 16 of the Connecticut General Statutes and of the Uniform Administrative Procedure Act upon an application from Stafford Solar One, LLC, for a certificate of environmental compatibility and public need for the construction, maintenance, and operation of a four-megawatt AC solar photovoltaic electric generating facility and associated equipment located at 92 Upper Road in Stafford, Connecticut, and the associated electrical interconnection.

This application was received by the Council on May 24, 2024. The Council's legal notice of the date and time of this public hearing was published in the Journal Inquirer on June 25, 2024.

Upon this Council's request, the Applicant erected a sign in the vicinity of the proposed site so as to inform the public of the name of the Applicant, the type of the facility, the public hearing date, and contact information for the Council, including the website and telephone

number.

As a reminder to all, off-the-record communication with a member of the Council or a member of the Council's staff upon the merits of this application is prohibited by law.

This public comment session is reserved for members of the public who have signed up in advance to make brief statements. These limited appearance statements are not subject to questions from the parties or the Council, and members of the public making these statements may not ask questions of the parties or the Council. And according to the public hearing notice, and in fairness to everyone who signed up to speak, these public statements will be limited to three minutes.

Please be advised that written comments may be submitted by any person within 30 days of this public hearing.

I wish to note that parties and interveners, including their representatives, witnesses, and members are not allowed to participate in the public comment session. I wish to also note for those who are listening and for the benefit of your friends and neighbors who are unable to join

us for the public comment session, that you or they may send written statements to the Council within 30 days of the date hereof by mail or by e-mail.

Please be advised that any person may be removed from the public comment session at the discretion of the Council.

We ask each person making limited appearance statements in this proceeding to confine his or her statements to the subject matter before the Council, and to avoid unreasonable repetition so that we may hear all the concerns you and your neighbors may have. Please be advised that the Council cannot answer questions from the public about the proposal.

A verbatim transcript will be made of this hearing and will be deposited at the Stafford Town Clerk's office for the convenience of the public.

At this time, I request the Applicant to make a very brief presentation to the public describing the proposed facility, and I believe it's Mr. Cerkanowicz.

JAMES CERKANOWICZ: Thank you, Mr. Morissette. Good evening. Good evening, members of the Siting Council and all those in attendance for this

evening's hearing. My name is James Cerkanowicz and I'm the Manager of Permitting for Verogy, a West Hartford-based solar developer.

On screen you should be seeing figure number three, the proposed conditions map for the Stafford Solar One project, proposed to be located at 92 Upper Road in Stafford. In this brief presentation, I'll be speaking to this figure and providing a general overview of the project as more comprehensively described in the certificate materials that have been submitted and reviewed.

The project is located on a 59-acre parcel of land that is a mix of open hay fields and undeveloped forest. Most of the project will be constructed within the open fields with only a minor amount of tree removal occurring from the removal of a narrow windrow that separates two of the open fields. An existing front road leading from the site's frontage on Upper Road to the solar field will be upgraded to a gravel surface and will lead to the array, which will be located a significant distance from Upper Road.

The project is a proposed 4-megawatt AC fixed-tilt ground-mounted solar array consisting of 9,960 First Solar modules that are produced

here in the U.S., 32 string-level solar inverters, two transformers, and related service equipment.

Panels and equipment will be surrounded by an 8-foot high agricultural-style fence that encompasses approximately 14.2 acres. Within the fence limits, the grass surface will be maintained by utilizing sheep grazing and agricultural co-use that Verogy has successfully employed at several locations throughout Connecticut, most recently in the nearby town of Enfield. It should also be noted that land outside of the fenced array will still be available to the property owner for the continuation of other agricultural uses.

Project development will require only minor regrading for the construction of the gravel road. In all other areas existing topography will be maintained to minimize earthwork, and existing surfaces will continue to promote infiltration such that no permanent stormwater basins are proposed.

The project also has minimal environmental impact, with no harm to native species per reviews conducted with the National Diversity Database and U.S. Fish and Wildlife, and an indication by Connecticut DEEP that there will be no material

impact to core forests.

In addition, solar projects of this nature do not produce any air emissions, do not require lighting, do not require water, and do not produce wastewater.

It is estimated that the system will produce approximately 6,000 -- 165,961 kilowatt hours of clean renewable energy annually, enough to power 850 homes. This production will be sold to Eversource as part of a 20-year SCEF, or shared clean energy facility Program contract, sometimes referred to as community solar.

Eversource manages this program with bill credits, with 60 percent of the production of the system benefiting low and moderate income customers within Connecticut, as well as municipalities, small businesses, and other residences in accordance with the program rules. It is estimated this will result in approximately \$165,500 per year in savings to low and moderate income families.

The project will also aid in the State's overall goal of increasing renewable energy, reducing dependence on other less environmentally sensitive energy sources, and help to strengthen
