THE HEARING OFFICER: Good evening, ladies and gentlemen. Can everybody hear me okay?

Thank you.

This hearing is called to order this

Thursday, March 13, 2025, at 6:30 p.m. My name is

John Morissette, Member and Presiding Officer of

the Connecticut Siting Council.

Other members of the Council are Brian

Golembiewski, designee for Commissioner Katie

Dykes of the Department of Energy and

Environmental Protection; Quat Nguyen, designee

for Chairman Marissa Paslick Gillett of the Public

Utilities Regulatory Authority; Chance Carter;

Christine Hall; and Bill Syme.

Members of the staff are Executive Director Melanie Bachman, Siting Analyst Robert Mercier, and Administrative Support Lisa Fontaine.

If you haven't done so already, I ask that everyone please mute their computer audio and/or telephones now. Thank you.

This is a continuation of the public hearing that began at 2 p.m. this afternoon. A copy of the prepared agenda is available on the Council's

website, along with a record of this matter, the public hearing notice, instructions for public access to this public hearing, and the Council's Citizens Guide to Siting Council Procedures.

This hearing is held pursuant to the provisions of Title 16 of the Connecticut General Statutes and of the Uniform Administrative Procedure Act upon an application from Homeland Tower, LLC, and Cellco Partnership, d/b/a, Verizon Wireless, for a certificate of environmental compatibility and public need for the construction, maintenance, and operation of a telecommunications facility and associated equipment located at Parcel Number 65-002-1, Old Chester Road North in Haddam, Connecticut. This application was received by the Council on January 10, 2025.

This application is also governed by the Telecommunications Act of 1996, which is administered by the Federal Communications

Commission. This act prohibits this Council from considering the health effects of radiofrequency emissions on human health and wildlife to the extent the emissions from the towers are within the federal acceptable safe limit standards, which

standards are also followed by the State Department of Public Health.

The Federal Act also prohibits this Council from discriminating between and amongst providers of functionally equivalent services. This means that if one carrier already provides service for an area, other carriers have the right to compete and provide service to the same area.

The Council's legal notice of the date and time of this public hearing was published in the Hartford Courant on February 12, 2025.

Upon this Council's request, the Applicants erected a sign in the vicinity of the proposed site so as to inform the public of the name of the Applicant, the type of the facility, the public hearing date, and contact information for the Council, including the website and phone number.

As a reminder to all, off-the-record communication with a member of the Council or a member of the Council's staff upon the merits of this application is prohibited by law.

This public comment session is reserved for members of the public who signed up to make brief statements. These limited appearance statements are not subject to questions from the parties or

the Council, and members of the public making statements may not ask questions of the parties or the Council.

In accordance with the public hearing notice and in fairness to everyone who has signed up to speak, these public statements will be limited to three minutes. Please be advised that written comments may be submitted by any person within 30 days of this public hearing.

I wish to note that parties and interveners, including their representatives, witnesses, and members, are not allowed to participate in the public comment session. I also wish to note for those who are listening and for the benefit of your friends and neighbors who are unable to join us for the public comment session, that you or they may send written statements to the Council within 30 days of the date hereof by mail or by e-mail.

Please be advised that any person may be removed from the public comment session at the discretion of the Council.

We ask each person making a limited appearance statement in this proceeding to confine his or her statements to the subject matter before

the Council, and to avoid unreasonable repetition so that we may hear all the current concerns you and your neighbors may have.

Please be advised that the Council cannot answer questions from the public about the proposal.

A verbatim transcript will be made of this hearing and will be deposited in the Haddam Town Clerk's office for the convenience of the public.

At this time, I request the Applicants to make a brief presentation to the public describing the proposed facility. I understand Robert Burns will be making that presentation.

Mr. Burns, good evening.

ROBERT BURNS: Good evening, Mr. Morissette.

For the record, my name is Robert Burns. I'm a licensed civil engineer in the state of Connecticut, and I work for All-Points Technology Corporation out of Waterford, Connecticut.

I'm here tonight to make a presentation for Homeland Towers, Haddam South Telecommunication Facility. This proposed facility is to be located on a vacant parcel on the west side of Old Chester Road North in Haddam.

If we go to SP-2 for the rest of this, it

might be a little easier.

There you go. Perfect.

Vehicle access to the site will be from Route 154 onto 1583 Saybrook Road and will proceed through the existing parking lot for the closed commercial space on the adjacent parcel, which is owned by the same property owner as the parcel we are proposing to go on.

At the southwest corner of the existing parking lot, a proposed 12-foot-wide gravel driveway will proceed southeast towards the compound for approximately 420 feet. The proposed facility is to be located in the northeast corner of that vacant parcel. The address is Old Chester Road North.

The proposed facility will be 43 feet by 80 feet, a gravel surface compound surrounded by an 8-foot high chain-link fence and a 12-foot-wide access gate, which will be on the northwestern side.

The proposed compound has been sized for four carriers; Verizon, which will be the initial anchor, and three future carriers, and there's an area reserved for municipal ground equipment if they so decide to go on the pole.

Outside of the fence on the northern side of
the compound is a proposed utility area. This
area will include a utility backboard, which will
house the proposed electric meters, and a
step-down transformer. This area will be
surrounded by steel bollards for protection.

The proposed electric and telco service that will feed the site will be installed underground, beginning at a proposed pole on the west side of Old Chester Road North, and run underground to the proposed facility.

If we go to the compound plan for the rest of this, it might show a little better.

Perfect.

Inside the fence in the southeastern corner of the compound is Verizon's ground equipment.

That ground equipment will include a 10-foot by 20-foot concrete pad with equipment cabinets and a 50kW diesel fired generator.

In the center of the compound, approximately the center, is a 140-foot-high monopole.

Verizon's plan is to install nine panel antennas, six remote radios, and one surge suppressor, which will be mounted on a square platform. The centerline of those antennas will be 135 feet, or

five feet down from the top of the pole.

The tower will be designed for three additional future carriers at 10-foot intervals below Verizon's installation; so 125, 115, and 105.

And that concludes my presentation.

Thank you.

THE HEARING OFFICER: Thank you, Mr. Burns.

We will now call upon First Selectman Robert McGarry to make a public statement.

First Selectman McGarry, good evening.

FIRST SELECTMAN McGARRY: Good evening, Councilmembers, and thank you very much for this opportunity to speak.

As was said, I'm the First Selectman in the Town of Haddam. It's a position I've held now for five years. I'll also speak from my experience as a Haddam Neck Volunteer Fire member. I've been a firefighter for 30 years. I was chief of that department for 18 of those 30 years.

The Town of Haddam strongly supports the application of the cell tower on Chester Road North. This cell tower, operating in conjunction with one you approved just about a year ago at 124 Goose Spring Road in Haddam Neck, will help fill

in a critical public safety issue we have in the Town of Haddam.

Currently, Route 154, which you've seen in the previous diagrams, is Saybrook Road in Haddam. That road runs from our northern border with Middletown to our southern border with Chester along the Connecticut River. The southern seven and a half miles of that zone are an absolute cell phone dead zone area. These two towers working in conjunction will fill in that dead zone, with this particular tower that you're addressing tonight filling in about the last two and a half miles of that dead zone.

We have had numerous serious accidents along Saybrook Road, where reporting the accident was delayed because people didn't have a cell phone to make the reports.

We had, about three years ago, a structure fire, a house fire right adjacent to the road. It totaled the house. Fortunately, it was vacant at the time, but that fire was seen by a passing-by motorist at 2:30 in the morning, which delayed reporting until they could get to a cell phone zone.

This is a critical need for us. And of

course, it's not just the road traffic along 154 that's affected, but all the residences in the area as you move away from 154 continuing up the hill, which as the western side of that tower are also in the dead zone. And in times of major storms where landlines are out or unreliable, cell phone is an important backup for them.

And as a first responder, I can tell you cell phones are also a very important backup for those of us operating on scene. They're critical in times of major storms when we have multiple calls, multiple departments operating on the radio to free up airspace. They're also critical for us if you have sensitive information to be passed that really should not be passed on the open airways.

So again, I will keep my remarks short in view of your time. But again, I can't say how strongly the Town supports this cell tower, and it fills for us a critical public safety need.

Thank you for your time and this opportunity to speak.

THE HEARING OFFICER: Thank you First Selectman

McGarry. Thank you for coming out this evening.

That concludes the public statements for this evening.

Before closing this hearing, the Connecticut Siting Council announces that briefs and proposed findings of fact may be filed with the Council by any party or intervener no later than April 12, 2025.

The submission of briefs or proposed findings of fact are not required by this Council. Rather, we leave it to the choice of the parties and interveners.

Anyone who has not become a party or an intervener, but who desires to make his or her views known to the Council may file written statements with the Council within 30 days of the date hereof.

The Council will issue draft findings of fact, and thereafter parties and interveners may identify errors or inconsistencies between the Council's draft findings of fact and the record. However, no new information, no new evidence, no arguments, and no reply briefs without permission will be considered by the Council.

Copies of the transcript of this hearing will be filed in the Haddam Town Clerk's office.

I hereby declare this hearing adjourned and thank you everyone for participating.
