THE CHAIR: Good evening, ladies and gentlemen. This hearing is called to order this Thursday, May 22, 2025, at 6:30 pm.

My name is Elin Katz, Chair of the

Connecticut Siting Council. Other members of the

Council are Brian Golembiewski, designee for

Commissioner Katie Dykes of the Department of

Energy and Environmental Protection; Quat Nguyen,

designee for Chairman Marissa Paslick Gillett,

Public Utilities Regulatory Authority; Daniel P.

Lynch, Jr.; Chance Carter; Khristine Hall; and

Bill Syme.

Members of the staff with us today are

Executive Director Melanie Bachman, Siting Analyst

Adam Marrone, and Administrative Support Lisa

Fontaine.

If you haven't already done so, I ask everyone to please mute their computer audio or telephone now.

This is a continuation of a public hearing that began at 2 p.m. this afternoon. A copy of the prepared agenda is available on the Council's website, along with the record of this matter, the

public hearing notice, instructions for public access to this public hearing, and the Council's citizens guide to siting council procedures.

This hearing is being held pursuant to the provisions of Title 16 of the Connecticut General Statutes and of the Uniform Administrative Procedures Act upon an application from Tarpon Towers III, LLC, and Cellco Partnership d/b/a Verizon Wireless for a certificate of environmental compatibility and public need for the construction, maintenance and operation of a telecommunications facility and associated equipment located at 161 Conrad Street, Naugatuck, Connecticut.

This application was received by the Council on March 21, 2025. The application is also governed by the Telecommunications Act of 1996, which is administered by the Federal Communications Commission. This act prohibits the Council from considering the health effects of radiofrequency emissions on human health and wildlife to the extent the emissions from towers are within the federally acceptable safe limits standard, which standard is also followed by the State Department of Public Health.

The federal act also prohibits this Council from discriminating between and amongst providers of functionally equivalent services. This means if one provider already provides service in an area, other carriers have a right to compete and provide service in the same area.

The Council's legal notice of the date and time of the public hearing was published in the Republican American on April 7, 2025.

Upon this Council's request, the Applicants erected a sign in the vicinity of the proposed site so as to inform the public of the name of the Applicants, the type of the facility, the public hearing date and contact information for the Council.

As a reminder, off-the-record communications with a member of the Council or a member of the Council's staff upon the merits of this application are prohibited by law.

This public comment session is reserved for members of the public who have signed up to make brief statements into the record. The deadline for the public to sign up to speak during this public comment session was Wednesday, May 21, 2025. No member of the public has signed up to

speak.

Please be advised that written comments may be submitted by any person within 30 days of this hearing.

At this time, I'd ask the Applicants to make just a very brief presentation to the public describing the proposed facility.

Mr. Burns, would you like to take that?

ROBERT BURNS: Yes, thank you, Madam Chairman.

For the record, my name is Robert Burns. I'm a licensed civil engineer in the State of Connecticut, and I work for All-Points Technology Corporation with our office in Waterford, Connecticut. I'm here to present for Tarpon Towers and Verizon Wireless for the Conrad Street telecommunications facility.

The site address is at 161 Conrad Street,
Naugatuck, Connecticut. The facility is to be
located at a parcel on the northeast side of
Conrad Street, which is currently occupied by two
existing water tanks, which are set to be
demolished.

Vehicle access to the facility will be from an upgraded existing curb cut on Conrad Street.

The proposed facility is located in the northeast

corner of the parcel, which is currently a portion of the area occupied by the water tank facility.

Prior to the installation of the facility, the northern water tank will be demolished, and once the tower is constructed and the existing antennas from the southern tank have been located on the tower, the southern water tank will be demolished.

The proposed facility will be a 6,737 square-foot facility -- a gravel surface compound, which is a portion of the existing facility. It will be surrounded by an eight-foot-high chain-link fence with a twelve-foot-wide access gate on the southeastern side. The fenced facility will be set back approximately ten feet from the existing fence adjacent to Conrad Street.

The proposed compound has been sized for four carriers; Verizon who will be the initial anchor, three future carriers, and an area for the municipal ground equipment.

Yeah, that's good.

Outside the fence on the southwestern side of the compound is a proposed utility area, which will include a utility backboard which will house the electric meters and an electric transformer which will be surrounded by steel bollards for protection.

The proposed electric and telephone service that will feed the site will be installed underground beginning at a new utility pole to be placed in front of the existing facility on Conrad Street and run underground to the proposed facility.

Landscaping is proposed in front of the proposed facility between the proposed fence and Conrad Street and on the southeastern side of the proposed facility.

Inside the fence in the northern corner of the compound will be Verizon's ground equipment, which will include a 10-foot by 20-foot concrete pad with equipment cabinets and a 50-kW diesel-fired generator. In the center of the compound will be a 150-foot-tall monopole.

Verizon's plan is to install 18 panel antennas, 10 remote radios, and a surge protector, which we've mounted on a square platform, the centerline of which will be at the 140 mark. The tower will be designed for three additional future carriers at 12-foot intervals below Verizon's installation, and the top of the tower will be

reserved for the municipal antennas, which will include a 14-foot whip and two 17-foot whips.

The tower will be designed with a yield point so that in case of a catastrophic failure, the tower will collapse upon itself within the proposed facility.

That concludes my presentation. Thank you very much.

THE CHAIR: Thank you very much, Mr. Burns.

Before closing the hearing, I want to announce on behalf of the Siting Council that briefs and proposed findings of fact may be filed with the Council by any party or intervener no later than June 21, 2025. The submission of briefs or proposed findings of fact are not required by this Council, therefore we leave it to the choice of the parties or the interveners.

Anyone who is not a party or intervener but desires to make his or her views known to the Council may file written comments with the Council within 30 days of the date hereof.

The Council will issue draft findings of fact and thereafter parties and interveners may identify errors or inconsistencies between the Council's draft findings of fact and the record.

However, no new information, no new evidence, no arguments, and no reply briefs without our permission will be considered by the Council. Copies of the transcript of this hearing will be filed in the Naugatuck Town Clerk's office. I hereby declare this hearing adjourned, and thank you for your participation. (End: 6:39 p.m.)
