THE VICE CHAIR: Good evening, ladies and gentlemen.

This hearing is called to order this Thursday,

July 31, 2025, at 6:30 p.m. My name is John

Morissette, Vice Chair of the Connecticut Siting

Council.

If you haven't done so already, I ask that everyone please mute their computer audio and/or telephones now. Thank you.

This is a continuation of the public hearing that began at 2 p.m. this afternoon. A copy of the prepared agenda is available on the Council's website along with a record of this matter, the public hearing notice, and instructions for public

access to this public hearing, and the Council's citizen's guide to the Siting Council's procedures.

This hearing is held pursuant to provisions of Title 16 of the Connecticut General Statutes and of the Uniform Administrative Procedure Act upon an application from The Towers, LLC, for a certificate of environmental compatibility and public need for the construction, maintenance, and operation of a telecommunications facility located at 835 Norwich Worcester Turnpike, Route 169 in Woodstock, Connecticut. This application was received by the Council on April 7, 2025.

This application is governed by the Telecommunications Act of 1996, which is administered by the Federal Communications

Commission. This act prohibits this Council from considering the health effects of radiofrequency emissions on human health and wildlife to the extent the emissions from towers are within the federal acceptable safe limit standards, which standards are also followed by the State

Department of Public Health.

The federal act also prohibits this Council from discriminating between and amongst providers

of functionally equivalent services. This means that if one carrier already provides services for an area, other carriers have the right to compete and provide service in the same area.

The Council's legal notice of the date and time of this public hearing was published in the Woodstock Villager on May 9, 2025. Upon this Council's request, the Applicant erected a sign in the vicinity of the proposed site so as to inform the public of the name of the Applicant, the type of the facility, the public hearing date, and contact information for the Council, including the website and phone number.

As a reminder to all, off-the-record communication with a member of the Council or a member of the Council's staff upon the merits of this application is prohibited by law.

This public comment session is reserved for members of the public who have signed up to make brief statements. These limited appearance statements are not subject to questions from the parties or the Council, and members of the public making statements may not ask questions of the parties or the Council. In accordance with the public hearing notice, and in fairness to everyone

who signed up to speak, these public statements will be limited to three minutes. Please be advised that written comments may be submitted by any person within 30 days of this public hearing.

I wish to note that parties, interveners, including their representatives, witnesses, and members, are not allowed to participate in the public comment session. I also wish to note that those who are listening and for the benefit of your friends and neighbors who are unable to join us for the public comment session, that you or they may send written statements to the Council within 30 days of the date hereof by mail or by e-mail.

Please be advised that any person may be removed from the public comment session at the discretion of the Council. We ask each person making a limited appearance statement in this proceeding to confine his or her statements to the subject matter before the Council, and to avoid unreasonable repetition so that we may hear all the concerns you and your neighbors may have. Please be advised that the Council cannot answer questions from the public about the proposal.

A verbatim transcript will be made of this

hearing and will be deposited in the Woodstock
Town Clerk's Office for the convenience of the
public.

At this time, I request the Applicant to make a brief presentation to the public describing the proposed facility.

Attorney Schaefer, good evening.

ATTORNEY SCHAEFER: Good evening, Vice Chair

Morissette. Thank you.

My name is Jon Schaefer. I'm an attorney at Robinson & Cole on behalf of the Applicant, the Towers, LLC. As previously noted, this site address is 835 Route 169, Woodstock, Connecticut.

As you can see on the screen, the facility is to be -- the proposed facility is to be located in the northerly portion of the subject parcel, which is 55 acres in size. Vehicular access to the proposed facility would extend from Route 169 over a portion of an existing farm road to the proposed tower site compound.

The proposed compound will be located at the end of an approximately 930-foot access roadway and within a 100-foot by 100-foot leased area.

The proposed compound will be a 50-foot by 50-foot compound surrounded by an 8-foot chain-link fence.

The proposed tower compound has been sized for three carriers, and Cellco, doing business as Verizon Wireless, will be the initial anchor tenant at the tower. Outside the tower compound fence is a proposed utility area, which will house the utility's transformer and utility backboard. The proposed electric service will be provided via an existing overhead utility pole on Route 169 and proceed underground up the access way to the proposed tower compound.

Inside the tower compound fence in the western side will be the Verizon ground equipment, which will include a 12-foot by 20-foot concrete pad with equipment cabins, battery cabins, and a 50-kW diesel-fired emergency generator. At the center of the proposed compound will be a 150-foot-tall monopole tower.

Verizon's plan is to install nine panel antennas, six remote radio heads located at a centerline of 145 feet on the tower. The proposed tower will be designed to accommodate additional carriers at intervals of approximately 10 feet, and the tower will be available for municipal and/or emergency use if needed. This tower will not require any FAA lighting or marking.

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THE VICE CHAIR: Thank you, Attorney Schaefer.

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We will now call on Jessie Andrews to make a public statement. Jessie Andrews, please? evening.

JESSIE ANDREWS: Good evening, Councilmembers.

Thank you very much.

While I understand the need for reliable service, the approach being taken in Woodstock raises serious concerns. The general site locations may seem logical, but the need for multiple new towers has not been justified.

The three small-cell Verizon installations at the Woodstock Fairgrounds serve fair demand only. If coverage is the issue, why not replace those small cells with a properly designed tower on that property where Verizon already has an agreement, instead of adding multiple new towers?

Neither proposed tower application includes height justification plots. Without this, we cannot evaluate whether either tower is taller than necessary, or whether one facility could serve the area without duplicating infrastructure.

Wetlands are a serious issue at both sites. At this docket, the proposed access road seems to cross wetland one, which is unacceptable for a new construction project when there are lower-impact alternatives. Why choose a site that requires access through a wetland?

The EME/MPE studies submitted only account for Verizon equipment. What process will notify residents and require a new exposure study when additional carriers inevitably add equipment to these towers? Verizon's own references to Pomfret East and services at the Docket 534 area do not demonstrate spectrum exhaustion. Several sites are not even using all available frequencies, making it difficult to claim that new towers are truly necessary.

Finally, it seems neither proposed tower has been offered for use by Woodstock public safety departments, despite claims that these towers support local emergency services. If public safety is a justification, why has no outreach been made to integrate these towers into Woodstock's emergency communication needs?

For these reasons, lack of clear
justification, failure to exhaust existing
options, environmental concerns and insufficient
planning for community needs, I urge the Council
to deny or suspend these applications until these
