Re: Opposition to Proposed 150-Foot 5G Cell Tower at 1022 Trumbull Highway, Lebanon, CT

To Whom It May Concern,

I am writing in my capacity as Ms. Natalie J. Roy's physician to express my professional concern regarding the proposed construction of a 150-foot-high 5G Wave cell phone tower 750 Feet from her residence at 1044 Trumbull Highway, Lebanon, Connecticut.

Ms. Roy is a cancer survivor under my medical care. It is widely recognized within the medical community that survivors of cancer must take special precautions to minimize potential exposures to environmental stressors that may compromise their health or recovery. While the scientific community continues to study the long-term health impacts of radiofrequency (RF) radiation, the placement of such a large telecommunications tower in such close proximity to a cancer survivor's home raises legitimate medical and ethical concerns.


The World Health Organization's International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) has classified RF electromagnetic fields as "possibly carcinogenic to humans" (Group 2B). Although further research is warranted, prudence dictates that vulnerable populations—including cancer survivors—should not be placed at unnecessary risk when safer, reasonable siting alternatives exist.

Furthermore, Connecticut's own planning guidelines and the Connecticut Siting Council's strategic initiatives emphasize co-location on municipal or utility-owned properties whenever possible, in order to reduce proliferation and protect residents. In this case, viable municipal sites exist that would reduce direct health and environmental burdens on private homeowners such as Ms. Roy.

In my professional medical opinion, approving the construction of this tower in such immediate proximity to Ms. Roy's residence poses an undue and avoidable health risk. I respectfully urge the Council to deny the proposed site location and instead pursue placement on a more suitable municipal or utility-owned property.

Thank you for your consideration of this important matter of public health.
