THE VICE CHAIR: This hearing is called to order this Thursday, November 6, 2025, at 6:30 p.m.

My name is John Morissette, Vice Chair of the Connecticut Siting Council. Other members of the Council are Quat Nguyen, designee for Chairman-elect Thomas Wiehl of the Public Utilities Regulatory Authority; Chance Carter; Khristine Hall; Bill Syme; Dr. Williams; and Daniel P. Lynch, Jr.

Members of the staff are Executive Director Melanie Bachman, Siting Analyst Robert Mercier, and Administrative Support Lisa Fontaine.

If you haven't done so already, I ask that everyone please mute their computer audio and/or telephones now. Thank you.

This is a continuation of the public hearing that began at 2 p.m. this afternoon. A copy of the prepared agenda is available on the Council's website along with a record of this matter, the public hearing notice, instructions for public access to this public hearing, and the Council's citizens guide to the Siting Council's Procedures.

This hearing is held pursuant to the

provisions of Title 16 of the Connecticut General Statutes and of the Uniform Administrative Procedure Act upon an application from The Towers, LLC, for a certificate of environmental compatibility and public need for the construction, maintenance, and operation of a telecommunications facility and associated equipment located at 132 Bass Road in Windham, Connecticut. This application was received by the Council on June 30, 2025.

This application is also governed by the Telecommunications Act of 1996, which is administered by the Federal Communications

Commission. This act prohibits this Council from considering the health effects of radiofrequency emissions on health, human health, and wildlife to the extent the emissions from towers are within the federal acceptable safe limit standards, which standards are also followed by the State

Department of Public Health.

The Federal Act also prohibits this Council from discriminating between and amongst providers of functionally equivalent services. This means that if one carrier already provides service for an area, the other carriers have the right to

compete and provide service to the same area.

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The Council's legal notice of the date and time of this public hearing was published in The

Chronicle on July 30, 2025.

Upon this Council's request, the Applicant erected a sign in the vicinity of the proposed site so as to inform the public of the name of the Applicant, the type of facility, the public hearing date, and contact information for the Council, including the Council's website and phone number.

As a reminder to all, off-the-record communications with a member of the Council or a member of the Council's staff upon the merits of this application is prohibited by law.

This public comment session is reserved for the public who signed up to make brief statements. These limited appearance statements are not subject to questions from the parties or the Council. And members of the public making statements may not ask questions of the parties or the Council.

In accordance with the public hearing notice and in fairness to everyone who signed up to speak in advance, these public statements will be

limited to three minutes. Please be advised that
written comments may be submitted by any person
within 30 days of this public hearing.

I wish to note that parties and interveners, including their representatives, witnesses, and members are not allowed to participate in the public comment session. I also wish to note for those who are listening and for the benefit of your friends and neighbors who are unable to join us for the public comment session, that you or they may send written comments to the Council within 30 days of the date hereof by mail or by e-mail.

Please be advised that any person may be removed from the public comment session at the discretion of the Council. We ask each person making a limited appearance statement in this proceeding to confine his and her statements to the subject matter before the Council and to avoid unreasonable repetition so that we may hear all of the concerns you and your neighbors may have. Please be advised that the Council cannot answer questions from the public about the proposal.

A verbatim transcript will be made of this hearing and will be deposited in the Windham Town

Clerk's office for the convenience of the public.

At this time, I request the Applicant to make a very brief presentation to the public describing the proposed facility. I understand Joseph Johnston will be making that presentation.

Good evening, Mr. Johnston.

JOSEPH JOHNSTON: Thank you, Mr. Morissette.

All right. The Towers, LLC, also called Vertical Bridge, is applying to install a new 156-foot-tall steel monopole tower. The tower is proposed to be constructed on a parcel that is approximately 12.4 acres in size and zoned R1, residential. The parcel is owned by Michael and Bonnie Sikoski. The site address is 132 Bass Road in Windham, Connecticut, 06280.

Next slide, please.

The proposed tower and compound is proposed in the north-northeast corner of the parcel.

Vehicle access will enter from the south of Bass Road using an existing driveway that is approximately 600 feet long. The existing driveway is proposed to be extended to the northeast, approximately 285 feet to the proposed compound area. The proposed driveway extension will be 12-foot-wide with a 30-foot-wide easement.

Next slide, please. Thank you.

The proposed compound area is a 50-foot by 50-foot square with a gravel base and will be surrounded by an 8-foot-tall chain-link fence having a 16-foot-wide access gate.

Power and telco will be pulled from an existing utility pole located near the residence end of the existing driveway. Proposed utility conduits will be installed underground from the existing pole and follow the access road to the compound.

Verizon is the anchor tenant and plans to install cabinets and a diesel generator on a ground-mounted concrete slab within the proposed compound. The generator has a built-in UL-rated double-walled spill tank to prevent fuel leakage and will be installed with a sound enclosure to limit noise during use.

The proposed 156-foot-tall monopole tower is designed to support four wireless carriers.

Verizon will be the initial carrier and plans to install at the top of the tower. Verizon is planning to install twelve antennas, six radios, and one surge suppression unit on steel-sector-framed mounts.

in my front window every morning, every night when I'm sitting out on my porch. I've lived here since 1987 as a kid. The Siting Council shot down a previously proposed tower back in the nineties, and my family and I have great concerns about the retail value of our property in the future if we try to sell this as well.
