**Objection to Submission of New Evidence by Wireless Solutions/Ancient Highway Towers LLC**

Dear Attorney Bachman:

On behalf of intervenor Cellco Partnership d/b/a Verizon Wireless (“Cellco”), this letter is in response to the Connecticut Siting Council’s (“Council”) request for comments or statements of position with respect to whether the evidentiary record should be reopened to accept the new information submitted by Wireless Solutions/Ancient Highway Towers, LLC (“AHT”) and whether a public hearing should be held to allow for cross examination on this new information.


Cellco hereby objects to AHT’s submission of new information after the close of the evidentiary record and respectfully requests that the Council refuse to reopen the evidentiary record and hold an additional public hearing on the new information. AHT has had ample time to submit its evidence and information into the Council’s record and participated as an intervenor in the Council’s proceedings. Extending the existing proceeding is unnecessary, will unfairly delay this proceeding, and is prejudicial to the other parties in this proceeding.

AHT was granted intervenor status by the Council on January 8, 2026. AHT made a prehearing submission, issued interrogatories to the Applicants, responded to Council interrogatories, and participated in two evidentiary hearings held on January 29, 2026 and March 3, 2026.

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AHT had the opportunity to, and in fact did, submit information into the record prior to its closure by the Council on March 3, 2026. The information AHT seeks to have entered into the record was available to AHT prior to March 3, 2026. Submission of additional information into the record at this time is a further attempt by AHT to delay the Council's decision on a record that provides unrefuted evidence that co-locating at the AHT amateur radio tower at 30-1 Ancient Highway would provide weaker overall coverage for both Cellco and AT&T.

Out of fairness to the parties and the Council, Cellco respectfully requests that the Council deny reopening of the record to accept the information submitted by AHT and decline to hold a public hearing on that information.


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
