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THE HEARING OFFICER: Good evening, ladies and gentlemen. This remote public hearing is called to order. It is Tuesday, May 11, 2021, at 6:30 p.m. My name is John Morissette, Member and Presiding Officer of the Connecticut Siting Council.

Other members of the Council are Robert
Hannon, Designee of Commissioner Katie Dykes,
Department of Energy and Environmental Protection;
Quat Nguyen, Designee for Chairman Marissa Paslick
Gillett of the Public Utility Regulatory
Authority; Robert Silvestri; Edward Edelson;
Louanne Cooley; and Daniel P. Lynch, Jr.

Members of the staff are Melanie Bachman, Executive Director and Staff Attorney; Ifeanyi Nwankwo, Siting Analyst; Christina Walsh, Supervisor Siting Analyst; and Lisa Fontaine, Fiscal Administrative Officer.

As everyone is aware, there is currently a statewide effort to prevent the spread of the coronavirus. This is why the Council is holding this remote public hearing, and we ask for your patience. If you haven't done so already, I ask that everyone please mute their audio and/or telephones now.

This is a continuation of a remote public hearing that began at 2 p.m. this afternoon. A copy of the prepared agenda is available on the Council's Docket Number 498 webpage along with the record in this matter, the public hearing notice, instructions for public access to this remote public hearing, and the Council's citizens guide to Siting Council procedure.

This hearing is being held pursuant to the provisions of Title 16 of the Connecticut General Statutes, and the Uniform Administrative Procedure Act upon an application received from Diamond Tower V, LLC, for a certificate of environmental compatibility and public need for the construction, maintenance and operation of a telecommunications facility located at 185 Academy Road, which is Route 68 and Route 70 in Cheshire, Connecticut.

This application was received by the Council on March 11, 2021. The Council's legal notice of the date and time of this remote public hearing was published in the Cheshire Herald on April 15, 2021. Upon this Council's request the Applicant erected a sign near the existing driveway entering the subject property from Academy Road, a/k/a

Route 68, so as to inform the public of the name of the Applicant, the type of facility, the remote public hearing date, and contact information for the Council which included the website and phone number.

This remote public comment session is reserved for the public to make a brief statement in the record. The deadline for the public to sign up to speak during the public comment session is Tuesday, May, 4, 2021. Unfortunately no members of the public signed up to speak. Please be advised that written comments may be submitted by any person within 30 days of this public hearing.

Please also be advised that the Council's project evaluation criteria under the statute does not include consideration of property value. I now request that the Applicant make a brief presentation to the public describing the proposed facility, and I believe Mr. Burns will be doing that?

THE WITNESS (Burns): Yes, sir.

THE HEARING OFFICER: Thank you. Could you proceed?

THE WITNESS (Burns): Good evening. For the record my

name is Robert Burns. I am a program manager with

All-Points Technology Corp. The applicant on the site is Diamond Communications, and their project name is Cheshire East.

The site is located at 185 Academy Road which is on the south side of Academy Road. It's an 8.1-acre parcel that is currently occupied by the Cheshire United Methodist Church.

The new compound will be located in the rear of the parcel towards the southern property line in the southeast corner of the existing parking lot. It will be ten feet off the existing parking lot. Vehicle access to the site will be along the existing paved driveway and parking lot.

The compound -- if we want to go to the next drawing? Thank you.

The compound is a 42-foot by 50-foot gravel surface compound surrounded by an eight-foot high wooden shadowbox fence with a 12-foot wide access gate on the northwestern side.

The proposed compound has been sized for three carriers, Verizon and two future carriers. Outside of the fence on the southwest side of the compound is a proposed utility area which will include a utility backboard with proposed electric meters, an electric step-down transformer and a

telephone cabin. This area will be surrounded by steel bollards for protection.

The current location where the compound is being proposed has existing overhead utility lines running through it. So as part of the improvements a new utility pole will be added at the southeastern corner of the compound and the utilities will be rerouted to behind the compound, or the eastern side and run to the existing utility pole, which is located at the southwestern corner of the compound.

At that point the proposed utility services that will be the site will be installed underground beginning at that utility pole on the southwestern corner, which is CL&P Pole Number 724, and will run to the meter board and the tellco cabinet and the step-down transformer outside of the compound.

Inside the fence in the northeast corner of the compound is Verizon's ground equipment, and equipment will sit on a nine-foot by nine-foot concrete pad which will have a steel canopy over the top of it. A 30-kW propane-fired generator will sit on a separate four-foot by eight-and-a-half-foot concrete pad and a

500-gallon propane tank will be adjacent to that on a four-foot by ten-foot pad.

The center of the compound is a 95-foot high monopine with branches extending to 99 feet. This monopine will be designed with a yield point at 55 feet off the ground because the closest properly line is 40 feet away to the south.

Verizon's plan is to install six panel antennas on a monopine with nine remote radio heads and one Mdb, which will be mounted on T-arms. The centerline of those antennas will be at 90.

The tower line will also be designed for two future additional carriers at ten-foot increments below the tower at 80 and 70.

And that's the presentation. Thank you.

THE HEARING OFFICER: Thank you, Mr. Burns.

Before we close the hearing for this evening I believe, Attorney Baldwin, you may have some information for us from this evening's session. Would you please have your witness provide it if available?

MR. BALDWIN: Thank you Mr. Morissette. If the

Councilmembers will recall this afternoon, the

Council asked for information regarding the

frequency range in the 3500 and 50 megahertz frequency area. And they asked for the coverage footprint from those frequencies on the proposed site, and see how Cheiban has some information that was request?

THE WITNESS (Cheiban): Yes. So the footprint from that, at that frequency would be point -- 0.28 square miles. So it's pretty small. This is due, first of all, to the frequency being higher and the power limit that the FCC imposed on this frequency is lower, significantly lower than it does on the other frequencies.

MR. BALDWIN: Happy to answer any follow-up questions,
Mr. Morissette, if there are any?

THE HEARING OFFICER: Thank you, Attorney Baldwin.

That will be it.

We will continue now to close the evidentiary record. However, before closing the evidentiary record in this matter, the Siting Council announces that briefs and proposed findings of fact may be filed with the Council by any party or intervener no later than June 10, 2021.

The submission of briefs or proposed finding of facts are not required by this Council.

Rather, we leave it to the choice of the parties

or interveners.

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Anyone who has not become a party or intervener, but who desired to make his or her views known to the Council may file written statements with the Council within 30 days of the date hereof.

The Council will issue draft findings of fact and thereafter parties and interveners may identify errors or inconsistencies in the Council's draft findings of fact in the record, however no new information, no new evidence, no argument and no reply briefs without permission will be considered by the Council.

Copies of the transcript of this hearing will be filed at the Cheshire Town Clerk's office. I hereby declare this hearing adjourned.
