Good morning, Mr. Greenbaum.

We are in receipt of your messages regarding the record citations in the Draft Findings of Fact for Docket 499.

First, evidentiary record citations to documents, such as Applicants' 8, response 51, correspond to the exhibits listed on the June 24, 2021 Hearing Program that was issued for the continued evidentiary hearing session. The Hearing Program, as well as the hearing procedure, is described in the Council's Information Guide to Party and Intervenor Status and in the Council's April 29, 2021 Remote Hearing Procedures Memorandum for Docket 499. Applicants' 8, response 51 corresponds to "Applicants' Responses to Stan Greenbaum's Interrogatories, dated June 17, 2021" listed under Applicants' Exhibits on the June 24, 2021 Hearing Program (Section II.B.8). Second, the transcript pagination is continuous throughout the proceedings held on Docket 499 ranging from Transcript 1 (pages 1-122) to Transcript 2 (pages 123-160) to Transcript 3 (pages 161-295). It is evident from the pagination assigned in the bottom right-hand corner of the transcripts. Perhaps you are using the pagination assigned to each transcript in your pdf viewer or other application?

Dear Ms. Bachman

The references in parentheses on each of the numbered Findings of Fact on the Draft Findings of Fact dated August 12, 2021 do not correspond to documents and page numbers on the Siting Council website as they are listed there. It is, therefore, very difficult to respond to the referenced items.

For example, number 72 references Applicants 8, response 51. I am unable to identify what document Applicants 8 refers to. Item number 72 refers to Transcript 3, pp 277-280. None of the transcripts listed on the Siting Council website has more than 135 pages.

Responding to these Findings of Fact without being able to adequately reference the documents cited, places me, as Intervenor, at a significant disadvantage.

I regret that I have not been able to address this matter sooner. I have been traveling out of state for much of the past three weeks.

If you are able to respond this morning, I will be able to make an appropriate response by the end of the day. I have identified 25 Draft Findings of Fact that are incomplete, inaccurate or incorrect that require further comment.

While it is unlikely that changing these statements will change the outcome regarding the approval of this application, it is possible that modifications of the application will be considered.

Any assistance you can provide in this matter would be appreciated.
