The Tribal Historic Preservation Office, representing the Mashantucket (Western) Pequot Tribe, has reviewed the submitted Phase IA and IB archaeological reconnaissance survey, conducted by Tetra Tech, for the proposed Killingly Energy Center (KEC) located on approximately 73 acres at 180 and 189 Lake Road. The KEC's potential to impact historic landscapes and archaeological resources was assessed by Tetra Tech, Inc. in compliance with Section 106 of the NHPA. Although no archaeological sites were identified in particular areas (and we concur), further assessment on particular historic property types is absent. Due to the high indigenous occupation in the Project Study Area historically, coupled with water source proximity and other natural features, impacts to cultural landscapes, ceremonial stone features, traditional cultural properties – properties of cultural and religious significance – may also be assessed and evaluated for NRHP eligibility.

We appreciate the opportunity to have reviewed and commented upon the above-referenced project.
