MOTION FOR SUSPENSION OR EXTENSION OF TIME1

As the Council is aware from Meriden Gas Turbine, LLC's ("MGT") written comments in this docket, dated April 5, 2013, MGT does not believe that the Siting Council has any jurisdiction to reopen this docket as MGT's property in Meriden is not a facility. MGT has appealed the Council's decision in Superior Court and will be seeking an order to stay the administrative proceeding. The Council should take no further action until the jurisdictional issue is resolved by the Court. However, if the Council decides to move forward with the administrative proceeding, MGT respectfully requests the Connecticut Siting Council (the "Council) issue at least a thirty (30) day extension to the remaining items listed on the May 2nd, 2013 proposed procedural schedule ("Proposed Schedule") issued by the Council in the above-referenced docket. MGT will be unduly burdened and will be unable to properly prepare to meet the deadlines outlined in the Proposed Schedule. As the responding party in this proceeding, MGT is at a significant disadvantage in terms of advance preparation, and has as of yet been unable to select and retain experts to prepare MGT's pre-filed testimony. As the outcome of this docket has the potential to influence significantly MGT's rights and

MGT objected to the reopening of this docket on grounds of lack of jurisdiction. Without waving those objections, MGT hereby participates in this proceeding under protest.

obligations with respect to the Property at issue in this proceeding, MGT believes that if the Council does not extend the procedural schedule as MGT requests, MGT will be significantly prejudiced in its ability present its case. Pursuant to Conn. Gen. Stat. § 16-500, MGT "shall have the right to present such oral or documentary evidence and to conduct such cross-examination as may be required for a full and true disclosure of the facts." As it currently stands, the accelerated procedural schedule in this docket has not permitted MGT adequate time to develop its evidence with respect to this proceeding. If the Council denies MGT's request for an extension, MGT will be unable to provide adequate oral and documentary evidence that permits a full and true disclosure of the facts. Given that the conditions at the site have been virtually unchanged for years, no imminent harm will occur if the Council grants MGT's request. Conversely, a denial of MGT's request for an extension would significantly prejudice MGT.

CONCLUSION

WHEREFORE, for the foregoing reasons, MGT respectfully requests a thirty (30) day extension to the remaining items listed on the Council's May 2nd, 2013 proposed procedural schedule in the above-referenced docket.
