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

1	Verbatim proceedings of a field tour
2	conducted by the State of Connecticut Siting Council, Re:
3	Docket No. 272, held on December 17, 2003
4	
5	
6	MR. CUNLIFFE: We'll be taking a left out
7	of the parking lot onto Lyons Terrace.
8	At the stop, we'll be taking a left onto
9	Golden Hill Street.
10	At the light, we'll be taking a right onto
11	Main Street. (Pause).
12	At this light it is now Fairfield Avenue,
13	we'll be making a left. (Pause). Is there a place you
14	can pull over?
15	A VOICE: Right here may be a problem.
16	(Pause)
17	MR. CUNLIFFE: We'll go straight through
18	the light and go straight through and stay on
19	Fairfield Avenue.
20	We go through straight crossing Water
21	Street. As we do, you'll be looking to your left as we
22	go under the railroad bridge. This could be a site for a
23	directional bore under the railroad.
24	Okay, we're going to stay on this road all

1	the way out.
2	We stay straight, staying on Stratford
3	Avenue. We follow Stratford Ave. going over a bridge,
4	over a waterway, and we will be taking a left at the next
5	light that is the underpass to I-95, this will be Seaview
6	Avenue.
7	A VOICE: We're going to take a left here?
8	MR. CUNLIFFE: Take a left. Okay. We
9	stay straight on Seaview Avenue.
10	A VOICE: Mark Smith come in Mark
11	Smith.
12	MR. CUNLIFFE: For your information, we're
13	working our way to the Bridgeport/Stratford line to begin
14	the underground review. This is just a proceeding to get
15	us to the beginning point.
16	At the stop sign, you will pass under the
17	railroad bridge.
18	At the light, this is Barnum Avenue.
19	You're going to make a right-hand turn.
20	MR. ASHTON: Fred, I think that this is
21	the route from the substation in Bridgeport back to East
22	Devon.
23	MR. CUNLIFFE: A portion of it is. The

Barnum Avenue route will be part of this. We're going to

1	go to the Bridgeport/Stratford line and come back on
2	Barnum Avenue working our way to our left once we begin.
3	MR. ASHTON: And will we get a chance to
4	see the proposed substation site?
5	MR. CUNLIFFE: If you look directly across
6	from this stoplight, to our left that is a proposed site
7	for a transition station for underground to overhead.
8	CHAIRMAN KATZ: Fred, is that the Seaview
9	Transition Station?
10	MR. CUNLIFFE: Correct.
11	CHAIRMAN KATZ: Thank you.
12	MR. CUNLIFFE: What my plan is, is when we
13	get to the area where we want to start, there's going to
14	be a left-hand turn, and I believe there's a vacant
15	business with probably enough room for six cars, seven
16	cars, for us to stage ourselves and begin. (Pause).
17	We're at the light the intersection of
18	Barnum and Elizabeth Street. We would continue straight
19	through this light.
20	A VOICE: Fred, is this the actual
21	underground route?
22	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yes. We are traveling
23	along a roadway that would be part of the underground
24	route.

1	A VOICE: Thanks.
2	MR. CUNLIFFE: Okay, we're on Bishop. I
3	think the next street we're looking for is Kent, so the
4	next street up we're going to take a left and swing into
5	the vacant business parking lot. The next one up where
6	Meineke says.
7	You would proceed along Barnum until you
8	come to McDonalds, Sage Avenue is on your left, Meineke
9	business, we're going to turn around in that parking
10	area. It's a vacant operation and plenty of room to turn
11	around.
12	We're at the Bridgeport/Stratford line,
13	Kent Avenue/Barnum Avenue, to begin the underground
14	review of the 345-kV transmission line.
15	CHAIRMAN KATZ: Fred, there was a slight
16	alternative of the route in Bridgeport. I think it was
17	somewhere around .3 miles. Are we going to see that
18	today?
19	MR. CUNLIFFE: We're going to follow
20	Barnum Avenue until we come to Washington Park, Noble
21	Street.
22	The underground alternative you're
23	speaking of is identified and it would start at Seaview
24	Avenue.

1	MR. ASHTON: What are the terminals, Fred?
2	We talk about a 345 line. It seems to me we would hang a
3	terminal hang terminals on the description
4	MR. CUNLIFFE: Exactly what do you mean,
5	Phil?
6	MR. ASHTON: We've got a 345 line from
7	East Devon Junction to Seaview and another line
8	another circuit from Seaview to Norwalk. Now this is the
9	East Devon Junction to Seaview section?
10	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yes. It would be a
11	continuous route between Devon and Singer Substation. An
12	alternative could be an overhead from Devon through
13	Stratford down south to the Seaview Transition Station,
14	which I pointed out at the intersection of Barnum and
15	Seaview.
16	MR. ASHTON: The alternate?
17	MR. CUNLIFFE: As correct, as the
18	alternate. Then there would be the alternate
19	underground route would be from the Seaview Transition
20	Station along the same route that we would follow as we
21	are now to the Singer Substation.
22	MR. ASHTON: Okay. So this is all the
23	segment between Singer and East Devon we're looking at
24	right now?

1	MR. CUNLIFFE: Correct.
2	A VOICE: Mark Smith come in Mark
3	Smith.
4	MR. CUNLIFFE: You stay straight on Barnum
5	Avenue through the Central Ave. intersection. Once again
6	I'm going to point out we're at the Seaview Ave./Barnum
7	Ave. intersection. And as we pass through it, to your
8	right will be a building and a vacant parking area. This
9	would be the site of the Seaview Transition Station. The
10	overhead lines would go north of here and the underground
11	would south of here.
12	MR. PHELPS: Fred, this is Derek, can you
13	hear me?
14	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yes, Derek.
15	MR. PHELPS: Lisa is inquiring about where
16	you might have a copy of the you know, that letter
17	that Representative Stillman read into the record at the
18	beginning of the 265 hearing the other day. Do you have
19	one in your office area there?
20	MR. CUNLIFFE: I believe it was in the box
21	of the record brought back. It would have been a loose
22	letter in the box that we came back in.
23	We're at the intersection of Barnum Avenue
24	and East Main Street. You would continue straight on

1	Barnum Avenue.
2	Okay, just up here will be Washington
3	Park, that will be a green area. And at the end of the
4	green area will be Noble.
5	We're approaching Washington Park, a green
6	area for the City. At the end of the park is Noble Ave.,
7	we will take a left. The lights are working good, huh.
8	We're not getting broken up too much here.
9	Now we're on Noble. You will approach a
10	light at the end of Washington Park. At the intersection
11	of East Washington Ave. we will go straight.
12	Noble Ave. turns into Crescent and you're
13	going to bear right, and then we're going to make a quick
14	left and go under the railroad tracks.
15	At the stop sign we will go straight.
16	This is the location of an alternative route to
17	directional bore drill the line under the Pequonnock
18	River. We will now enter into the back end of the
19	parking area and turn around and head back out.
20	This location is a supported change by the
21	community to do to bypass, an East
22	Washington/Fairfield Ave. underground route. And it goes
23	we're going to go straight through the intersection of
24	Pulaski and Noble. We're going to make a right onto

1	Crescent, which will change to Noble Avenue as we bear
2	left. As we approach the light this is East Washington
3	Avenue and Noble Avenue, we will turn left. I don't know
4	if you'll need to pull over or not.
5	A VOICE: They're still coming through.
6	MR. CUNLIFFE: Okay. Stay on Washington
7	Avenue, you'll come to a stop sign, go straight at
8	William Street.
9	East Washington Avenue again. At the
10	Knowlton Street stop sign go straight.
11	We're coming to a water crossing of the
12	Pequonnock River, you would cross this bridge.
13	A VOICE: Fred, is this another
14	directional drill?
15	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yes. The location we just
16	came from when we went through the parking area with a
17	vacant lot, that would be a staging area to do a
18	directional drill. A supported change by the City. And
19	as an alternative, they would have to bolt their cable to
20	the bottom of this bridge.
21	A VOICE: Not recommended.
22	A VOICE: Has it been proposed?
23	MR. CUNLIFFE: That is a that was
24	proposed, but there is a supported change

1	A VOICE: (Indiscernible)
2	CHAIRMAN KATZ: Fred, right now they're
3	leaning the City is leaning toward doing the
4	directional drill?
5	MR. CUNLIFFE: We've already seen the area
6	for the directional drill when we turned around back at
7	that parking shopping center parking area there.
8	We're approaching left onto Housatonic
9	Avenue.
10	MR. ASHTON: By the way, Fred, one
11	question you want to ask the Applicant is, is it an
12	eight-inch pipe is an eight-inch pipe adequate for
13	three conductors, twenty-five hundred circular mil 345
14	cables. I have a feeling it's probably 10-inch would
15	be better. And that eight-inch may be a mistake.
16	MR. CUNLIFFE: Noted. You're on a four-
17	lane plus wide avenue called Housatonic Avenue. We're
18	moving toward the city center.
19	MR. ASHTON: In a general southerly
20	direction?
21	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yes.
22	A VOICE: Is the line on this road?
23	MR. CUNLIFFE: This is a proposed route;
24	however, there's a supported change for the directional

1	bore, which would bypass all this.
2	A VOICE: Second.
3	MR. CUNLIFFE: Stay straight. Stay
4	straight. We are approaching the intersection of
5	Fairfield Avenue and Housatonic Avenue. To our direct
6	left under the railroad bridge is where the directional
7	bore would occur to accomplish that route. Stay on this
8	stay on Housatonic straight past John Street.
9	Housatonic turns into Water Street in the
10	approximate location of the Fairfield Avenue. We are now
11	on Water Street.
12	A VOICE: A left onto Lafayette.
13	MR. CUNLIFFE: Stay on Water Street, it
14	bears to your right, it will turn into North Frontage
15	Ave. The highway is elevated to your left. And take a
16	left onto Lafayette.
17	We go straight through the light at Main
18	Street. You're on North Frontage Street. At the
19	intersection of North Frontage and Broad, you would
20	continue straight.
21	MR. ASHTON: Do we have a flood zone here,
22	Fred, if you know?
23	MR. CUNLIFFE: I don't know.
24	CHAIRMAN KATZ: Ed, we can't ask that on

1	this driving tape?
2	MR. CUNLIFFE: You will approach Lafayette
3	Avenue, at a light make a left.
4	A VOICE: You want us to go left?
5	MR. CUNLIFFE: We will go left.
6	A VOICE: Can you get around from the back
7	up here because we've got to turn left.
8	MR. CUNLIFFE: Straight. You make a left
9	onto Lafayette and you'll pass under the highway. You
10	will see South Frontage Road in front of you, you will go
11	straight through the light.
12	Follow Lafayette to the stoplight at a
13	railroad overpass is in front of you, we'll go under
14	this.
15	We're going to take a left onto Railroad
16	Avenue under the underpass.
17	You will approach a light, Broad Street,
18	Railroad Avenue, go straight.
19	At the stop sign at East Main Street make
20	a right. This underground route is approaching Singer
21	Substation.
22	Slow down right here and pull over. We're
23	at a location of Whiting Street and Main Street. The
24	property to our left would be the proposed site of a

1	substation.
2	MR. ASHTON: Singer Substation?
3	MR. CUNLIFFE: Singer Substation, correct,
4	located between Whiting and Atlantic. Okay, now you can
5	go, thanks. Stay on Main Street. That's one way out.
6	Okay.
7	You're going to approach University
8	Avenue, make a right.
9	At the intersection of Broad Street go
10	straight.
11	At the intersection of Lafayette make a
12	right.
13	A VOICE: I just want to check again,
14	Fred, is this the route?
15	MR. CUNLIFFE: We are now off the
16	underground route. We're working our way back to
17	Railroad Avenue.
18	At Atlantic Street, you will go straight.
19	You're going to approach Gregory Street, go straight.
20	You approach Railroad Avenue, I wanted to
21	take a note here that Railroad Avenue is the route that
22	the Utilities propose as their underground route between
23	Fairfield Avenue and Singer Substation. We cannot travel
24	the route because it is a one-way and in the direction

1	that we're going. So we will go out and work our way to
2	Fairfield and work our way west to Fairfield.
3	A VOICE: Go another way?
4	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yeah, I'm going to we
5	will now pass under the railroad to the next light.
6	MR. ASHTON: Those are interesting, you'll
7	notice there were two 115,000 volt circuits above the
8	railroad, one on either side of it, standing on a single
9	in a sort of delta configuration.
10	MR. CUNLIFFE: That particular line was
11	approved by the Council in Docket 141.
12	MR. ASHTON: And another one before that,
13	I believe, Fred.
14	MR. CUNLIFFE: You may be correct.
15	(Pause). Lafayette approaches I-95 underpass. We will
16	go under the highway. You'll see to South 95, 8, 15,
17	we'll make a left. It's a left onto South Avenue.
18	A VOICE: Alright, pilot car we haven't
19	gone underneath the overpass yet. Are you on the other
20	side of the overpass?
21	MR. CUNLIFFE: I'm underneath it right
22	now.
23	A VOICE: Alright, let us
24	A VOICE: Fred, you better pull over.

1	A VOICE: Okay, I'm going to make a left
2	by the in back of the trooper that's stopped there.
3	MR. PHELPS: After going under the
4	overpass, do we continue straight or turn left onto
5	A VOICE: We're not even at the underpass
6	yet.
7 .	MR. CUNLIFFE: Once you are at the
8	underpass, you come out from under it there's a light,
9	and you'll see a sign, and next to the light that says to
10	South 95, arrows to the left 8 and 15 arrows to the
11	left, turn left.
12	MR. PHELPS: Okay, thank you.
13	A VOICE: I think they probably want to be
14	over there, right?
15	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yeah. I'm wondering if
16	this is an entrance to the highway?
17	A VOICE: No, it's just got that little
L8	thing in the middle.
L9	MR. CUNLIFFE: Okay, alright. I wanted to
20	make sure that they don't turn onto those.
21	A VOICE: Yeah, no, that's just somewhat
22	of a divider.
23	MR. CUNLIFFE: Alright.
2.4	A VOICE: Amy actually drove over that and

1	tore the whole bottom of her car
2	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yeah, that's what it will
3	do. (Pause).
4	You'll be seeing the Bridgeport Harbor
5	Ferry sign, go straight. You'll go straight through
6	Warren Street, South Avenue.
7	Stay straight through the light at Myrtle
8	Avenue, South Avenue.
9	You're approaching Park Avenue, make a
10	right-hand turn at Park Avenue. You're on Park Avenue,
11	follow Park Avenue.
12	Stay on Park Avenue. You're going to
13	cross State Street.
14	At the next light at John Street, you will
15	stay straight actually take a left at Lafayette.
16	That's an odd intersection, I don't like that. We're
17	going to make a left onto Lafayette correction,
18	Fairfield Avenue.
19	Stay on Fairfield, you're going to go past
20	Garastan Avenue, stay straight, you'll see a parking lot
21	with an iron fence on your left and the Kline Memorial
22	Auditorium on your right.
23	A VOICE: Fred, is this the route or are
24	we still working our way back?

1	MR. CUNLIFFE: We are still working our
2	way back. After we went from the railroad line, that's
3	where the line would go along the railroad line in this
4	direction, but the roads some of them were under
5	construction, some of them are a one-way, so we're
6	working our way to the intersection of Fairfield Avenue
7	and Railroad Avenue, and that's where we'll pick up the
8	route again.
9	A VOICE: Thanks.
10	MR. CUNLIFFE: At Elmwood Street
11	Elmwood Place and Fairfield you're going to stay straight
12	through the light. Clinton Avenue you're going to cross.
13	A VOICE: We're going straight, so slow
14	down.
15	A VOICE: We got caught at the light.
16	(Pause).
17	A VOICE: Okay, we're caught up.
18	MR. CUNLIFFE: The Fairfield and State
19	Street intersection you will go straight, keeping
20	McDonald's to your right.
21	At McDonald's, Railroad Avenue is on your
22	left just before the railroad underpass, the proposed
23	route will be on the south side of the railroad bridge.
24	As you go under it, they will continue the underground

1	route along that roadway and continue down Fairfield
2	Avenue
3	MR. ASHTON: Just for clarification, the
4	proposed route is Railroad Avenue that is on the south
5	side of the tracks, is that correct?
6	MR. CUNLIFFE: Correct. We are back on
7	the underground route, back where Railroad Avenue and
8	Fairfield Avenue intersect. We're moving along Route 1,
9	Fairfield Ave. towards Fairfield.
10	As you're traveling along Fairfield
11	Avenue, it has a median with trees planted for a good
12	distance. We're passing into Fairfield, passing over a
13	bridge over Rooster River.
14	As you approach Fairfield Avenue along
15	Route 1, you will come into a rotary, McDonald's will be
16	straight ahead, you want to bear left on the Rotary, and
17	public storage will be on your right, stay straight on
18	Route 1.
19	A VOICE: Hey Chris, we're down to four
20	cars
21	A VOICE: There's only four?
22	MR. CUNLIFFE: Stay on Fairfield Avenue,
23	go by Chevrolet of Fairfield. You'll be coming into the
24	center of Fairfield and you'll see the Community Theater

1	to your right.
2	A VOICE: The railroad station is right up
3	the street. They ticket anybody who parks alongside the
4	street.
5	MR. CUNLIFFE: You're on Fairfield Avenue,
6	you'll see a sign 1700 Post Road, you're on the right
7	road, stay straight.
8	You'll go by Mill Plain Road. On your
9	right Fairfield Ave., go straight and you'll go by a
10	Dairy Queen, a subway as you continue on Fairfield
11	Avenue.
12	As you're going along Fairfield Avenue,
13	you'll come to Mill River. You'll cross a bridge on Mill
14	River. As soon as you come over the bridge and around
15	the corner, you'll see Pequot Ave./Mill Hill Road, take a
16	right.
17	A small plaza on your right. Okay, stop
18	here, I want to describe to them what the route is going
19	to do. This is where if you look to your right,
20	you'll see a sign do not enter, that's Old Post Road,
21	that's where the underground route would come and
22	intersect with Fairfield Avenue. We're going to go
23	straight and under Old Route 1 and pick up the route on
24	the other side. This jog avoids I-95 and this Route 1

1	bridge overpass, keeping underground consistent with the
2	soils.
3	This is the route of the underground on
4	Old Post Road. At the stop sign we will make a right. I
5	stand corrected. We just came off Pequot Ave. and now
6	we're going on to Old Post Road. This is a route for the
7	underground.
8	You'll come to a stop sign and go straight
9	under the over the highway overpass. Go straight.
10	As you come under the underpass, you'll
11	see a stop sign, go straight.
12	This short road will come and bear right.
13	And this is our turn onto Route 1. We need to make a
14	left to go back onto Route 1.
15	Stay on the left. We've rejoined Route 1
16	heading south towards Westport.
17	We're entering Westport. We're crossing
18	over a body of water, Bulkley Pond, Sasco Brook. You
19	will turn left right here at the shopping center.
20	Probably just go in here and turn around and bring
21	everybody back out.
22	A VOICE: Do you want me to come in here?
23	MR. CUNLIFFE: I think they've yeah,
24	everybody is following us.

1	This is the end of the underground segment
2	into Westport. We're working our way back to the City of
3	Bridgeport via I-95, and then we will pick up an
4	alternative underground route at that location.
5	We turned around at the town line of
6	Fairfield and Westport, we're heading north on Route 1
7	back to I-95 north. Stay on Route 1 north, looking for
8	I-95 north. As you pass under the underpass, you'll see
9	the entrance to New Haven.
10	We go on I-95 north to Exit 25, State
11	Street. Exit 25, State Street, Commerce Street is coming
12	up, this is the exit you would take.
13	A VOICE: We're just approaching the exit
14	now.
15	MR. CUNLIFFE: As you come off the exit,
16	you'll see one stop sign, you stay right. You'll see a
17	second stop sign immediately, make a left.
18	State Street/Commerce Street goes under I-
19	95. You continue along to the intersection with a light.
20	State Street/Commerce Street comes to a
21	light with McDonald's on the right. You're going to make
22	a left at the light and it bears right onto State Street,
23	a one-way road.
24	A VOICE: That's the road we couldn't go

1	on when
2	MR. CUNLIFFE: Stay on State Street 'til
3	the first light, go straight through. This is Hancock
4	Avenue, you want to go straight.
5	At the second light you're at the
6	intersection of
7	A VOICE: Howard
8	MR. CUNLIFFE: Howard, go straight. It
9	says Clinton. At the third light, Clinton Avenue, make a
10	left. This is the beginning of an alternate underground
11	route between Hawthorne Substation and Singer Substation,
12	the proposed substation in Bridgeport. Hawthorne is an
13	existing substation.
14	Clinton Avenue crosses Fairfield Avenue.
15	We continue north on Clinton Avenue.
16	At the light where Clinton Avenue and
17	North Street intersect you're going to bear right, then
18	turn left. This becomes Brooklawn Avenue. Brooklawn
19	Avenue is also referred to as Route 59, a state route,
20	between Singer Substation and Hawthorne Substation and
21	North Fairfield.
22	CHAIRMAN KATZ: I'm looking at my map, is
23	this the north/south line?
24	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yes, it is.

1	CHAIRMAN KATZ: Thank you.
2	A VOICE: We just crossed the Fairfield
3	line.
4	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yeah, I was looking for
5	Capitol Ave. on my map, but I don't I see it now,
6	okay. Yeah, that that section of road is actually a
7	town boundary, one side of the road is in one city and
8	the other side of the road is in the other city.
9	(Pause).
10	Brooklawn Avenue turns into Stratfield
11	Road when you enter the Town of Fairfield heading north,
12	also known as Route 59.
13	I guess it doesn't matter it's
14	recording me whether I turn it on or off. Right, Ed?
15	A VOICE: What?
16	MR. CUNLIFFE: I'm being recorded?
17	A VOICE: Yes.
18	(Pause)
19	MR. CUNLIFFE: You'll see the First
20	Presbyterian Church of Fairfield with a large green front
21	lawn on your left. You'll be looking for Hawthorne Drive
22	on your left.
23	A VOICE: Fred, we've got a tape going and
24	we need to be kept up to speed as to where we are and

1	where we're heading to.
2	MR. CUNLIFFE: We will take a left onto
3	Hawthorne Drive after the First Presbyterian Church along
4	Route 59. This will bring us to Hawthorne Substation.
5	Take a right.
6	CHAIRMAN KATZ: Fred, the Hawthorne
7	Substation
8	MR. CUNLIFFE: Right here
9	CHAIRMAN KATZ: looks like it's a
10	transition
11	MR. CUNLIFFE: Take a turn at 160
12	Hawthorne Drive. It's a driveway that goes to the rear
13	of the property to a substation.
14	Correct, a transition station would need
15	to be located at the Hawthorne Substation. As you
16	approach the substation, you'll see that there is some
17	property available.
18	CHAIRMAN KATZ: Thank you.
19	MR. CUNLIFFE: You're going to have to
20	I don't think you can drive around the substation.
21	A VOICE: How are we going to turn this
22	motorcade around?
23	MR. CUNLIFFE: One car at a time.
24	A VOICE: You can't get out

1	MR. CUNLIFFE: No, I don't think there's a
2	road that goes around the back I didn't go back there
3	to find out, but I'm pretty sure it doesn't. I think
4	what it does is there's a gate that
5	A VOICE: How you doing?
6	A VOICE: We must have lost Johnny and
7	those guys.
8	MR. CUNLIFFE: You think so?
9	A VOICE: JB you still here?
10	A VOICE: I'm at the bottom already.
11	A VOICE: You've got the tail car
12	stopping.
13	A VOICE: He's ready for us.
14	MR. CUNLIFFE: Take a left. Exit the
15	Hawthorne Substation, you'll view the right-of-way
16	straight ahead. This would necessitate a widening of
17	about 45 feet.
18	A VOICE: This is overhead or underground?
19	MR. CUNLIFFE: This is the alternate
20	underground.
21	Once again, our route that we took of
22	Fairfield, Clinton Avenue to Brooklawn to Stratfield
23	Road, also known as Route 59, would be the alternate
24	underground route between this substation and the Singer

1	Substation in Bridgeport.
2	MR. ASHTON: Fred, you might want to hold
3	up a second.
4	MR. CUNLIFFE: Okay.
5	A VOICE: Which way are we going to go?
6	MR. CUNLIFFE: We're going to take a left.
7	MR. ASHTON: I assume you're heading out -
8	-
9	A VOICE: We're waiting for you out here
10	at the main
11	A VOICE: You're a nice guy.

13	toward Old Town Substation?
14	MR. CUNLIFFE: We are now going to work
15	our way to a small neighborhood between this substation
16	and Trumbull Junction. It's off Old Town Road.
17	CHAIRMAN KATZ: Thank you.
18	MR. CUNLIFFE: Take a left out of
19	Hawthorne Drive onto Route 59 heading north.
20	A VOICE: Yeah, Chris, you better find a
21	spot and pull over because they're not going to be able
22	to get out of here right away.

24	to look up (indiscernible) they have that kind of

2	way pass through a residential area.
3	MR. ASHTON: Just for everybody's
4	information if they've forgotten, right now there are two
5	115-kV circuits into the Devon Substation, go north,
6	cross the river into Stratford, and go all the way west
7	to the Norwalk Substation. Those circuits are tapped at
8	various load points, Hawthorne Substation for example,
9	and Old Town Substation and West Substation. And they
10	are also tapped at Old Town Junction. At Old Town at

13	right-of-way that they're suppose to utilize after
14	modifications.

14	MR. CUNLIFFE: Okay, you can pass the bus,

16	At the stop sign you're going to take a
17	right onto Old Town.

19	neighborhood have a name?
20	MR. CUNLIFFE: We we haven't designated
21	it a name. You can certainly call it Cumberland Road,
22	Forestview neighborhood, Bridgeport.
23	CHAIRMAN KATZ: Thank you.
24	MR. CUNLIFFE: You will approach a stop

1	sign and you will go straight through this stop sign.
2	This is going to take us into Cambridge Drive. It's an
3	industrial park with office buildings.
4	Follow Cambridge Drive to the end of the
5	park. As you do, you'll notice you're going to travel
6	under the conductors, and you'll see a monopole. And
7	straight ahead once ahead would be a right-of-way that
8	would require expansion, an expansion of approximately 45
9	feet.
10	MR. ASHTON: An overhead transmission line
11	from East Devon to Norwalk. The pole is probably about a
12	hundred feet tall.
13	MR. CUNLIFFE: The proposed
14	reconstruction, a typical height of about 105 feet.
15	MR. ASHTON: The existing 115-kV line goes
16	back I believe to 1920 (indiscernible) line between
17	Devon and Norwalk. The line was converted to 115 about

19	MR. CUNLIFFE: At the end of the
20	Industrial Park Road, Cambridge Drive, you come to a stop
21	sign, make a left. Make a left coming out of the
22	Cambridge Drive industrial park onto Old Town Road.
23	You'll begin to climb a hill. Old Town
24	Road turns left. Left. Old Town Road zigzags through

1	this portion of Bridgeport as we work our way over to
2	Route 8.
3	Stay on Old Town Road at the Red Oak Road
