

2	conducted by the State of Connecticut Siting Council, Re:
3	Docket No. 272, held on January 21, 2004

6	A VOICE: Okay, the tape is rolling.
7	A VOICE: The Town Hall, the Assessor's
8	Office
9	MR. PHELPS: Fred
10	A VOICE: The next building over.
11	A VOICE: Oh, do I go this way
12	A VOICE: Yes
13	A VOICE: or do I have to go
14	A VOICE: You're going to need to go
15	around. There's no way to get through here, sir.
16	MR. PHELPS: Okay, I just need to
17	(indiscernible) of how to use this phone
18	A VOICE: That building that says Town
19	Hall on it.
20	A VOICE: Okay.
21	MR. PHELPS: Test, test.
22	MR. CUNLIFFE: Test.
23	A VOICE: 219 charlie, and also I'll be
24	pushing a hazardous 14, 25, northbound 5 entrance ramp.

1	I'll let you know the plan in a second.
2	(Radio chatter)
3	A VOICE: This is what, Docket 275, Fred?
4	MR. CUNLIFFE: 272.
5	A VOICE: 272.
6	A VOICE: Alright. I suggest I travel
7	right behind you, and then the van, and then the tail
8	car.
9	MR. CUNLIFFE: Okay.
10	A VOICE: That's all we got?
11	A VOICE: Do you want lights on for this
12	or
13	A VOICE: We've been running with lights
14	on.
15	A VOICE: Yeah?
16	A VOICE: Yeah.
17	MR. CUNLIFFE: Probably more on the busy
18	roadways. We're going to be going off on a lot of
19	residential roads, so I don't know how you want to
20	A VOICE: It doesn't matter to me.
21	MR. CUNLIFFE: Alright.
22	A VOICE: Do you know where we're going
23	here?
24	MR. CUNLIFFE: Take a right out of the

1	parking lot.
2	We're at the Weston Town Hall. Leaving
3	the Town Hall, take a right onto Northfield Road.
4	Leaving the Town Hall, take a right onto Northfield Road.
5	Take a left at the light. Take a left at
6	the light onto Weston Road, Route 57.
7	(Radio chatter)
8	MR. CUNLIFFE: Did we miss somebody? You
9	might want to pull over and wait.
10	A VOICE: Let's go genius. Police lights
11	don't mean anything to you apparently. Come on
12	knucklehead.
13	A VOICE: Thanks for your help, I
14	appreciate it.
15	A VOICE: I'm sorry, I just
16	A VOICE: I understand completely.
17	A VOICE: You know, there's a reason these
18	pretty things are on.
19	A VOICE: You mean they're functional as
20	well as decorative.
21	A VOICE: Yeah, imagine that. (Laughter).
22	They don't quite have the effect of, hey, please slow
23	down when you fly by me at 90 miles an hour.
24	(Pause)

1	MR. CUNLIFFE: You can slow down here a
2	little bit. We're passing under the transmission lines
3	here crossing 57, the substation to your right.
4	You can take a left at the light.
5	Approaching a traffic light at the intersection of Route
6	57 and Good Hill Road, take a left at the light. Turning
7	left onto Good Hill Road off of Route 57 at the light.
8	(Radio chatter)
9	MR. CUNLIFFE: Taking a right here.
10	Taking a right onto River Road. The transmission line
11	right-of-way parallels the road here on your left. You
12	can see it through the trees. You'll see some wires and
13	structures. We'll be approaching a local park, Keen
14	Park, and the transmission line passes through that area.
15	Keen Park is on your left. Slow down right here. Okay,
16	keep going. Notice the transmission structure off to
17	your left behind some houses.
18	Take a left. At the stop sign we're at
19	the intersection of River Road and Lyons Plains Road,
20	take a left. It's clear to the right.
21	(Trooper talking on phone or radio)
22	MR. CUNLIFFE: We're taking a right up
23	here. We're approaching an intersection with White Birch
24	Road, take a right turn.

1	We're approaching a crossroads with a
2	transmission line right overhead to Pine Bridge Road.
3	(Trooper talking on phone or radio)
4	A VOICE: Fred
5	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yeah?
6	A VOICE: I need to pause the tape.
7	MR. CUNLIFFE: Weston/Easton Turnpike
8	we'll turn left at Weston/Easton Turnpike.
9	MR. PHELPS: Fred, do you copy?
10	A VOICE: Go ahead, Derek
11	A VOICE: Straight?
12	MR. CUNLIFFE: To the left to the left
13	- -
14	MR. PHELPS: (Indiscernible) to me once
15	in a while (indiscernible)
16	MR. CUNLIFFE: Stay left
17	MR. PHELPS: what's going on here
18	MR. CUNLIFFE: as you come out of White
19	Birch Lane stay on Weston/Easton Turnpike.
20	MR. PHELPS: Let Fred know that we're
21	really hoping to be done around 5:00 o'clock. So as we
22	go along if you could update me on how far along we are,
23	whether we're one-third, one-half of the way along and
24	stuff, I'd appreciate that.

1	A VOICE: Okay, will do. Fred, should
2	have been able to hear you.
3	MR. CUNLIFFE: I heard it.
4	MR. PHELPS: Actually, we should still try
5	to do that break somewhere along the way, if we could
6	accommodate that.
7	MR. CUNLIFFE: Tell him in Norwalk we can
8	stop at a McDonald's.
9	A VOICE: He said there's a McDonald's we
10	can stop at in Norwalk.
11	(Pause)
12	A VOICE: It's hard to see these things
13	A VOICE: Really
14	MR. CUNLIFFE: The overhead transmission
15	lines.
16	A VOICE: This one here?
17	MR. CUNLIFFE: It looks this area.
18	MR. PHELPS: Fred, are we close to where
19	we're going to be beginning here?
20	A VOICE: You already began, Fred or
21	Derek.
22	MR. CUNLIFFE: Follow 136
23	MR. PHELPS: Has Fred been explaining that
24	to Pam because there's been a question from Pam.

1	A VOICE: Yeah, I think I think he's
2	been talking to Pam.
3	MR. PHELPS: Alright, Fred just have
4	Fred explain where the start point is and how close that
5	is relative to where we started from the commuter lot.
6	MR. CUNLIFFE: We're passing underneath
7	the transmission line right-of-way as we pass by right
8	now.
9	A VOICE: Hey, Fred
10	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yeah?
11	A VOICE: I don't you I don't think
12	you hit the key.
13	MR. CUNLIFFE: I didn't. I'm hitting that
14	big one.
15	A VOICE: Okay. Maybe you ought to change
16	that so that it's on
17	MR. CUNLIFFE: Maybe Pam is not on here?
18	A VOICE: So the speaker is on so you can
19	actually hear the beep, okay.
20	MR. CUNLIFFE: You're just going to follow
21	this to West Road.
22	A VOICE: You actually have to push it and
23	hold it until the thing beeps. Go ahead. There.
24	MR. CUNLIFFE: We just passed underneath

1	the transmission line along the Easton/Weston Turnpike,
2	also Route 136. Do you copy, Pam?
3	CHAIRMAN KATZ: Crank it up a little bit.
4	MR. CUNLIFFE: Okay. Just past the
5	intersection of Judge's Hollow
6	A VOICE: You you've got to wait for
7	that beep.
8	MR. CUNLIFFE: Just past Judge's Hollow
9	Road, the next road will be West Street, it's a right and
10	you're going to go bear right, it's a straight away.
11	Just past this Easton town line sign there's a road, go
12	straight.
13	A VOICE: Fred
14	MR. CUNLIFFE: What?
15	A VOICE: you've got to wait for that
16	beep
17	
	MR. CUNLIFFE: No, I'm not talking to
18	MR. CUNLIFFE: No, I'm not talking to them, I'm talking to this.

1	A VOICE: Let's see, slow down
2	A VOICE: I'm not sure if we can turn
3	around the next street
4	MR. CUNLIFFE: We can go down to the next
5	road and make a right and that will bring us back where
6	we need to go. So that would be Old Redding Road. We
7	missed our turn at that last intersection, but we're
8	going to the next intersection and making a right, this
9	will bring us back on route.
10	A VOICE: We're about to make a right
11	
T T	MR. CUNLIFFE: Onto Old Redding Road.
12	A VOICE: And I've explained to Fred how
13	to use the radio.
14	MR. CUNLIFFE: We're at a four-way
15	intersection, take a right onto Old Redding Road. We're
16	on Old Redding Road off of Easton/Weston Turnpike.
17	A VOICE: Gee, the poverty out here is
18	deplorable, isn't it.
19	A VOICE: That's alright, you get what you
20	work for.
21	A VOICE: Yep.
22	MR. CUNLIFFE: Go straight through this
23	stop sign. Go straight through the stop sign, Old
24	Redding Road this is where we would have came up

1	oh, no, that's Mill West Street is the next
2	A VOICE: What are we doing, taking West
3	Avenue up to Route 1?
4	MR. CUNLIFFE: No, West we're going to
5	we're going to stay on Old Redding Road and it's going
6	to end up being it's going to turn to Redding Road. I
7	don't know why they change names, but you see this is
8	where we would have came up. Make a right. We're all
9	right.
10	A VOICE: You know, it's amazing how many
11	people didn't pay attention to their driver's manual;
12	14283, on approaching an emergency vehicle displaying
13	lights, you will immediately pull to the right side of
14	the road until said vehicle has passed.
15	A VOICE: Yeah, there you go.
16	A VOICE: Yeah.
17	A VOICE: I probably write people up for
18	that three or four times a week easily.
19	A VOICE: I'm sure.
20	A VOICE: And the enjoyable part is when
21	they mail it in not guilty and make a fool of themselves
22	in front of the judge.
23	A VOICE: (Laughter). Because you've got
24	the pictures.

1	A VOICE: Yeah. Usually it's when you're
2	chasing somebody too or you're going somewhere and this
3	goes on automatically with the lights.
4	A VOICE: Oh, really.
5	MR. CUNLIFFE: The transmission line is
6	right now in your sight along Old Redding Road.
7	A VOICE: Fred, it didn't go through.
8	MR. CUNLIFFE: Take a left here. You're
9	at the
10	A VOICE: You've got to push the button.
11	MR. CUNLIFFE: You know what happens
12	A VOICE: What?
13	MR. CUNLIFFE: I'm not even
14	A VOICE: You may not have oh, okay
15	if you
16	MR. CUNLIFFE: I must have lost the signal
17	
18	A VOICE: Yeah
19	MR. CUNLIFFE: is that what happens?
20	A VOICE: You lose the signal
21	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yeah
22	A VOICE: There you go.
23	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yeah.
24	A VOICE: Play it again, it will tune back

1	in.
2	MR. CUNLIFFE: I appear to be losing
3	signal, so I'm constantly turning the phone back on.
4	We're on we turned left onto North Street off of Old
5	Redding Road and you had just passed under the lines on
6	that road.
7	You're going to stay on North Street all
8	the way out to route it's Black Rock Turnpike. I
9	don't know what route number that is 53?
10	A VOICE: Uh, 50
11	A VOICE: This is nice out here.
12	MR. CUNLIFFE: It's way too nice. These
13	roads are like driveways. No no one drives them.
14	You're going to go straight through.
15	We're at an intersection with Congress
16	Street, you're going to go straight through the stop.
17	A VOICE: I'm not a big Fairfield County
18	fan. I don't like the traffic. No, I live out in
19	Madison.
20	A VOICE: Uh-huh.
21	A VOICE: I just I can't if I'm not
22	in this car, I don't drive down here.
23	A VOICE: I can't say I blame you.
24	A VOICE: The only time I come down here

1	is when I can do this. With the exception of Home Depot,
2	I found everything that either or my wife need going
3	east, Clinton Crossing, the Westbrook Outlet. I just
4	don't go over the Q bridge
5	A VOICE: Yep
6	A VOICE: I stay away from it. I don't go
7	over it unless I have the lights on the car.
8	A VOICE: Yeah.
9	A VOICE: There's some big birds in that
10	driveway.
11	A VOICE: You guys travel on the parkway a
12	lot?
13	MR. CUNLIFFE: I try to use it more than
14	95.
15	A VOICE: If you're going west, between
16	Exit 43 and 42 there's a yellow house with a large stone
17	wall not far from the parkway, just about anytime of the
18	day you'll see about a million turkeys in their yard.
19	A VOICE: Oh, really.
20	A VOICE: Yeah. I've considered pulling
21	over and blasting one on a Sunday. I'm like, you know,
22	I'm going to get lunch. Just go in the trunk, get the
23	shotgun, put the buckshot in
24	A VOICE: I think we'll put pause on for

1	now. (Pause).	Go ahead.
2		MR. CUNLIFFE: I lost it again.
3		A VOICE: What, is she not on the list?
4		MR. CUNLIFFE: No, she's on my list.
5		A VOICE: Well you can bring up the last
6	number you call	Led.
7		A VOICE: There you go.
8		MR. CUNLIFFE: At the intersection of Burr
9	and North Stree	et, stay straight on North Street.
10		A VOICE: If you flip the cover down
11		MR. CUNLIFFE: Yeah? It will preserve it?
12		A VOICE: It will I'll show you
13		MR. CUNLIFFE: Oh, alright.
14		A VOICE: Just have this closed
15		MR. CUNLIFFE: Yeah.
16		A VOICE: if you lose your last number
17		
18		MR. CUNLIFFE: Yeah?
19		A VOICE: push that button right there
20		
21		MR. CUNLIFFE: Okay.
22		A VOICE: and it should bring up your
23	last number.	
24		MR. CUNLIFFE: The square (beep)

1	yeah
2	MR. PHELPS: I'm still unclear, are we
3	talking about running transmission lines through this
4	neighborhood?
5	A VOICE: (Indiscernible) each one
6	doesn't have that feature.
7	A VOICE: Fred
8	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yeah?
9	A VOICE: did you hear Derek's
10	question?
11	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yeah. Yeah, there's
12	transmission lines we're coming up on them now.
13	A VOICE: Hang on a second. Go ahead.
14	MR. CUNLIFFE: The transmission line
15	corridor is to our left, Derek. We can't see them here.
16	MR. PHELPS: Alright, thank you.
17	MR. CUNLIFFE: We've been driving along
18	North Street. Our right-of-way is to our left, parallel
19	to this road, it will eventually turn and cross stop
20	right here we have just reached the intersection where
21	the transmission lines cross. These structures are
22	lattice, 80 feet typical in height. They propose to
23	replace those with a single steel monopole. One side of
24	the steel monopole would support a new 345-kV. The other

side would have a 115-kV. And the other 115-kV circuit
would be removed. Okay, now we can move along.
A VOICE: We can go?
MR. CUNLIFFE: Yep, we can go. And make a
right at the bottom of the hill here.
A VOICE: (Indiscernible)
MR. CUNLIFFE: Oh, okay. We just got
these phones and he wanted to get them grouped. So we're
not grouped yet. Today he'll be going back to the office
saying get them people in here, I want them grouped.
A VOICE: Where are we going?
MR. CUNLIFFE: Take a right.
A VOICE: We're going down the parkway?
MR. CUNLIFFE: Yep. North Street reaches
Black Rock Turnpike, take a right at the stop sign.
A VOICE: Derek, we're headed down to the
Merritt Parkway.
MR. PHELPS: (Indiscernible) high
speed, to try to make up some time. (Laughter).
A VOICE: I don't think our driver has any
problem with that.
A VOICE: Ask one of those other two cars.
A VOICE: Yeah, you've got to watch out
for those vans vans flip.

1		A VOICE: (Indiscernible) we're going
2	to try to pick	up some speed.
3		A VOICE: Okay, just tell them if we get
4	too far ahead,	to yell.
5		MR. CUNLIFFE: Did he say he was going to
6	talk to them?	
7		A VOICE: Yeah.
8		MR. CUNLIFFE: Okay. Okay, take
9		A VOICE: South
10		MR. CUNLIFFE: south going to Norwalk.
11		A VOICE: Derek, we're going south towards
12	Norwalk.	•
13		MR. PHELPS: Thank you.
14		A VOICE: What's this guy's title?

1	MR. CUNLIFFE: and the right-of-way was
2	heading east to Trumbull Junction from Weston and Easton.
3	A VOICE: You done for a minute?
4	A VOICE: Yes.
5	MR. CUNLIFFE: Exit 40B, as in boy, Route
6	7 South.
7	MR. PHELPS: (Indiscernible)
8	MR. CUNLIFFE: Did you copy, Pam, where
9	we're getting off? This is Fred, do you copy, Pam?
10	CHAIRMAN KATZ: I copy Exit 40B.
11	MR. CUNLIFFE: Roger.
12	A VOICE: That must have been a hell of an
13	accident when it actually happened.
14	A VOICE: Right. They had all four cars
15	off.
16	A VOICE: Yeah.
17	A VOICE: Then the other problem the
18	mistake people make a lot is their insurance companies
19	tell them no matter what you do, don't move your cars
20	A VOICE: Yeah
21	A VOICE: you know and it is tough to
22	express like the whole common sense thing you know,
23	like, okay, if all four of you hit each other from
24	behind, then it's clear, you know, what happened and who

1	did what, it's not like you hit each other at an
2	intersection or whatever you know, get the hell the
3	off the highway, move your cars, or you're going to get
4	killed, don't sit in the left lane waiting for us to come
5	because you don't know how long it's going to take. And
6	they always stop and look.
7	A VOICE: Oh, of course.
8	A VOICE: What happened you know, I
9	didn't hit your car if you didn't see it the worst is
10	when you hear one happen and you're not looking and
11	you're busy looking down and writing up the one
12	A VOICE: Yeah
13	A VOICE: and you hear it behind you
14	MR. PHELPS: Fred, do you copy?
15	A VOICE: Go ahead.
16	MR. PHELPS: What are we doing? We're
17	getting off 40B and then what?
18	A VOICE: We go south on
19	MR. CUNLIFFE: 7
20	A VOICE: South on 7
21	MR. CUNLIFFE: to McDonald's.
22	A VOICE: to McDonald's.
23	MR. CUNLIFFE: It's probably like about
24	MR. PHELPS: South on 7

1	MR. CUNLIFFE: about a quarter mile.
2	A VOICE: It's about a quarter mile off
3	the highway.
4	MR. PHELPS: Alright.
5	A VOICE: We've still got to wait for the
6	van to catch up, right?
7	A VOICE: Yeah.
8	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yeah.
9	(Pause)
10	MR. PHELPS: 40B puts us on north Route 7,
11	is that right?
12	MR. CUNLIFFE: Now did that happen?
13	A VOICE: I'm sorry?
14	MR. CUNLIFFE: How did that happen? I
15	wanted to go south.
16	A VOICE: You want to go south?
17	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yeah.
18	MR. PHELPS: Talk to me.
19	A VOICE: I guess you could take 48 and
20	hit south, but you can also hit it from B.
21	(Pause)
22	MR. CUNLIFFE: Pam, when you come off
23	Route 15 on 40B, you want to stay to your left and turn
24	left at the light onto Route 7 south.

1	CHAIRMAN KATZ: Route 7 south.
2	A VOICE: Which side is the McDonald's
3	on?
4	A VOICE: It's on the left.
5	MR. CUNLIFFE: It's on the left, yeah.
6	(Pause). Your first name?
7	A VOICE: Weren't you with us already?
8	A VOICE: Yeah.
9	A VOICE: Fred, driving in terms of
10	driving time, how much do we have left?
11	MR. CUNLIFFE: About 45 minutes. And your
12	partner?
13	A VOICE: That's Alison.
14	MR. CUNLIFFE: Double L?
15	A VOICE: Alison?
16	A VOICE: Yo?
17	A VOICE: One L or two for you?
18	A VOICE: One.
19	MR. CUNLIFFE: Okay.
20	A VOICE: Yeah, I've got to be different.
21	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yeah. The last name?
22	A VOICE: Peters.
23	MR. CUNLIFFE: Peters. You guys have easy
24	simple last names. Is that so they can keep the badges

1	short?
2	A VOICE: That's so they can remember it.
3	MR. CUNLIFFE: I see. (Laughter).
4	A VOICE: They make you change your name.
5	MR. CUNLIFFE: Or the drop the end of it
6	off.
7	A VOICE: Yeah.
8	MR. CUNLIFFE: We dub thee
9	A VOICE: Imagine if you had to write down
10	Laslo's name.
11	A VOICE: I can't I still can't
12	remember how to spell it.
13	A VOICE: You know how long it took the
14	instructors to get that right.
15	A VOICE: Do you know when we send him for
16	dinner and they ask whose
17	(Pause)
18	A VOICE: Should I go back out and start -
19	_
20	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yes, that's what we want to
21	do well, wait a minute, Derek is not in his car yet
22	or is he okay, yeah, he is
23	A VOICE: Yeah
24	MR. CUNLIFFE: Alright.

1	A VOICE: Everybody back in the van?
2	MR. CUNLIFFE: My understanding is that
3	everybody is in.
4	A VOICE: Derek, we're about to head north
5	on 7.
6	MR. CUNLIFFE: We're leaving McDonald's.
7	Turn right onto Route 7, go north.
8	(Laughter)
9	A VOICE: You're just the guy he doesn't
10	want to meet.
11	A VOICE: Yeah, you didn't think you were
12	going to see me, huh (laughter) well, there you go
13	(indiscernible)
14	MR. CUNLIFFE: Wait until everybody is
15	ready here. We can go up 7 a little ways past Grist
16	Mill, so I don't know if you know where Grist Mill is
17	
18	A VOICE: Grist Mill?
19	MR. CUNLIFFE: That's the that's where
20	you jump onto Super 7.
21	A VOICE: That's right.
22	MR. CUNLIFFE: Okay.
23	A VOICE: Are we going to be do you
24	want me to go to speed do you want the lights on for

1	this?
2	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yeah, you can put the
3	lights on here. And you can probably do, you know, like
4	keep everybody tight so that way you don't lose
5	anybody.
6	A VOICE: Fred, do you want to roll up
7	your window
8	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yep.
9	A VOICE: you're killing me.
10	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yep.
11	A VOICE: I mean I was getting it two
12	ways, I was getting a breeze and I was getting an
13	earful.
14	(Pause)
15	MR. CUNLIFFE: She gets a star.
16	A VOICE: How far up here we going, Fred?
17	MR. CUNLIFFE: Probably a little bit
18	further. We go past the entrance to Super 7 and then
19	we're going to go and Duck and Kent Road.
20	A VOICE: Okay.
21	MR. CUNLIFFE: So once we get past that
22	Super 7, we'll be probably another quarter, half-mile
23	A VOICE: Okay. We're going to be taking
24	a left or a right?

1	MR. CUNLIFFE: We will be taking a left.
2	So after you go past that, you might want to move over.
3	To your left is the transmission line
4	right-of-way where it crosses Grist Mill and the Super 7
5	entrance. This is where a 115 circuit would be placed
6	underground and another one would be attached to a
7	structure, and there would be a 345-kV on the other
8	side.
9	A VOICE: We're taking a left further up
10	the road you say?
11	MR. CUNLIFFE: Further up the road. We'll
12	be going straight through this intersection even though
13	you may be in the left turn lane.
14	(Phone ringing)
15	A VOICE: Somebody is calling you.
16	(Trooper talking on phone)
17	(Pause)
18	MR. CUNLIFFE: Left not yet
19	(Trooper talking on phone)
20	(Radio chatter)
21	MR. CUNLIFFE: Take a left at the sign
22	it looks like an arrow
23	A VOICE: I'm sorry?
24	MR. CUNLIFFE: Right up here you're

1	going to take a left onto Arrow Wood Road. You'll see a
2	sign in the shape of an arrow, it's white.
3	(Trooper talking on phone)
4	MR. CUNLIFFE: We turned left off of Route
5	7 north onto Arrow Wood Road. The transmission line
6	passes over the backside of the residences. This line
7	would be replaced one of them would be replaced on the
8	217. The 115-kV would be placed underground. The
9	proposal would require a steel monopole, approximately
10	108 feet with $345-kV$ and a triangle configuration, and
11	would be placed on the other side of the tracks.
12	MR. PHELPS: (Indiscernible) unclear
13	(tape stopped)
14	A VOICE: Okay.
15	A VOICE: Did you say we're going to take
16	a left coming back out of here?
17	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yeah. Leaving Arrow Wood
18	Road, take a left north onto 7. Turn left out of Arrow
19	Wood Road onto Route 7 north.
20	And you're going to turn left again into
21	this storage place parking lot.
22	A VOICE: Right into this?
23	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yep. After taking a left
24	out of Arrow Wood onto Route 7 north, you'll go by a

1	large gray/blue building that's storage, take a left into
2	its parking lot to the rear well that's as far as we
3	can go we'll have to turn around here.
4	A VOICE: Do you want to go in back? I'll
5	ask if they can open
6	MR. CUNLIFFE: No, that's alright. Okay,
7	right here. I just want to show them the structure.
8	Straight ahead you can see Norwalk
9	Junction. And the structure here in the parking lot of
10	the storage location, the alternatives require a proposal
11	to remove the lattice and replace it with a steel
12	monopole about 105 feet in height. It would support one
13	115-kV circuit and support a 345-kV circuit.
14	A VOICE: Which way are we going out?
15	MR. CUNLIFFE: Take a left.
16	A VOICE: We're taking a left out.
17	A VOICE: You just made her whole day.
18	A VOICE: Oh, no, left turns are
19	MR. CUNLIFFE: Leaving the storage area
20	parking lot, take a left out onto Route 7 north. Yeah, I
21	did this all by myself. Try pulling out of here when the
22	lights aren't synchronized.
23	For the Council's information, the right-
24	of-way that we've been reviewing back in Weston, Easton,

1	parts here in Norwalk, those in Wilton that we will pass
2	through, are 80 feet in width typically, they will
3	require a right-of-way of 125 feet, an expansion of about
4	45 feet.
5	A VOICE: Where we going, Fred?
6	MR. CUNLIFFE: Take a right onto 33.
7	Route 7 Route 7 and Route 33 intersection take a
8	right, follow Route 33 south.
9	MR. PHELPS: (Indiscernible)
10	A VOICE: Yeah, go ahead, Derek?
11	MR. PHELPS: Everything is okay with the
12	hearing (indiscernible)
13	A VOICE: Yeah, it's fine. The Council is
14	going to be a little further away from the audience than
15	they'd like to be, but I can't do anything about that.
16	They're in the middle of building the set for a play and
17	they've got a they've got an orchestra pit
18	MR. PHELPS: Are you going to be able to
19	use the house system?
20	A VOICE: I think I'm going to bring my
21	own in. I you know, I I could probably tie into
22	the house system, but I think it would be more problems
23	than it would be worth.
24	A VOICE: This is the right-of-way again?

1	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yeah, I lost her again.
2	Take a left onto Heather Lane. It should be left right
3	along here.
4	A VOICE: This here?
5	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yep, that's it. She must
6	be using her phone somewhere else.
7	A VOICE: No, they just don't have any
8	service.
9	MR. CUNLIFFE: Is that what it is?
10	A VOICE: Yep.
11	MR. CUNLIFFE: Oh, okay. I see the
12	antenna, but I don't see any bars, okay.
13	A VOICE: Yeah. I think we need to have -
14	_
15	MR. CUNLIFFE: Motorola radio worked
16	great, didn't it.
17	A VOICE: Yeah.
18	MR. CUNLIFFE: Follow to the left.
19	A VOICE: I think we need to site a cell
20	phone tower down here.
21	MR. CUNLIFFE: Well they'll be up for it -
22	- Nextel would want one, I guess, huh.
23	A VOICE: I guess.
24	MR. CUNLIFFE: There's the transmission

1	lines again.
2	A VOICE: Look up.
3	MR. CUNLIFFE: Look up, there it is. And
4	take a right at the stop sign. We took a left off of
5	Connecticut Route 33 onto Heather Lane. You follow
6	Heather Lane to a stop sign, make a right, this is Spoon
7	Wood Road. The transmission line right-of-way would be
8	on your right visible, lattice structures. The one
9	straight ahead has a telecomm facility at the top if you
10	notice the antennas.
11	A VOICE: Yeah, the cell phone works
12	MR. CUNLIFFE: But those aren't ours.
13	Take a right. Spoon Wood reaches Chestnut Hill Road,
14	make a right, then a left then a left onto High Ridge.
15	Did we pass under the lines yet
16	A VOICE: Yeah.
17	MR. CUNLIFFE: We did? Okay, then the
18	left is right here.
19	A VOICE: I think we passed under them
20	MR. CUNLIFFE: You pass underneath the
21	transmission lines and you would come across High Ridge
22	Road, take a left. Now I've got a signal.
23	A VOICE: You might want to tell them
24	whatever you want to tell them back there.

1	MR. CUNLIFFE: We just passed through part
2	of some residential areas the transmission line right-of-
3	way goes through. We have turned off of Chestnut Hill
4	Road onto High Ridge Road. We come to a stop sign at
5	West Meadow Road, take a left.
6	We're approaching an intersection with
7	River Gate Road, take a left onto River Gate Drive off of
8	West Meadow. Right here the transmission line right-of-
9	way crosses River Gate Drive. You can see the right-of-
10	way to your west and to your east.
11	MR. PHELPS: What town are we in right
12	now?
13	MR. CUNLIFFE: What town are we in?
14	A VOICE: Yeah.
15	MR. CUNLIFFE: We're in Wilton.
16	A VOICE: This is Wilton.
17	MR. PHELPS: It feels like Wilton
18	MR. CUNLIFFE: It feels like Wilton he
19	said?
20	A VOICE: Yeah.
21	MR. CUNLIFFE: Okay.
22	A VOICE: Yeah, I'm sure NU is going to
23	want to buy the buy the property around here to run
24	this line through, right?

1	A VOICE: What are they going to do, bury
2	it?
3	MR. CUNLIFFE: This is an alternative
4	overhead ground proposal. They want to bury it between
5	Norwalk and Milford, is their proposal.
6	A VOICE: Between Norwalk and Milford?
7	MR. CUNLIFFE: Yes. Along Route 1
8	A VOICE: Where do they think they're
9	going to bury it?
10	A VOICE: Route 1
11	A VOICE: Right down Route 1.
12	MR. CUNLIFFE: Right down Route 1,
13	construction at night.
14	A VOICE: Hey, Fred, you're killing me
15	with this air-conditioning.
16	MR. CUNLIFFE: Sorry. I thought with that
17	big parka you've got on would keep you nice and toasty.
18	Put the hood on and you'd be doing alright back there.
19	A VOICE: Actually, my ears are doing just
20	fine. Everything but my hands are doing just find.
21	Unfortunately, I need my hands to be able to work.
22	A VOICE: Whose power line is this?
23	A VOICE: NY or NU or CL&P
24	MR. CUNLIFFE: This section is CL&P's.

1	A VOICE: And they want to bury it?
2	MR. CUNLIFFE: Well these won't go away if
3	they bury it. If they bury their proposal, these lines
4	stay as is.
5	A VOICE: I mean they want to bury the
6	power lines or they want to bury the idea?
7	MR. CUNLIFFE: Bury both.
8	A VOICE: Really.
9	MR. CUNLIFFE: This is a bone of
10	contention is these distribution lines could stay to
11	the left, Brian that you could bury those the
12	technology to bury these lines is there, there's no
13	questions asked, you can just bury these right in the
14	road and there wouldn't be a problem. In fact, a lot of
15	towns have them in their subdivision ordinances, that if
16	you want to build a new subdivision, that the utilities
