The underlying map was printed by the Town of Glastonbury and includes the GIS data layer "Municipal, State, and Quasi-Public Lands," dated March 2008. This data is also available on the town of Glastonbury website.

The red line depicts the Eastern Border Fault and was added by Karl Wagener, copying from the map "Bedrock Geological Map of Connecticut" by John Rodgers, 1985, published by the Connecticut Geological and Natural History Survey and the Connecticut Department of Environmental Protection.

The parcels with numbers are part of the underlying town map. Karl Wagener added the bright green areas with no numbers; these are lands protected by conservation easements, as depicted on Glastonbury's 2007-2017 Plan of Conservation and Development and/or other records in the Glastonbury Office of Community Development
