Dear Mr. Libertine:

The State Historic Preservation Office is in receipt of the REVISED proposal for the above-referenced project, submitted for review and comment pursuant to the National Historic Preservation Act and in accordance with Federal Communications Commission regulations.

New materials submitted by APT, environmental consultants for AT&T, propose an alternative location from the one reviewed by this office originally in September 2010 and most recently on June 21, 2011, and determined to have no adverse effect on defining characteristics of the National Register-listed South Canaan Congregational Church. This new location is further east and farther away from the National Register-listed South Canaan Congregational Church. The new proposed tower will be 120' and have an accompanying 40 'x 90' encampment. According to APT, "The Modified Location is not visible from anywhere on the South Canaan Congregational Church property or within the general area."

It is the determination of this office that the proposed installation will have a <u>conditional no adverse effect</u> on cultural resources, with the following condition:

- 1. the tower, equipment and compound will be designed and installed to be as non-visible as possible,
- 2. if not in use for six consecutive months, the tower and equipment shall be removed by the telecommunications facility owner. This removal shall occur within 90 days of the end of such six-month period. Upon removal, the property shall be restored by the facility owner to its historically appropriate appearance and materials.
