**DOCKET NO. 409A** - New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC application for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need for the construction, maintenance and operation of a telecommunications facility located at 8 Barnes Road, Canaan (Falls Village), Connecticut. Reopening of this docket pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes § 4-181a(b) limited to Council consideration of changed conditions, revised

tower site location and modified facility.

During a public meeting held on August 8, 2013, the Connecticut Siting Council voted on the following matters regarding the above-referenced docket:

1. AT&T Request for Administrative Notice dated July 25, 2013 The request was granted.

- 2. AT&T Request for Administrative Notice dated August 1, 2013 The request was granted.
- 3. Falls Village IWCC Requests for Administrative Notice dated July 24, 2013 The requests were granted.
- 4. Falls Village IWCC Request for Applicant to Pay Costs and to Close the Proceedings dated July 24, 2013

The request for the applicant to pay costs was denied.

The request to close the proceedings is moot. The record closed on July 25, 2013.

- 5. Falls Village IWCC Request to File a Reply Brief dated July 31, 2013 The request was denied.
- 6. AT&T's Objection to Falls Village IWCC Submission of New Testimony After the Close of Record dated August 1, 2013

The objection was overruled.

With regard to the Hearing Transcript Errata Sheet submitted by AT&T on July 25, 2013, the Council acknowledged that errors in the June 11, 2013 public hearing transcript were identified by AT&T and the party, Marc Rosen and Susan Pinsky, in their post hearing submissions. The Council also acknowledged that the audio recording of the June 11, 2013 public hearing meets the requirements for the record in a contested case under the Uniform Administrative Procedure Act, C.G.S. §4-177(d), and that the audio recording has been available to parties and intervenors since July 3, 2013.
