Vanasse Hangen Brustlin, Inc. (VHB) has been retained by SAI Communications representing New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC (AT&T) to review environmental resource information outlined in 47 CFR Ch.1 § 1.1307 sections (a) and (b) for environmental consequences pursuant to the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC or Commission") requirements. VHB determines the presence of resources listed under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) on or near sites where AT&T proposes to locate a facility. Results of this screening process for the above referenced proposed facility in Falls Village are depicted on the enclosed Cultural Resources Screen map.

AT&T is proposing to construct a new wireless telecommunications facility on portions of property located at 8 Barnes Road in Falls Village, Connecticut. This property has previously been through SHPO review in September 2009, and AT&T received a "no effect" letter from your office (see attached "no effect" letter dated September 29, 2009). However the current proposed facility location has moved approximately 1,000 feet away from the original location reviewed by your office. The proposed facility will consist of a 150-foot tall monopole tower, antennas, and associated ground equipment, and will be installed within a 40' x 90' fenced-enclosed compound within a 100' x 100' lease area. The proposed 20' wide access/utilities easement will be improved along the existing access road on the property, initiating off of Barnes Road and continuing in a southeasterly direction towards the proposed compound/lease area. AT&T antennas will be attached to the monopole at a centerline height of 147 feet above ground level and associated ground equipment will be installed at its base within a proposed 12' x 20' AT&T equipment shelter. The monopole and compound area will be developed for use by future wireless service providers. Refer to attached Site Plans for details.

The Cultural Resources Screen revealed the existence of a National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) listed historic site located approximately 0.5-mile northwest of the proposed tower facility, identified as the South Canaan Congregational Church located at Route 63 and Barnes Road. On July 9, 2010, VHB conducted a balloon float at the proposed tower facility location to predict potential visibility of the proposed 150-foot tall monopole tower within a 2-mile study area. During which, we investigated potential views from the South Canaan Congregational Church. The balloon was not visible from this property. As a result, it is VHB's opinion that the proposed undertaking will have no effect on this historic resource.

A *Preliminary Archaeological Assessment* prepared by Heritage Consultants, LLC dated August 16, 2010 was completed for the proposed project area. Heritage Consultants, LLC concluded that "No archeological sites have been identified on Cobble Hill. This is likely due to the fact that the area is characterized by extremely sloping areas, as well as rocky soils. As a result, it is unlikely that intact cultural deposits are situated within the proposed project parcel. Thus, it is the professional opinion of Heritage Consultants, LLC that no further archeological investigations of the proposed telecommunications tower are warranted." A copy of this Assessment is attached for your review.







Photograph 1 – Proposed tower location.









Figure 1. Excerpt from recent USGS topographic quadrangle map, depicting the proposed telecommunications tower location in Falls Village, Connecticut.

Heritage Consultants, LLC, is pleased to have this opportunity to provide Vanasse Hangen Brustlin, Inc., with the following preliminary archeological assessment of a proposed telecommunications tower located at 8 Barnes Road in Falls Village, Connecticut (Figure 1). The current project entailed completion of an existing conditions cultural resources summary based on the examination of GIS data obtained from the Connecticut State Historic Preservation Office, as well as historic maps, aerial photographs, and topographic quadrangles maintained by Heritage Consultants, LLC. This investigation did not consider the effects of the proposed construction upon built resources, and it is based upon project location information provided to Heritage Consultants, LLC by Vanasse Hangen Brustlin, Inc. The objectives of this study were: 1) to gather and present data regarding previously identified cultural resources situated within the vicinity of the Areas of Potential Effect; 2) to investigate the proposed project parcel in terms of its natural and historical characteristics; and 3) to evaluate the need for completing additional cultural resources investigations.




Figure 2. Excerpt from an 1853 historic map depicting the proposed telecommunications tower location in Falls Village, Connecticut.




Figure 3. Excerpt from an 1874 historic map depicting the proposed telecommunications tower location in Falls Village, Connecticut.




Figure 5. Excerpt from a 1952 aerial image depicting the proposed telecommunications tower location in Falls Village, Connecticut.




Figure 6. Excerpt from a 1970 aerial image, depicting the proposed telecommunications tower location in Falls Village, Connecticut.




Figure 8. Excerpt from a 2008 aerial image depicting the proposed telecommunications tower location in Falls Village, Connecticut.

As Figures 2 and 3 depict, a well-developed network of roads was established in the project region by the mid to late nineteenth century; however, prior to 1874, the region surrounding the project area appears to have been sparsely settled. Even after that time, no residences were constructed on what is now known as Cobble Hill. This is likely related to the fact that the landscape feature upon which the proposed tower will be constructed is very steep and exceedingly rocky. In addition, Figure 4, which is an aerial image dating from 1934, also shows that local residences and commercial buildings are situated along the roadways that skirt along the edge of Cobble Hill to the north, west, and south. No structures are visible on Cobble Hill in the early portion of the twentieth century. Figure 5 confirms the rugged nature of the Area of Potential Effect, and it shows that this parcel consisted of an outlying, unused piece of land. The area remained forested and largely inaccessible due to extreme slopes. The aerial image depicted in Figure 6 demonstrates that while Cobble Hill was forested as of 1970, a winding dirt road extends from Barnes Road to the summit of Cobble Hill. Since no structures are visible either along or at the terminus of the pathway, it is likely that it represents a logging road or hiking trail. Figure 7, an aerial image dating from 1995, shows much the same pattern as Figure 6; that is, the area in the vicinity of the proposed tower location remained heavily forested and only accessible via the previously established logging road or trail. Finally, the 2008 aerial image shown in Figures 8 reveals that even in modern times Cobble Hill remains

forested and largely unused. The only change to Cobble Hill as of 2008 is the appearance of a cleared area at the summit of the hill. Since no structures are visible in the vicinity of the clearing, which is located to the southeast of the proposed tower location, it is likely that this opening in the forest canopy is related to modern logging efforts.




Figure 9. Digital map depicting the locations of previously recorded National Register of Historic Places properties in the vicinity of the proposed telecommunications tower location in Falls Village, Connecticut.




Figure 10. Digital map depicting the locations of previously recorded cultural resources in the vicinity of the proposed telecommunications tower location in Falls Village, Connecticut.

Finally, a review of previously recorded cultural resources on file with the Connecticut State Historic Preservation Office revealed that a single National Register of Historic Places property and four archaeological sites have been identified within the project region (Figures 9 and 10). However, comparison of these maps with a topographic map of the region (Figure 1) reveals that all of the previously identified cultural resources have been recorded in the low lying areas surrounding Cobble Hill and in association with the numerous wetlands and waterways found in those areas. No archeological sites have been identified on Cobble Hill. This is likely due to the fact that the area is characterized by extremely sloping areas, as well as rocky soils. As a result, it is unlikely that intact cultural deposits are situated within the proposed project parcel. Thus, it is the professional opinion of Heritage Consultants, LLC that no further archeological investigations of the proposed telecommunications tower are warranted.
