Dear Chairman Stein and members of the Council,

We wish to bring to your attention North Atlantic Tower and AT&T's total inability to follow plan specifications. The monopine design for this location was approved to satisfy the State Historic Preservation Office concerns for the impact the tower would have on a historically intact tract of farmland with significant views to the north in the direction of the tower from the apple orchards and other properties. The intent of the monopine design was to camouflage the antenna of *all providers* with 'pine' branches that extended beyond the antenna preserving the eligibility of surrounding lands for formation of a National Register of Historic Places District. (see February 27th, 2011 document Supplemental Information, note: date of report is mistyped 2011 when in fact it was presented Feb.27, 2012)

Enclosed please find the following exhibits for your review and action that highlight North Atlantic Tower and AT&T's deviation from the plan specifications of antenna location/camouflage on the monopine style cell tower:

A) Photographs of current placement of antenna that extend *visibly beyond* the monopine branches rather than camouflaged within the branch extension as the plans specified (see Infinigy Engineering specification drawing number C6 Elevation View and Details 7/27/2012)

Please inform the applicants to conform to all project specifications as agreed upon by all parties involved.
