The State Historic Preservation Office is in receipt of the above-referenced project, which involves properties listed on the National Register of Historic Places, submitted for review and comment pursuant to the National Historic Preservation Act and in accordance with Federal Communications Commission regulations.

In the opinion of this office, considering the limited visibility of the revised proposal and our previous comments on the site, the proposed undertaking will have <u>no adverse effect</u> with the following conditions:

- The facility will be designed in a manner to be as unobtrusive as possible.
- If not in use for six consecutive months, the tower and all related equipment shall be removed by the telecommunications facility owner. This removal shall occur within 90 days of the end of such six-month period.
