CHAIRMAN MURPHY: I would like to call 1 this meeting to order this Tuesday, June the 25th, 2013 2 3 at 7:00 p.m. My name is Jerry Murphy and I'm the Vice 4 Chairman of the Connecticut Siting Council. 5 Although my jacket is on, the same rules 6 7 as this afternoon, they're optional if you want to wear the ties and the jackets. 8 Other members of the Council who are here 9 with us this evening are Larry Levesque, Designee for 10 11 Chairman Arthur House of the Public Utility Regulatory Authority; Robert Hannon, Designee for Daniel Esty, 12 13 Commissioner of the Department of Energy and 14 Environmental Protection; Philip T. Ashton, Edward S. 15 Wilensky, and Dr. Barbara Bell. 16 Members of the staff with us are Melanie 17 Bachman, Acting Executive Director and Staff Attorney, 18 Robert Mercier, our Siting Analyst. Our court reporter is Nancy Paretti, and our audio technician is Aaron 19 20 DeMarest. This is a continuation of a public 21 22 hearing which began at 3:00 p.m. this afternoon. Copies of the hearing program and Council's Citizen's guide to 23 24 Siting Council procedures are available for the members

of the public.

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This hearing is held pursuant to the 2 provisions of Title 16 of the Connecticut General 3 Statutes and the Uniform Administrative Procedures Act 4 upon an application from New Cingular Wireless, PCS, 5 LLC, for a certificate of environmental compatibility 6 7 and public need for the construction, maintenance, and operation of a telecommunication facility located at 111 8 Second Hill Road, Bridgewater, Connecticut. This 9 application was received by the Council March the 5th, 10 2013. 11

12 This application is also governed by the Telecommunications Act of 1996, which is administered by 13 14 the Federal Communications Commission. This Act 15 prohibits this Council from considering the health 16 effects of radio frequency emissions on human health and 17 wild life to the extent that the emissions from the tower are within Federal Acceptable Safe Limit 18 Standards, which standard is also followed by the State 19 20 Department of Public Health. The Federal Act also prohibits this 21 2.2 Council from discriminating between and amongst

providers of functionally equivalent service.

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service for an area, other carriers have the right to 1 compete and provide similar services in the same area. 2 3 The applicant published a notice of the filing of the application to the Council in the 4 Housotonic Times on February the 22nd and March the 1st 5 of 2013. 6 7 The Council's legal notice of the date and time of this hearing was published in the Housotonic 8 Times on April the 12th, 2013. 9 Upon the Council's request the applicant 10 11 erected a sign at the proposed site so as to inform the public of the name of the applicant, the type of 12 facility, the hearing date and location, and contact 13 14 information for the Council. 15 This afternoon members of the Council, 16 staff and public personally conducted a field review of 17 the proposed site in order to observe firsthand the potential effects of the proposal. 18 19 The hearing session tonight has been reserved for the public to make short statements into 20 the record. 21 2.2 These public statements are not subject to question from the parties or the Council. 23 And 24 members of the public making statements may not ask

questions of the parties or the Council. 1 These statements will become part of the record for Council's 2 3 consideration. A sign-up sheet for those who wish to 4 participate are located on the table. There are two. 5 One is for public officials and one is for the public as 6 7 a whole. As a reminder to all, off-the-record 8 communications with members of the Council or members of 9 the Council's staff on the merits of this application is 10 prohibited by law. 11 12 I wish to note that the parties and 13 intervenors, including their representatives and 14 witnesses, are not allowed to participate in the public 15 comment session. 16 I would also wish to note for those who 17 are here, and for the benefit of your friends and neighbors who are unable to join us for the public 18 19 comment session, that you or they may send written statements to the Council within 30 days of the day 20 hereof. And such written statements will be given the 21 same weight as if spoken tonight here at this hearing. 22 If necessary, party and intervenor 23 24 cross-examination at the hearing session held at 3:00

p.m. this afternoon may be continued after the public 1 comment, but it appears it will -- that will be very 2 3 limited for a few homework assignments that were given to them. 4 We ask that each person making a public 5 statement in this proceeding to confine his or her 6 7 statements to the subject matter before the council and to avoid unreasonable repetition so that we may hear all 8 of the concerns you and your neighbors may have. 9 Please be advised that the Council cannot 10 11 answer questions from the public about the proposal. 12 A verbatim transcript will be made of 13 this hearing and deposited at the Bridgewater Town 14 Clerk's office for the convenience of the public. 15 Before we start this evening we're going 16 to ask that the applicant have someone make a 17 presentation to those that are here tonight in the audience as to what it is they are proposing and to give 18 us a brief rundown of what they anticipate to do with 19 this project. 20 Attorney Laub. 21 2.2 ATTORNEY LAUB: For the record, I'm Daniel Laub with the firm of Cuddy & Feder here on 23 behalf of AT&T. 24

I've asked that our Project Engineer, Mr. 1 Paul Lusitani from CHA make a presentation and overview 2 3 of what we're proposing. MR. LUSITANI: Good evening. I'm the 4 Engineer who prepared the site plans. I'm going to give 5 a general overview of what we're proposing. 6 7 This is a plan of a four and a half acre parcel. We're proposing to locate the facility in the 8 northeast corner of the parcel. And we're proposing an 9 access road and utilities along this path. 10 11 This is a little more detailed plan. The brown is the proposed access drive off of Second Hill 12 Road. We plan to pull power and telephone from the 13 14 existing pole near Second Hill Road and run it 15 underground back to the facility. 16 The facility is a 45 foot by 90 foot 17 fenced area. There will be a 12x20 equipment shed 18 located within it and a 160 foot tower. 19 This is a blown up view of the 45x90 fence compound area. This is the location of AT&T's 20 12x20 equipment shelter and there's space for three 21 additional future carriers. 2.2 This is an elevation view of the tower 23 24 showing the 160 foot tower. AT&T being located at 156

feet and room for three additional carriers below. 1 And the length of the road off of Second 2 Hill Road is 353 feet. 3 CHAIRMAN MURPHY: Thank you. 4 Moving now to the public comment portion 5 of the evenings proceedings. 6 7 For Public Officials is William Smart. First Selectman. 8 MR. STUART: Thank you, but it's William 9 Stuart. 10 I'm sorry we can't ask questions, so I'll 11 try to make statements if I can. 12 Bridgewater, Connecticut is one of the 13 14 smallest towns in the State of Connecticut. Very small. 15 And it's hard for me to understand why we have had a proposal for a site on Wewaka Brook, not too long ago, 16 17 which nothing has happened and nothing has started from what we can see visually, that we need another site in 18 Bridgewater, Connecticut in this very tiny town to take 19 20 care of the coverage of this town. One of the things I -- I'm done looking 21 22 at your book of the presentation of the Second Hill site and the coverage. The green keeps coming in bigger and 23 bigger on the Second Hill site, but the Wewaka Brook 24

1 site stays with a key as a future site. And I've gone through six pages and it continues to be a future site. 2 3 I don't know if that's never going to be built, according to your book, or what the story is on that. 4 But it seems to me that building that Wewaka site would 5 be a first step. And if it did get built -- and I think 6 7 that one was 180 feet high if I'm not mistaken, that the --8 CHAIRMAN MURPHY: And my coverage covers 9 everything that's needed to be covered in this green 10 11 area, and therefore you may not need to put a site on Second Hill Road. That's one logic. One that -- a site 12 13 in New Town came on line some time ago, the coverage throughout Bridgewater becomes very good in many many 14 15 places. It sometimes even works at Town Hall, which is 16 surprising.

17 CHAIRMAN MURPHY: And to me, but it does. 18 So, I'm wondering, two sites in the Town 19 of Bridgewater -- I guess it will cover even when I'm 20 out riding a horse up in the hills, it will cover me up 21 there too. 22 I do hope that this Council will make

23 sure that if this goes through, on the scenic road, 24 which we designated as a scenic road many, many years

ago when we didn't have any idea about a cell tower 1 coming in. 2 We did it as a scenic road because of the 3 beauty of that road; the hills, the farms, the views. 4 And in my opinion, building a cell tower on that street 5 certainly doesn't change -- doesn't help the view any. 6 7 That's one -- one question. But if you do build this site I hope that 8 they will build something that doesn't look like a 9 Erector Set up on top of the hill, with those straight 10 steel arms sticking out, like you see around the country 11 in some places. I have noticed going across country of 12 cell towers being built that looked like a tree. 13 At 14 least that would be some diversion to looking at a steel 15 plant. And I hope the Wewaka Brook site does the same 16 thing. That one is going to be on the top of a tree of 17 a crest of a hill line, and is going to really stand out if it's just an all steel structure. 18 19 So, hopefully, if this site does go in, you will try to somehow protect the view up there and 20 the estetics of the Town of Bridgewater that we have 21 very, very much worked to preserve. Thank you. 2.2 Thank you, Mr. First 23 CHAIRMAN MURPHY: 24 Selectman Stuart.

Is there any other public official? 1 The First Selectman is the only one to 2 3 have signed up. Moving to the public portion, the first 4 person we have signed up is Laura Ann Marta. 5 MS. MANTA: Thank you. The last name is 6 7 Manta. 8 I'm vehemently opposed to the building of this cell phone tower. It will ruin the absolute pure 9 beauty of this small town and open the door for more 10 11 structural eyesores. It's not needed. It's sole purpose is for corporate greed. It will destroy our 12 13 wild life, and the WHO has not ruled out the 14 carcinaegnicy of cell phone towers. 15 Thank you. 16 CHAIRMAN MURPHY: Thank you. 17 MS. MANTA: I have Verizon and my phone 18 works fine. 19 CHAIRMAN MURPHY: Robert Schmus. 20 MR. SCHMUS: Hi. I'm Robert Schmus and I reside directly across the street from where this tower 21 2.2 is proposed. And the consideration that I would like on this is that you already have an approved site in the 23 24 town on Wewaka Brook. And if that goes through and is

1 built and does support the coverage, like Billy was saying, that at least is already approved and can be put 2 into place and tested and see if we actually do need the 3 second tower up there. You know, I would just like that 4 consideration. And -- and if it's determined that we do 5 need something up there, if there's something more 6 7 subtle that can be put in, maybe, with booster technology, or whatever. I'm not an expert in that 8 field, but maybe that's -- you know, not quite as 9 obtrusive as the structure that's proposed. And you 10 11 know, that's consideration I would just like. Thank you. 12 13 CHAIRMAN MURPHY: Thank you. 14 And we have Dan Delvecchio. 15 MR. DELVECCHIO: My name is Dan 16 Delvecchio. I live directly across the street from the proposed site at 110 Second Hill Road. 17 18 Basically we don't -- we all realize that people need to make phone calls, especially in emergency 19 situations, and, you know, I know I wouldn't like to be 20 in one of those situations where I couldn't get a phone 21 call in, but it does seem like the coverage around 2.2 Bridgewater is a lot better, even with the Wewaka Tower 23 24 not in yet. So, I'm going to go along with what Bob has

to say, and please consider testing the area again after 1 the Wewaka site is up. Because not only -- none of us 2 3 on the road really want the tower at all. We have to live there every day, every hour, raise our children. 4 Seven children that live on this street that have no 5 choice in this matter at all. All of us live in under 6 7 500 feet from this tower. I don't know if there's anybody in this room who would be very happy to raise 8 children, whether they say it's good for you or not good 9 for you, I don't think that anybody would be very 10 11 trusting to know that they have to raise children and they can't do anything about whether this tower goes in 12 13 or not. So, please, please consider what you're doing. We have no choice. It's in your hands. If the other 14 15 tower works, don't put this tower in. Thank you. 16 CHAIRMAN MURPHY: Thank you. 17 That exhausts the list of people that 18 have signed up. Is there anyone else here, from the public, who cares to address us in reference to this 19 matter? 20 (No response). 21 2.2 Attorney Laub, the First Selectman raised the issue about Wewaka not being put into service, which 23 24 was discussed this afternoon under our questioning. And

1 I think for his information and for the public's I think you should have someone from your panel explain what's 2 been the hold up and why. If you could have someone do 3 that. 4 MR. LAMONTAGNE: I think probably that 5 question may be best for me, since they're probably --6 7 CHAIRMAN MURPHY: Whomever. If you want to choose yourself you're free to do that. 8 MR. LAMONTAGNE: Because of the bridge 9 replacement at Wewaka Brook the construction window of 10 the -- is very limited. 11 AUDIENCE: We can't hear you. 12 CHAIRMAN MURPHY: Why don't you go to the 13 14 microphone and face them, because we heard it this 15 afternoon. 16 MR. LAMONTAGNE: Is it on? Can you hear 17 me? 18 AUDIENCE: Yes. 19 MR. LAMONTAGNE: Okay. The -- as probably many of you recall there's a bridge that needs 20 to be replaced at the Wewaka Brook road site. 21 2.2 That bridge falls under -- or actually the watercourse that falls underneath it -- that flows 23 underneath it falls under Army Corp of Engineer's 24

jurisdiction. The Army Corp approved that the bridge 1 could be replaced because -- the bridge could be 2 3 replaced with some work done in the stream, but is very limited window and it has to basically be done in the 4 summer months because that's when the water floor is the 5 They don't want it to be done in the spring when 6 least. 7 there's a high amount of water flow. So, that construction window I think stretches from the beginning 8 of June to I think the end of September. So, my 9 understanding from the people who are in charge of 10 moving forward with that, they're looking to move 11 forward with that coming up in July. So, it is going to 12 be built. And that's the latest on that. 13 14 A development plan was submitted to the 15 Council. They've extended the certificate to make sure 16 that this window works. But part of the thing was that 17 the original approval was obtained earlier in 2012, or the end of -- early 2012. So, that timing didn't allow 18 for the construction to commence in the summer when it 19 needed to. So, once that bridge is replaced then all 20 the rest of the work and the construction of the tower 21 will follow after that. 2.2 MR. STUART: So, does that mean that the 23 24 tower is going in?

1 MR. LAMONTAGNE: Yes, that means the tower is going in. 2 3 MR. STUART: This book that you put out for the coverage in the green. Without the Wewaka Brook 4 site you have a lot of whiteness in higher areas; 5 however, it continues to be a proposed site, a future 6 7 site. And when you get to the second page all of that is almost all green. All the way down through it's all 8 green. And this hasn't been built yet. It still says 9 future site. 10 11 Is this green? Was somebody doing No. their crayons and didn't do it right or what happened? 12 CHAIRMAN MURPHY: No, basically what it 13 14 is is one of the maps shows where the existing and 15 proposed sites are and how this particular one we're 16 addressing today would fit in. 17 And another map shows when -- what the coverage would be when the one we are looking at today, 18 19 if it's approved and online, how it fits in with the others that have been approved, and they are online. 20 So, this really tries to give you a picture of what it 21 would look like if they're all working, which they're 2.2 not all working right now. And that's really to give us 23 24 and everyone an opportunity to examine what the coverage

1 for AT&T would be once everything is in place. And remember this is just AT&T. The lady talked about 2 3 Verizon, but as I mentioned in our opening statement, I mean, if -- there may be coverage from other carriers 4 here, but AT&T has every right to come in and do what 5 everybody else is doing, and that makes the best effort 6 7 to have coverage the best they can here in Bridgewater. I'll ask again before closing, is there 8 any member of the public who would like to address this 9 that hasn't this evening? 10 11 MS. MANTA: Can I ask a guestion or are 12 you not allowed? CHAIRMAN MURPHY: No. I think we've done 13 enough questions for tonight. 14 15 Before closing, the counsel will now 16 close the public comment session of this hearing and we're going to resume the evidentiary session as soon 17 18 as. 19 CHAIRMAN MURPHY: And that's done, because there were some items to be taken care of that 20 were raised earlier in the afternoon,. 21 2.2 Before closing this public session of the hearing the Council announces that briefs and proposed 23 24 findings may be filed by the counselor or any party of

1 interest no later than July the 24th, 2013. And submission of the briefs or proposed 2 3 findings of fact, while not required by the Council made by its leave be filed should the parties decide to do 4 5 so. And at this point, I think, Attorney 6 7 Laub, we will move to the items that you were asked to have your panel examine. 8 And I understand that all but one of them 9 you have been able to at least believe give us an answer 10 11 to this evening. ATTORNEY LAUB: I take it that's reverse. 12 13 We've got an answer to one of them. 14 CHAIRMAN MURPHY: Oh, okay. 15 ATTORNEY LAUB: And then we have a follow 16 up on --17 CHAIRMAN MURPHY: Well, whatever it is, give us what you got and we'll work through the rest 18 19 later. 20 We have a follow-up on --ATTORNEY LAUB: I would ask that Mr. Libertine provide you an overview 21 22 of the balloon float today, as well as some investigation that he and Mr. Gustafson conducted and by 23 24 way of discovering who owns the tower on Second Hill

1 Road, the existing state tower. Audience: We can't hear you. Please 2 3 face us. MR. LIBERTINE: My name is Mike 4 Libertine. I'm part of the panel here today on behalf 5 of AT&T. 6 7 The Council had asked specifically a couple of questions, and the first I'm going to address 8 is regarding the balloon float that was conducted as 9 part of the public hearing a the site today. 10 What we did -- the Council had asked that 11 a balloon be flown from between 12 this afternoon and 12 6:00 p.m. to simulate the top height of the tower. So 13 14 what we did was take a red weather balloon, 15 approximately four feet in diameter and tethered that to the 160 foot proposed height of the tower. 16 17 The winds today were somewhat cooperative. They were probably -- started out probably 18 19 in the five to six mile an hour range and did increase 20 as the afternoon went on. So that there was an angle. We were able to achieve the full height for some limited 21 2.2 times, but as most folks saw, it was bouncing around a little bit and probably was off at an angle of anywhere 23 24 from 20 to 25 degrees from the balloon float for those

six hours we did loose three balloons. We lost one at 1 about 1:30 in the afternoon. Got a second one up at 2 3 about 1:40. A second went down shortly before 4:00. 4 We immediately got the third balloon up and then right 5 during the storms at about 5:50 the third balloon went 6 down and so we aborted -- it takes about two 7 another ten minutes or so to get it inflated and up, so 8 at that point the -- the hour had come to pass about 9 6:00 p.m. So, we decided it wasn't worth trying to get 10 something else up on those winds and those conditions. 11 12 The other homework assignment we had was 13 there is the existing tower that is on Second Hill Road 14 and we were able to determine that that tower is owned 15 and operated by the Connecticut Department of 16 Transportation. There is a placard that has some very 17 fine print but it does identify Conn DOT as the owner of 18 the tower. 19 CHAIRMAN MURPHY: Thank you, Mr. Libertine. 20 Do you have anything else? 21 ATTORNEY LAUB: 2.2 No. CHAIRMAN MURPHY: And so there is really 23 24 one more -- we had the homework assignment for Mr.

1 Hannon. ATTORNEY LAUD: Yes. As far as homework 2 3 assignments we have some construction details to provide as a late file. And it is in regards to some of the 4 details of the road and the compound, which we will be 5 able to provide. 6 7 As well as -- I think that might be it. I think from my notes that's it. 8 CHAIRMAN MURPHY: There was a question on 9 one of your maps about the development rights that Mr. 10 Mercier had asked. 11 12 ATTORNEY LAUB: Oh, right. Yes. Yes. 13 CHAIRMAN MURPHY: And that was going to 14 be looked into, and you were going to give us a late 15 file and answer his inquiries on that item. 16 ATTORNEY LAUB: Yes. 17 CHAIRMAN MURPHY: And I think with those two items we satisfy the inquires we came up with 18 earlier today. 19 20 That being the case then, I will proceed to close the proceedings today and announce that anyone 21 2.2 who has not become a party or intervenor, or who wishes to desire to make his or her views known to this Council 23 24 may file a written statement with the Council within 30

days of the date hereof. 1 The Council will issue draft findings of 2 3 fact. And thereafter parties and intervenors may identify errors or inconsistencies between the Council's 4 5 draft findings of facts and the record. However, no new information, no new 6 7 evidence, no argument, and no reply briefs without our permission will be considered by the Council. 8 Copies of this transcript -- a transcript 9 of this hearing will be filed at the Bridgewater Town 10 Clerk's office. 11 12 I hereby declare this hearing adjourned. Thank you for your participation and drive safely on 13 14 your way home tonight. 15 (Whereupon the hearing was adjourned at 16 7:26 p.m.) 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24
